FSC concerned about rooftops

Wood shingles abandoned

The Mountain Communities Fire Safe Council is about to embark on another endeavor to reduce the risk of significant fire damage on the Hill.

The Federal Emergency Management Agency has recently approved Riverside County's "Local Hazard Mitigation Plan." This week the county Board of Supervisors passed a resolution adopting the current plan. Edwina Scott, Fire Safe Council executive director, attended their meeting in case questions affecting the local council's plan were raised.

With these actions, the

Fire Safe Council is now eligible for a federal grant to help pay for the cost of replacing flammable wood shake shingle roofs with any type of Class A roofing, e.g., composition, asphalt, metal or tile shingles. The grant will pay for 75 percent of the cost.

The \$885,000 grant, which has been pending for nearly three years, awaiting approval of the county plan, will help replace about 100 roofs on the Hill, according to Scott. "It's been a roller coaster," she said about the grant's approval. "I'm still a little bit nervous and apprehensive."

The local council has been preparing for this step. Scott says the prospective

Student driver mows down students at HHS

A Hemet High School student driving a 1994 Ford Ranger pickup ran a red light and plowed through a crosswalk crowded with approximately 30 students, sending eight to area hospitals, three in critical condition. Six females (three age 15, two age 16 and one age 17) and two males (one age 15 and one age 16) were transported. All were Hemet residents.

Parents were also in the vicinity, given that school was letting out, and watched with horror as the truck, driven by 18-year-old Daniel Carrillo, mowed down students. The incident happened at 2:40 p.m., Wednesday, May 30, on Stetson Avenue, just past the intersection with Bulldog Way.

According to the California Highway Patrol report, Carrillo was traveling at speeds greater than permitted in the 25 MPH school zone.

The Riverside County Sheriff's Department Southwest Detention Center confirmed on Wednesday, May 30, that Ron Kimmerle, 49, of Pine Cove had been released at midnight, May 30. A deputy at the center said Kimmerle's release was federally mandated "because of jail overcrowding." Because

of the federal release, Kimmerle did not have to post bail. Riverside County Superior Court charges against him — two counts of felony burglary and two counts of felony receiving stolen property — remained in force.

Kimmerle had been scheduled to appear in court at 8:30 a.m. June 1 for a felony settlement conference at the Southwest Justice Center in Murrieta. When

he failed to appear, the court issued a bench warrant for his re-arrest.

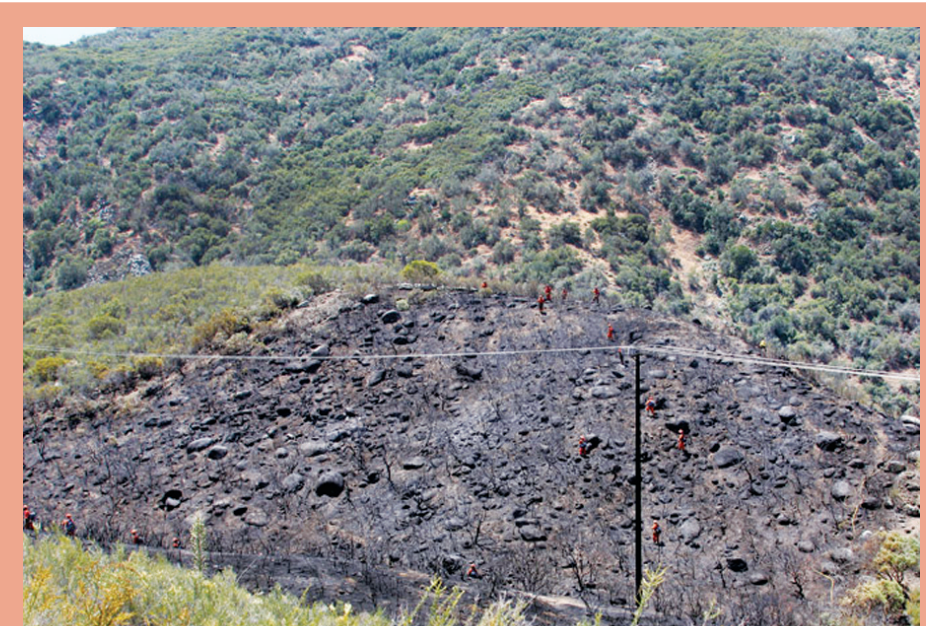
Riverside County Sheriff's Department Hemet Station deputies executed the warrant in Pine Cove around 11 a.m. Saturday, Kimmerle's fourth arrest in fewer than six weeks. Kimmerle is now in jail at Southwest Detention Center awaiting an 8:30 a.m. June 8 felony settlement

conference. Bail is set at \$120,000.

