

Outside Idyllwild

Two trips to Garner Valley ...

On July 3, I woke at sunrise, quickly dressed and went outside to check out the morning sky. Lots of cottonball puffy clouds filled the southern sky with just enough blue showing through to make for a dramatic golden hour.



I went inside, packed up my gear and headed out to Garner Valley to see what the flowers and butterflies were doing. My plan was to head over to Fobes Ranch Road to photograph some

landscapes and then head over to Lake Hemet to see the wildflowers in bloom.

It turned out to be a little cloudier than I thought. The sun remained hidden from view with only an occasional sunray escaping from the dark mass of clouds. I clicked away, nonetheless, and kept my eyes peeled for any unusual wildflowers or butterflies.

As I walked around on the road, I saw what looked like a plant topped with fried eggs. Unfortunately it was pretty far off and behind a barbed-wire fence. On my last trip to

Garner Valley, I had an encounter with barbed wire that left a 6-inch gash above my right ankle.

I decided to keep my distance and use the camera's zoom lens to get closer to what I found out later was a prickly poppy, Argemone munita.

After taking about 150 photos, I decided to make my way over to the lake but roadside wildflowers proved to be too tempting so I pulled over to walk up and down the roadside.

I found sand verbena, sapphire woollystar (Eriastrum sapphirinum), an unknown species of orange globemallow, California evening primrose, spearleaf mountain dandelion, twiggy wreath plant, small bluish flax flower and summer lupines (Lupinus formosus).

Even though I ended up across the highway from Lake Hemet, I never made it to the lake as my camera battery warning light started to blink. That means I

have taken too many photos to edit in one session so I headed home. I need to get a backup battery, or maybe not. My new card can hold nearly 2,000 photos so an extra battery could mean trouble.

On the morning of July 6, with a little less cloud cover than the previous trip, I decided to head out to Lake Hemet. This time it was it was straight to the lake, do not pass "Go," do not collect 200 photos.

It turned out to be that rare day when conditions are perfect for taking landscapes, flowers, butterflies, furry critters or you name it. This was truly one of those days where you are glad to be alive and outdoors.

Unlike a camera, my brain can record millions of images and the batteries last for decades but it is still nice to have camera images to jog the brain and remember days like this.

On Lake Hemet Road, I stopped once again and walked up and down looking for interesting flower species. I found narrow leaf milkweed (Asclepias fascicularis), southern honeysuckle, low carpet clover (Trifolium spp.), twiggy wreath plants (with paler flowers and purple pollen) and an unidentified fiddleneck-like plant.

"She was completely wiped out; 100 percent exhausted," Arnson said.



The 20th Jazz in the Pines is only five weeks away — Aug. 17 and 18. The program continues to bring new and fresh jazz performers to the Hill as well as reward attendees with ever popular and returning favorites.

For Idyllwild, one of the 2013 entertainers will be local and American Idol finalist Casey Abrams, who performs in the Holmes Amphitheatre at noon Sunday. Abrams, 21, won't be the youngest performer because Marsha Lytle, jazz chair, is bringing back Ray Goren, the phenomenal 13-year-old singer and guitarist, with his band. Goren makes an appearance for the third consecutive year.

While Abrams and Goren invigorate jazz with their youth, Lytle and Artistic Director Bubba Jackson, KKJZ 88.1FM personality, bring several long-time, well-known and recognized Grammy artists to the festival.

On Saturday, the audience hears two-time Grammy-award winning vocalist and pianist Diane Schuur (1:30 p.m.) and the Harvey Mason Chameleon Project (3 p.m.) with Grammy award-nominated percussionist Harvey Mason and featuring multiple Grammy award-nominated pianist and vocalist Patrice Rushen.

The John Daversa Sextet finishes the afternoon on the main stage. While not yet a Grammy nominee, Daversa has won many national jazz awards, including the Herb Alpert and ITG Jazz Soloist competitions.