Kimmerle's revolving door jail history since his initial April 27 arrest is symptomatic of the paucity of jail beds in Riverside County. California is under order from the United States Supreme Court to reduce prison overcrowding in its 33 prisons, on 8th Amendment grounds.

State realignment of many low-level, nonviolent criminals from state prisons to county jails that began in October 2011 caused Riverside County jails to reach full capacity in January 2012. As a result, nonviolent and nonsexual predator criminals are being given early release and those charged and not yet convicted of nonviolent crimes, like Kimmerle, are also likely to be released prior to hearing dates because of lack of jail beds. Additional county inmate bed capacity will not increase for a number of years given the time it will take to expand the Indio jail facility.

OUTSIDE IDYLLWILD

A trip to Santa Rosa Mountain and beyond ...

Once again I found myself riding shotgun in "Floyd Jr. Jr." (the vehicle's name), with owner Les Walker at the wheel and Cheri and the pups, Tiwi and Koda, in the back seat. We are all headed up a rough dirt road towards Santa Rosa Peak.

It was a very cloudy day on the Idyllwild side of the mountain, but to the east the clouds had not yet managed to cover the peaks.

It had been about 30 years since I last drove up Santa Rosa. On this adventure, I was looking forward to taking wildflower photos along the road and on the summit.

After driving through Garner Valley on Highway 74 we reached the turnoff to Santa Rosa and the gate was wide open. Les was once again in his element as we headed up the mountain. I started seeing large bushes covered in purple penstemon flowers. This turned out to be the showy penstemon (*Penstemon spectabilis*) which was in full bloom.

Next, I saw small patches of a low growing plants with pink to purple star shaped flowers. I didn't remember seeing this plant in Idyllwild. As we climbed, the patches were more beautiful, plentiful, and closer together. The plants turned out to be the western mountain phlox, either *Phlox austromontana* or perhaps *diffusa* species. Each plant is covered in flowers with some looking a faded pink and some are almost purple in color.

We actually bypassed the road to Santa Rosa Peak and headed to the highest summit in the Santa Rosas, the 8,716-foot Toro Peak and stopped at Virgin Springs on the way.

Being on the divide between pine forest and lower desert created an interesting situation as very fast moving clouds pushed up over the mountain peak only to dissolve into a swirling mist and evaporating completely when they hit the warm desert air. This proved to be so dramatic that we shot several short videos of the thick rain clouds as they evaporated.

After reaching the summit, well near the summit as it was gated off, we took a short walk on a trail lined with beautiful lupines, Indian paintbrush and assorted other wildflowers which led out to views overlooking the desert floor. Although the views were spectacular the air quality over the desert was not great because all the horizons seemed a little smoggy. The air on the summit was clear so I concentrated on my latest passion, shooting wildflowers.

After we left the peak, Les could not contain himself so he decided to go exploring on the four-wheel drive side roads, off the main dirt road. This led to a "winchident." Eventually, we returned to the real road and then the highway.

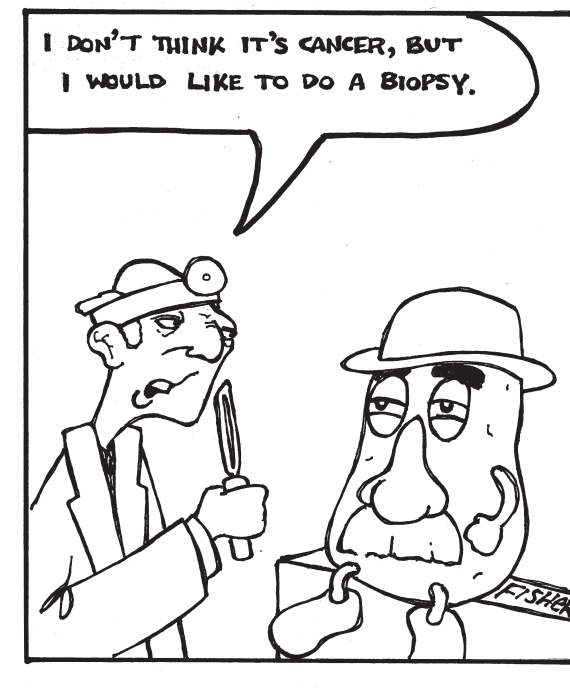

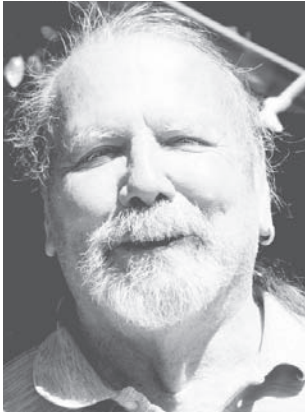

BEFORE OUR TIME

Idyllwild's SMASH! ...

With playground construction underway at our future community center, it's appropriate to recall the Wright family compound that occupied the site for more than a half-century.

Before 2008, you may have noticed a cluster of abandoned structures on the property. These included a lodge and two cabins for family members, tiny quarters for domestic help, a caretaker's cottage, a green barn and attached shop, a tennis court, and an empty swimming pool with adjoining bath house. Scattered about the property were traces of abandoned shuffleboard, badminton, and handball courts, plus a horse corral down on the flat beside Strawberry Creek, near the charred remains of what was once a guest cabin.

Bordering Highway 243 was the only building left in use, a former garage converted to a real estate office, its upstairs recreation room left accumulating trash. And the caretaker's cottage near Ridgeview Drive would briefly house the Chamber of Commerce office and visitors center.

The source of this cluster takes us back to the 19th century and San Jacinto Valley, where Loyd Wright was born and raised. After graduating from the USC law school in 1915 at age 22, he married Julia Kingsbury and returned to Hemet to launch a career. They moved to Los Angeles in 1920, but bought the Idyllwild acreage for a future family retreat.

Their growing family prompted them to build the main lodge at Idyllwild in 1924. It was completed in time for Julia and the children, Loyd Jr. ("Moose"), Pauline, Clarissa and Dudley, to begin spending summers here. Loyd Sr. commuted on weekends from his burgeoning law practice.

As time passed additional cabins were built for use

of the Wrights' children's families. Loyd Jr.'s was dubbed "Moose Lodge," while "Cedar Lodge" mainly served Pauline and Dudley. The recreational facilities were communal. The swimming pool even served the girls at Peak & Pine Camp across the creek, before that camp had its own.

FIRE AND FOREST

Wildland fire ethic ...

May and June see lots of clean-up work as people on the mountain make sure their homes meet fire safety codes and are ready for inspection.

For those of us sensitive to fire issues, it's great to see people removing the leaves, needles, and branches that fell during the winter, taking out the occasional dead tree, and cutting the weeds that have been growing since the weather turned warm. Most people who live or own property here understand the importance of this activity and attend to it regularly, knowing it is necessary for their own safety, as well as the community in general.

Some are less regular but still do it when they are reminded, or see what their neighbors are doing. Some are delayed by circumstance — illness, emergencies, travel — but get around to it when they are able. Most people know they should do it and don't let it go late into summer.

So all in all, most people on the mountain make their properties fire safe. They understand why it is necessary.



They know we live on a mountain surrounded by a large, dry forest, and that large, destructive fires are endemic to southern California. They know that over the last decade we have had terrible fires close by.

They know that whether houses are destroyed in fires depends to a large extent on the vegetation surrounding the house. They know that raking their needles and removing the deadwood won't guarantee that their house will survive a large wildland fire, but they know it increases their chances.

They also know their property looks better without the forest detritus (most of us like parks). They also know that heavy vegetative screens, like a thick wall of manzanita or cedar trees, in addition to being a fire hazard, may provide privacy, but can also hide burglars. They know that a lot of pests and animals can hide in thick cover, and while we all love to see a deer now and then, we really don't want a lot of animals and insects setting up shop next to our house.

Most people on the mountain know the dangers of strong wind in a forest, and very much like to not have dead trees

Fern Creek Medical adds cardiologist

Dr. Ken Browning, Fern Creek Medical Center proprietor, has added the services of North County San Diego cardiologist Dr. Robert Orr. Browning's plan is to provide full service medical care, including cardiology tests, on the Hill so that patients do not have to leave the Hill for many medical needs.