On Sunday in the Barn, jazz aficionados may listen to the Rob Thorsen Trio featuring Josh White, the second-place winner of the 2012 Thelonious Monk piano competition.

The amazing jazz talent is not limited to a few award winners. This year, jazz vocalists Janis Mann and Denise Donatelli return. While always popular, these favorites are complemented with new additions to the local jazz scene. On Sunday, Jackson introduces Izzy Chait and then Amina

Chait is a jazz vocalist whose professional career began in the 1960s during his stint in the Marines. For the next 25 years his musical career was in abeyance as he developed his antique and auctioneer business. In 2001, he released his first album and now appears throughout Southern California belting out classic jazz standards such as "All Of Me," "Blues In The Night," "All The Way" and Gershwin songs.

The Amina Figarova Sextet brings international jazz to the amphitheatre. Amina, a pianist and composer of many jazz pieces, was born and raised in Baku, Azerbaijan, and her husband, Bart, a flutist, is from Belgium. They treat an audience to jazz's international feel, which they have shared with jazz fans in Newport, New Orleans and New York, where they now reside.

Finishing the afternoon is the Euphoria Brass Band from San Diego. This group is quickly growing Idyllwild roots. It recently appeared at the 2013 Aroma Spring Jazz Fest and participated in last week's Fourth of July Parade.

Many local groups also perform that weekend. Familiar to long-time jazz fest visitors are Rocky Zharp, P.S. Blues Band, Robin Adler, The Chuck Alvarez Band and Change



the Idyllwild Fire Protection District financial difficulties and figure out for yourselves when the finances became so murky. When did the audits fall into arrears? When did the health care overpayment start? When did the bailout loans from the county start? The same people who are running for commissioner were in charge then.

The lack of audits started on Steve Kunkle's watch, as did the determination of the [Riverside County] Grand Jury "that the local fire department had used intimidation against individuals, violated open meeting rules and was underskilled in medical emergencies."

Rhonda Andrewson was administrative assistant when the 17 months of overpayments to firefighters occurred.

Jeannine Charles-Stigall authorized begging the county for bailout loans since IFPD wouldn't stay within budget. She has been ineffective in developing and enforcing the policies and protocols that could regenerate this department.

Nancy Layton, the most recent financial advisor, didn't catch the overpayments to firefighters. She had a flier at Honey Buns and Joe with prominently displayed logos of several organizations, implying that they are endorsing her.

Many of us have volunteered countless hours with our nonprofits but don't abuse this relationship by assuming they would endorse us for public office. Isn't it deceiving to the voters to use these logos? Doesn't Elections Code Section 18304 (a)(b)(c) call this a punishable misdemeanor? I started reading a book about cooking that a close friend gave me for my birthday.

What I have read so far gives me a clue as to what the book will hold. "Cooked," by Michael Pollan, was on the bestseller list, although it contains no recipes. He also authored "The Omnivore's Dilemma" and



"Food Rules." Several of his other books also made the bestseller list.

Pollan has a different way of looking at food and as far as I have read, his writing brings memories of my Dad who connected everything — rain, sun, earth, soil and nature — in spirit to his orchard.

Pollan also mentions family dinners of the past. He also writes about the introduction of processed foods into American diets and urges a return to family meals. Pick up the book, it's great reading.

With that said, less and less time is spent in the family kitchen. I can understand the reasons. For example, in many families today, both parents work. Time to prepare meals from scratch with fresh vegetables and protein is too precious and rarely available.

My childhood memories of family suppers include my siblings and me with glasses of milk, my Dad with his beloved wine and the table always loaded with Mexican food. Oh, how I miss Mama's food.

Now, do I send you to the market to buy Stouffer's lasagna or do I give you a healthy recipe? By the way, have you ever flipped over a box of Stouffer's lasagna. Check out the fat and cholesterol content. Most processed foods are loaded with sugar and salt.