Orr, whose practice in Vista is called California Coastal Cardiology, brings an impressive background to his primarily weekend practice in Idyllwild. He completed his residency at New York Medical College, Cabrini Medical Center and Bellevue Hospital Center in New York City, and a fellowship at the State University of New York in Buffalo.

Orr was one of the founders of New Hampshire Cardiology Consultants where he served as director of the cardiac catheterization laboratory. He later served as Clinical Assistant Professor of Medicine at Boston University School of Medicine. During that same time Orr was seen on many medical talk shows and was a regular

on local news as a medical expert.

He has been a California resident since 2007 and along with his wife, Dr. Monique Manganello, board certified in internal medicine, endocrinology, diabetes and metabolism, maintains a second home in Idyllwild.

Orr plans to see patients by appointment on weekends. Within the Fern Creek Center, Orr will have a cardiology room with the ability to conduct most of the stress tests and evaluations necessary for maintenance of cardiac health.

Should Hill patients require more elaborate procedures, Orr can arrange to have them conducted through his Vista practice and associated hospitals, Tri-City Medical Center in Vista and Scripps in Encinitas. Orr's North County staff can arrange special rate hotel accommodations for Idyllwild residents making the trip and will have staff meet Idyllwild patients as they check into either of the two hospitals with which he is associated.

Orr, who makes a practice of staying physically fit, recommends preventative steps

to maintain heart health including regular aerobic exercise, use of fish oil and multivitamins, and nutrition and weight management to keep blood pressure and cholesterol at optimal levels. "We make every effort to provide our patients with the knowledge necessary to improve their health and lifestyle," said Orr. "We strongly believe in preventative medicine and take great pride in partnering with our patients to provide them the education to live longer and healthier lives."

As he does in his North County practice, Orr said

he would offer Idyllwild patients full service evaluation and greater ability to reach him 24/7 directly as well as coordination of off-Hill visits to the aforementioned San Diego County medical facilities.

Orr said he wants Hill patients to be able to feel connected and safe with regard to their cardiac health

at all times, something that can be done through regular visits, testing and monitoring at the Idyllwild office. Also, Skype consultations during times when Orr is not physically on the Hill are also available to Idyllwild patients.

Public speaks against SRA fees

The pending State Regulatory Area fee regulations were the subject of public hearings last month. Speakers came to San Diego on May 16 and to Shasta a week later to oppose the fee's imposition.

No representatives from Riverside County or the Idyllwild Fire District spoke at either session. Local public officials from throughout the state were unanimous in their opposition to the fee and its appropriateness.

Many made the point that local fire districts already impose taxes or fees for fire fighting and prevention. And many of these local districts have created aggressive fire prevention programs, Rancho Santa Fe Fire Protection District was very outspoken about its effort for this purpose. This new state levy adds another payment to property owner costs without any additional service.

One person recommended the entire county of San Diego should be exempted from the fee. Part of this argument relied on the county's substantial investment in rural fire protection since the 2003 and 2007 fire sieges. One speaker estimated that San

Diego County has spent an additional \$230 million for rural fire protection, including equipment such as helicopters and an emergency radio network, during the period.

While no Riverside County representatives spoke, this county has implemented an emergency network several years ago and is currently helping CAL FIRE rehabilitate Hemet-Ryan Air base.

Many others argued that the proposed \$35 exemption is much lower than the local fire district collections. One person argued for a minimum exemption of \$75 while another said they pay the local district \$400 annually. Idyllwild has a special fee of \$65 plus a portion of the county property taxes.

Another major concern expressed at both hearings was the effect of this fee on local fire safe councils, especially if a Community Wildfire Protection Plan had been approved. The Mountain Communities Fire Safe Council's CWPP was approved in 2006.

Representatives of the California Fire Safe Council attended and spoke at the Shasta hearing and again expressed support for fire prevention funding. But they

recommended that the proposed rule be modified to strengthen this effort and minimize funding directed toward fire suppression.

The state Forestry Board will review the draft regulations at its meeting this

week. A draft final rule and an emergency implementation rule are the likely result according to George Gentry, board executive director.

grantees have been identified and were willing to contribute 25 percent of the cost of roof replacement. The first steps in the next few months will be to re-assess each prospective building then submit a comprehensive proposal for FEMA's final approval and funding.

"The people all want to replace their roofs," she said.

Ron Perry, Council board member, learned of this grant at a fire safe seminar. He returned and discussed it with the board and Scott.