I just subscribed to allrecipes.com magazine. Here is a great recipe from my first magazine. It is yummy.

Baja fish tacos

6 tomatoes, diced

1 small onion, diced

1/2 cup chopped fresh cilantro

2 tbsps canned and diced jalapeno peppers,

or more to taste, juice reserved

1/2 tsp garlic salt

1/2 lime, juiced

3 cups coleslaw mix

3 tbsps ranch dressing

2 cups vegetable oil for frying

1 (9 ounce) box batter mix (such as Shore Lunch)

1 (12 ounce) can or bottle Mexican beer

24 corn tortillas

1 pound cod fillets, cut into 2-inch chunks

2 cups shredded Mexican cheese blend

2 limes, sliced into wedges

1 dash chile-garlic sauce (such as Sriracha; optional)

Mix tomatoes, onion, cilantro, jalapeno peppers, 1 tablespoon juice from jalapeno peppers and garlic salt in a bowl. Squeeze 1/2 a lime over salsa fresca; then cover with plastic wrap and chill while preparing fish.

Toss coleslaw mix in a bowl with ranch dressing and set aside for flavors to blend.

Heat the oil in a deep fryer or large sauce pan to 350 degrees. Stir the batter mix and beer together in a bowl.

Wrap the corn tortillas together in wet paper towels and set aside.

Dip the cod in the batter mix and fry the coated cod in batches of hot oil until it is cooked through and coating is brown. Four to five minutes seems appropriate. Remove cod with a slotted spoon and drain on paper-towel-lined plate.

Microwave the tortillas on high until warmed, about 1 minute.

Stack two tortillas on a plate. Then top with fish and a sprinkle of Mexican cheese, coleslaw mixture, salsa fresca, and a squeeze from a lime wedge. Drizzle the chile-garlic sauce, if using.

Repeat with remaining ingredients.

Note: I added a sliced avocado to the plate, and finely chopped green onions to the taco. Also, I reduced the amount of heat ingredients. Just a little too spicy. Enjoy.

County closes underground tank case

The Pine Cove underground storage tank project, which the Riverside County Department of Environmental Health has been monitoring since 1994, has officially been closed, according to a June 25 letter from the department to Howard Friedman of Santee.

The site was located at the Pine Cove Market, which Friedman formerly owned. The case was initiated under his ownership.

The letter "confirms the completion of a site investigation and corrective action for the underground storage tanks," wrote Steve Van Stockum, director of Environmental Health.

Friedman's actions complied with the appropriate sections of the state's Health and Safety Code, consequently, "... no further action related to the petroleum release at the site is required."

In May, the seven monitoring wells at the site were closed and removed.

Fire fee begins court journey

The Howard Jarvis Taxpayers Association lawsuit, which attempts to overturn California's State Regulated Area Fire Fee will begin Friday, July 19, in the Sacramento Superior Court.

The initial proceeding is a hearing in response to the state's request that the case be dismissed.

The Jarvis association filed the litigation in October 2012. The suit alleges that the fee, being applied to parcels and structures with State Regulated Areas, is actually a tax. Consequently, its passage requires a two-thirds majority of the state legislature, not a simple majority, which enacted the fee in July 2011. The Jarvis litigation also challenges the fee's implementation, too.

The state's response first challenges the facts and argues that a class action suit cannot be filed.

"... class relief against government defendants is unavailable unless the specific government claims statute permits the filing of class claims. Under AB29X, only 'a person from whom the fire prevention fee is determined to be due' may file a petition for re-determination. The term 'person' does not include a class. Thus, the class allegations and all other class references should be stricken from the ... complaint," wrote California Deputy Attorney General Jacob Berman in an April filing.

The court's ruling will determine whether the case proceeds.

Brendan Steele improved his position on the FedEx Cup points list and added some insurance to his playing card for next season.