"We got going and with some help from Big Bear's council we began a proposal," she said. Then the board

learned they had a month to submit a final application, "We shifted in higher gear and got it done," Scott said proudly.

The Hazard Mitigation Plan took a year to prepare and involves more than 50 subunits within the county, including the Idyllwild Fire District and all three water districts.

"While the [Hazard Mitigation Plan] did not specifically identify roof replacement, fire was one of the top hazards in the plan, and fire resistant construction (including roofs) is a mitigation strategy," said Peter Lent, deputy director of the county's Office of Emergency Services. They prepared the overall plan and managed its progress through the FEMA approval process.

Hurkey Creek bridge project outlined

Caltrans plans to replace a 1930s-era bridge over Hurkey Creek in a project estimated to cost \$2,237,000. The planned three-year project begins this month with overall project and environmental document approval, and concludes when construction is completed in July 2015. The affected area on Highway 74 is from mile marker 62.5 to 62.3 in Garner Valley, just north of Lake Hemet.

A Wednesday, May 31, presentation at the Nature Center by Caltrans project personnel drew few area attendees. The public presentation had been designed to answer questions about the project from area residents most likely to be affected by bridge construction.

The bridge, only 23 feet wide from side railing to railing, is too narrow for the present use by many larger and higher speed vehicles according to Shelli Lombardo, Caltrans District 8 public information officer. The replacement will nearly double bridge width to 43.5 feet.

At the meeting project planners presented a timeline

for the five phases of the project: project approval and environmental document, June 2012; begin design, July 2012; award project, May 2014; begin construction, July 2014; and end construction, July 2015.

At the meeting the project was described as: "remove the existing Hurkey Creek Bridge; construct a two span, 43.5-foot wide, 50-foot long and 5-pile bridge; re-grade creek slopes nearest the bridge abutments for placing rocks for slope protection; construct four retaining walls at the bridge sides and install bridge approach railings; remove only trees within the new bridge path; and apply architectural treatments to minimize visual and cultural impacts." Planners said that part of the project would include planting trees and vegetation appropriately once the bridge is constructed.

Project Manager Daniel Ciacchella noted that though the bridge had not yet been designed, based on prior bridge replacement projects he estimated the Hurkey Creek Bridge would be constructed one lane at a time. There would be one-way bridge traffic for about

a three-month period out of the estimated one-year construction period commencing in July 2014.

During that same period, heavy truck traffic would be rerouted so as not to impact the construction site.

Public comments regarding the project can be filed through June 18 with Kurt Heidelberg in support or

Supervisors face layoffs and salary raises

Proposal to raise pay for elected officials

On Tuesday, the Riverside County Board of Supervisors will review proposals to raise the compensation of the county's elected officials, e.g., sheriff and district attorney, as well as senior career management who are not represented by any labor association. Supervisors' salaries are not part of any of these proposals.

Jay Orr, the county's new executive officer, has sub-

mitted the proposed 2012-13 budget to the board. A hearing is planned for June 11. The budget proposal assumes more than 200 employees will be laid off in order to balance the budget.

Meanwhile, the district attorney and sheriff would receive 12.5 percent raises next year and cumulative 30.6 percent over the four-year period. The other three elected officials, assessor, auditor, and tax collector, would receive 10 percent

and 27.7 percent raises for the same periods.

Subordinate managers in these departments would receive raises between seven and 15 percent.

The county's Human Resources' Director Barbara Olivier submitted the recommendation for the board's approval. She offered two reasons for taking the action now.

In the past several months, Riverside County completed renegotiating several labor contracts, including with the

Riverside Sheriff Association and others. While the county has negotiated significant savings in pension costs, it has granted these employees pay raises. Consequently, employee salaries are approaching senior management levels.

Secondly, Olivier surveyed the salary levels of five neighboring counties and found Riverside's elected officials were 9 percent less than the median salary of similar officials in those counties.

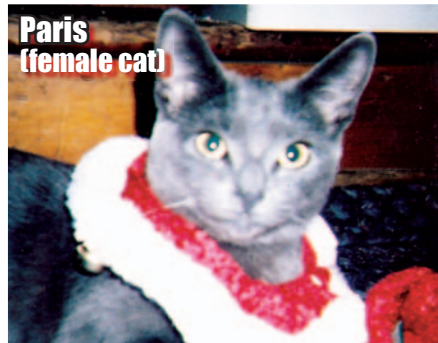

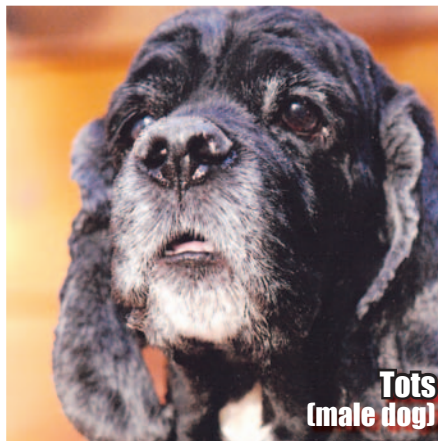

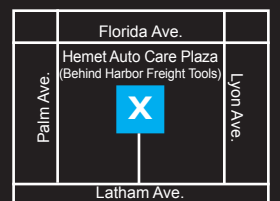

state accepted EDA's plan to reduce program hours to 12 or fewer each week and run the program in sessions that are each under 12 weeks in duration. With these parameters, no licensing is required under governing state code. The complaint filed with the state alleged the preschool had been operating without a required license.

This particular exemption applies only to programs run as part of a government agency recreation program. The Town Hall is operated under the aegis of Riverside County EDA.

"If the intent [of the complainant] was to disrupt the lives of these children and their parents, then they won for two days [the number of days the report forced closure]. But, at the end of the day, the community won," Brown said about the closure.

According to a handbook given to parents at the graduation ceremony, the mission of the program, now called Adventures in Learning, is "to provide children the op-

portunity to learn, grow and interact with other children in a supervised setting that is both warm and nurturing." The new session began on Monday, June 4, for children 3 to 5 years old. This is a fee-based program, with fees

being slightly less than had been charged under the old program. Idyllwild County Recreation is also providing its free summer camp through its Mobile Activities Recreation Service (MARS) for children 7 to 13 and a Jr.

MARS program for children 5 to 6. There will be many off-Hill recreational field trips offered throughout the summer.

First double bill at Idyllwild Authors Series

Amy Friedman and Dennis Danziger

Eduardo Santiago's popular Idyllwild Author Series will feature a two for one bonus on Sunday, June 17. Amy Friedman and Dennis Danziger, two writers who happen to be married to each other will be the next guest speakers.

Friedman is the author of the long-running syndicated newspaper column and series of audio books, "Tell Me a Story," teaches writing at UCLA Extension, blogs for the Huffington Post and recently completed "The Murderer's House," a memoir of her 7-year marriage to a man in prison.

Danziger, Friedman's present husband, teaches English at Venice High School in Los Angeles, collaborates with Friedman producing "Stories by Venice High School Seniors," a PEN In the Classroom Anthology, and also writes about divorce in his recently completed a laugh-out-loud novel, "A Short History of a Tall Jew (Deal Street Press, 2010), Danziger, when asked how Santiago might moderate the conversation given two writers with different styles and genres, laughed and said, "Amy and I have never been at a loss for words. He might just have

to ask one question and we'd go from there."

Before beginning his teaching career, Danziger wrote freelance for television in the decade from 1980 to 1990. His careers have been as he anticipated while at the University of Texas, Austin. When thinking about declaring a major, he wrote down his goals — to be a writer, a high school English teacher and a basketball coach. He's proud that from barrio high schools at which he's taught, many of his graduates go on to quality universities such as UC Berkeley, UCLA and UC Santa Cruz and some have been published. "You can still get a good education within the Los Angeles public school system," he said.

Danziger begins "Short History" with an account of how his character starts each day, since divorcing his

former wife. She constantly hounded him to appear again and again in family court, with serious financial consequences. "Every night for the past twenty-some odd months I've said the same prayer before collapsing into bed. 'Blessed art Thou, Lord our God, Creator of it all, please watch over my beautiful but ill-mannered children. And once Lord, just once before Zack and Lily turn 18, please let me win one hearing in Department 18 of Family Court, 111 North Hill Street, County of Los Angeles, Judge Isadore Brownstein, who hates my guts, presiding. Good-night now.'"

Danziger has his students keep a journal to develop their voices. "Whatever they write, they can share or not. It's their own journal. No pressure, no one looking over their shoulder. Some have told me it's the only place where they have a safe place and voice."