The native Idyllwilder shot a 3-under-par 66-70-72-69 — 277 in The Greenbrier Classic in West Virginia to gain 24 FedEx Cup points, bringing his running total to 429 and moving from 88th position to 85th on the points list. He also added more than \$20,000 to his official prize money for the season.

Steele continues to maintain his high-level iron play. Last week he averaged an excellent 29 feet, 2 inches, in proximity to the hole, which is a stat measuring the closeness to the pin of approach shots. In his final round he averaged an outstanding 24 feet, 2 inches in that category.

Sunday, on the 616-yard, par-5 17th hole, Steele slammed a drive of 321 yards to the left fairway, followed with a crushing 288-yard 3-wood to within 7 feet, 2 inches of the hole — then sank that putt for an eagle 3. Wow, wouldn't you have loved to have seen that?

This week Steele plays in the \$4.6 million John Deere Classic on the TPC Deere Run course in Silvia, Ill. Not quite as much money at stake this week, but the winner gets the bonus of qualifying for the Open Championship (often referred to in the U.S. as the British Open), which will be played next week at Muirfield in Scotland.



Brenna metaphorically discusses 'Murdering the Mom'

Don't expect "Murdering the Mom," Duff Brenna's latest work, to be a criminal confession of matricide, although a browser at one of his book signings asked Brenna's publisher if it was a death row confession.


Quite the opposite. Nearly 15 years after his mother's death, Brenna is writing his paean to her. The title derives from her frequent response to his behavior, "You're killing me, Duffy," she would tell him — something most of us have either heard or repeated.

"She influenced my life heavily," Brenna said. "My mother was all energy. She was straightforward and never looked back. She never regretted anything. It's over."

Although they seldom crossed paths for years, he credits her as "... one of the forces in my life." His mother instilled the lessons that developed his ambition to become a writer.

Thus, this book is his attempt to "immortalize her and remember her and how she was in my eyes." Brenna is the next presenter in Eduardo Santiago's Idyllwild Author Series.

Born in Minnesota, he left home at 15 years and



took a lot of courage to write that book and he did it beautifully — if unconventionally!"

"Murdering the Mom" requires some effort. Brenna foregoes quotation marks throughout and also shifts his voice from first, to second and even to third person at times. By reading his work out loud, he finds the right

"Using the various voices, I felt I could mine my conscious that addresses cluding the quality of life near its end. He questions whether he could make a choice to avoid entering the abyss of dementia and long-term hospice care.

'It's always a question about quantity versus quality. What's more important?"



Retired from teaching, he is the editor of an online literature journal — Serving House Journal — focusing on fostering literary arts. In fact, Brenna states, "Art is my religion." Symphonies, poems, sculptures and literature are all spiritual to him.

It's his belief in art that helps him through daily hardships. He describes his style as "neo-naturalism." It's simple and straightforward. There are "no compromises with sentimentality," he explained. His literary influences are Mark Twain, Jack London, Ernest Hemingway and Leo Tolstov.

Pursuing his art is his mission. He is working on two books, one true story about a woman whose husband killed her. Although he has finished a first draft, it is in abeyance until the man's trial in Orange County begins and ends.

The second is about a couple. The woman is dying and her husband becomes so traumatized he has to leave. The result is a re-birth for both.

Brenna and Eduardo Santiago will discuss "Murdering the Mom" and works from Brenna at 3 p.m. Sunday, July 14, at Café Aroma.



Brad Bobo, bassist and composer, Larry Washington, drummer, and Mike Simms, guitar, will accompany her on stage.


All the musicians have great voices, she said. But since she doesn't get to play any notes, they won't be allowed to sing, she explained.



Wildfire control campaign

The U.S. Forest Service and other land management agencies have a new fire safety campaign in California. The One Less Spark, One Less Wildfire campaign provides constant reminders during this fire season to reduce the numbers of human-caused vehicle and equipment wildfires throughout the state.