Friedman works with Danziger's Venice High students on shaping their writing, editing and re-editing. The finished pieces, some of which she finds extraordinary, are then published as part of the PEN anthology project. "Dennis sets up the process with the students in the semester prior to my coming in," she said. "That way they're prepared. It works

very well. They find their voices and write and teach their truths."

Friedman, like Danziger, an engaging and gifted conversationalist, has also pursued a varied career path involving teaching, writing and in place of Danziger's basketball coaching, journalism. She left New York and moved to Canada to write a column for a small paper. That job landed a syndicated column that evolved into her widely successful "Tell Me a Story," now also produced in audio CD with music.

In writing about her 7-year marriage to a man in prison, Friedman's style is achingly evocative. "I'd never talked with anyone the way I talked with my ex. Never had that kind of time. Nobody does. But he was a prisoner, and for nearly seven years we sat and talked for hours every day, feet sticking to linoleum floors, butts aching from hard-backed chairs, eyes stinging from smoke, hands sweaty, hearts fluttering, limbs aching to touch. ... He was paroled, and on parole he tried to combat his depression by building walls, first a sea wall of concrete blocks along the St. Lawrence River, and then he kept going, walling off as much of our property as he could, but in the end it couldn't keep him in." (from Friedman's blog

entry, "The Moment I Knew" on Huffington Post.)

Of her teaching, and her experience in co-writing with another, editing and shaping

the words of others, Friedman said it began with her grandmother, who had chosen to stop talking. "I knew she had something to say. I started by giving voice, in my writing, to someone who could not speak. I think it is because I'm a natural empath that I enjoy that process [of understanding the circumstances and thoughts of another and helping to shape and present that voice to others]."

Friedman and Danziger appear with Santiago at 2 p.m. at the INK Bookstore on North Circle. The event is free to the public.

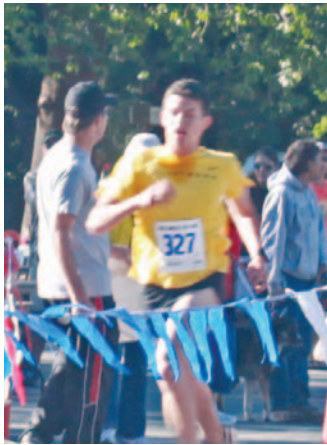

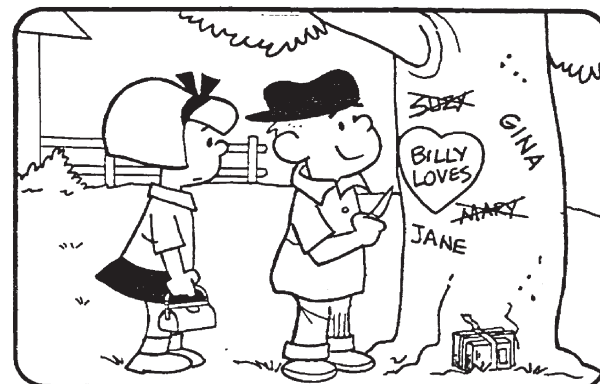
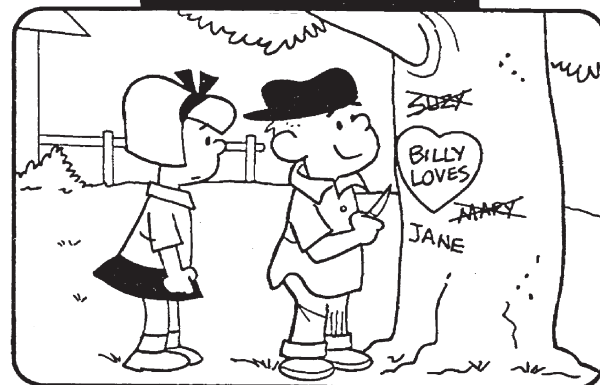

Loyd Wright's legal career is a saga in itself, capped by the presidency of the American Bar Association and a foray into politics as a conservative, anti-communist crusader seeking the Republican nomination for U.S. Senator in 1962. (Wright captured 17 percent of the primary vote. Incredibly, he was actually deemed a liberal by one Howard Jarvis, who came in third, but would later use other means to impose his anti-taxation platform.)

Wright became famous for a seemingly endless list of Hollywood clients, most prominently Charlie Chaplin, whom he represented for a quarter of a century. And though he represented Jane Wyman in a messy divorce from Ronald Reagan, that did not preclude Reagan from serving as honorary campaign chairman for Wright's Senate bid, nor Wright's receiving an appointment in Reagan's Sacramento administration.

The main lodge had its moment of glory in 1954, when Joe DiMaggio and Marilyn Monroe honeymooned there. Caretaker Harry Dickerson was warned "on pain of death" to keep their presence secret, a charge fortunately much easier to fulfill in January than July.

In 1974, Loyd Wright died in Hemet. Two years later, in 1976, his heirs sold the property.

Subsequently, it steadily declined under absentee ownership. For years the compound sat derelict while developers tried to find a buyer or conjure projects. Remember the furor over a proposed upscale resort with its Olympic-size pool?

By 2006, when ICRC received the property, only Moose Lodge retained any original character, with such

or heavy branches threaten their homes (or heads) when our storms or autumn winds come.

Most people around here actually like complying with state and county laws, especially the ones that make obvious sense. Most people new to the mountain communities are unfamiliar with the stress placed on fire abatement, but they are open to learning and sensible reasoning.

Most people really like living in these mountains and want to take care of them. Whatever personal frustrations we experience, the beautiful mountains are there every day. Most people understand at a gut level their good fortune in being able to live in such a place.

Most want to protect the mountains and forest, and are willing to do their part. Most people in our communities are reasonable, and naturally want to protect the place where they live.

Most people here accept the responsibilities of living in southern California in the middle of a mountain forest. This shared responsibility can be called our wildland fire ethic. We are aware of our risk, and we take steps to minimize it. We know our actions matter, for ourselves and others.

touches as an elegant corner fireplace of river rock, recessed metal sconces for candlelit reading by bunk-bed occupants, and a built-in folding desk.

Tragically, no person or group could amass the resources to move and preserve the building. The Wright family salvaged memorabilia, and the Idyllwild Area Historical Society received some representative artifacts (including that desk). Otherwise, this bit of Idyllwild's history survives only in photos and memories.

30 years ago - 1982

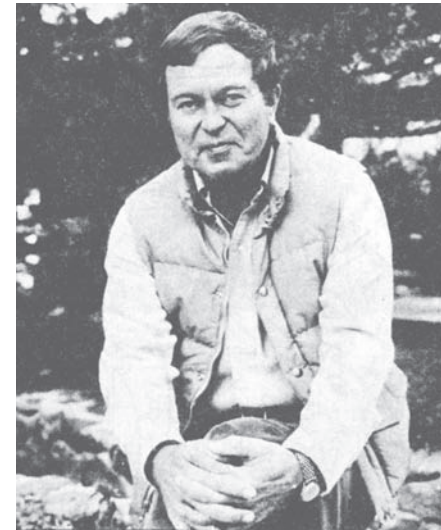
Most of the 35 people attending a meeting of the Hemet Unified School District Board of Trustees voiced support for the proposed secondary school in Garner Valley.

California, and no participants were from outside of the state.

Three Marines from Twentynine Palms ran in the 10K race. This year anybody in the active military had their entry fee waived. Sixty-six people walked the 5K and 130 ran it. Seventy-four runners did the 10K. Twenty-eight kids ran the 1/2-mile kids race at the Town Hall.

The proceeds from this race always go to the Idyllwild School Physical Education Program. Thousands of dollars have been raised over the years to purchase equipment and supplement their program. And it would not be possible without the support of this community.

The California Highway Patrol's inspection of the truck concluded that there was no mechanical problem that could have contributed to the incident. "CHP investigators are in communication with the Riverside County District Attorney's office regarding the filing of criminal charges against Carrillo," said Darren Meyer, CHP public information of-

ficer. "The exact violations and their severity have yet to be determined." Meyer noted that Carrillo had a valid driver license, but that he had only held it for 15 days prior to the May 30 incident.

Hemet Unified School District Trustee Bill Sanborn confirmed that the three most seriously injured students are expected to recover. Sanborn also noted that several Hemet High students from Idyllwild narrowly escaped injury given their

proximity to the truck's destructive path.

As of Monday, June 4, all but one student have been released from hospital. The still hospitalized female student, a Hemet High sophomore, remained in serious condition at Riverside County Regional Medical Center. Family members indicate she is making progress, according to the CHP press release.