"All the stories we hear about sparks starting wildland fires are true, especially during this hot, dry summer," said Joe Aragon, U.S. Forest Service Region 5 Interagency Fire Prevention Action Team coordinator. "With the low precipitation winter brought, conditions are ideal for fire starts. We're here to coordinate with communities, agencies, organizations and schools to heighten awareness and ultimately protect the public from damaging fires in order to create more fire-adapted communities."

The campaign features posters, bumper stickers, informational cards and public service announcements giving safety messages about equipment such as lawn mowers igniting fires, tow chains sparking fires along roadways,

and safe campfires.

Partner agencies include the National Park Service, Bureau of Land Management, Cal Fire, Caltrans, California Department of Fish and Game, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, Bureau of Reclamation and many others.

Fire season in California has technically just begun, and already campfires have been blamed for 45 fires on national forest land. String trimmers, chain saws and mowers have sparked 13 fires. An abandoned campfire started the 1,708 acre Carstens Fire on the Sierra National Forest near Yosemite, costing millions of dollars.





Outside Idyllwild

Two trips to Garner Valley ...

On July 3, I woke at sunrise, quickly dressed and went outside to check out the morning sky. Lots of cottonball puffy clouds filled the southern sky with just enough blue showing through to make for a dramatic golden hour.



I went inside, packed up my gear and headed out to Garner Valley to see what the flowers and butterflies were doing. My plan was to head over to Fobes Ranch

Road to photograph some landscapes and then head over to Lake Hemet to see the wildflowers in bloom.

It turned out to be a little cloudier than I thought. The sun remained hidden from view with only an occasional sunray escaping from the dark mass of clouds. I clicked away, nonetheless, and kept my eyes peeled for any unusual wildflowers or butterflies.

As I walked around on the road, I saw what looked like a plant topped with fried eggs. Unfortunately it was pretty far off and behind a barbed-wire fence. On my last trip to

Garner Valley, I had an encounter with barbed wire that left a 6-inch gash above my right ankle.

I decided to keep my distance and use the camera's zoom lens to get closer to what I found out later was a prickly poppy, Argemone munita.

After taking about 150 photos, I decided to make my way over to the lake but roadside wildflowers proved to be too tempting so I pulled over to walk up and down the roadside.

I found sand verbena, sapphire woollystar (Eriastrum sapphirinum), an unknown species of orange globemallow, California evening primrose, spearleaf mountain dandelion, twiggy wreath plant, small bluish flax flower and summer lupines (Lupinus formosus).

Even though I ended up across the highway from Lake Hemet, I never made it to the lake as my camera battery warning light started to blink. That means I

have taken too many photos to edit in one session so I headed home. I need to get a backup battery, or maybe not. My new card can hold nearly 2,000 photos so an extra battery could mean trouble.

On the morning of July 6, with a little less cloud cover than the previous trip, I decided to head out to Lake Hemet. This time it was it was straight to the lake, do not pass "Go," do not collect 200 photos.

It turned out to be that rare day when conditions are perfect for taking landscapes, flowers, butterflies, furry critters or you name it. This was truly one of those days where you are glad to be alive and outdoors.

Unlike a camera, my brain can record millions of images and the batteries last for decades but it is still nice to have camera images to jog the brain and remember days like this.

On Lake Hemet Road, I stopped once again and walked up and down looking for interesting flower species. I found narrow leaf milkweed (Asclepias fascicularis), southern honeysuckle, low carpet clover (Trifolium spp.), twiggy wreath plants (with paler flowers and purple pollen) and an unidentified fiddleneck-like plant.

macy will be forced to stop serving our patients on Medi-Cal. Why this 10% cut is so threatening is that it comes on top of our total reimbursement. A prescription recently filled for a Medi-Cal patient cost \$1304.98, Medi-Cal reimbursed \$1340.26. showing a \$35.28 profit. Come September, Medi-Cal will take another \$134.02 cut from the pharmacy leaving me a gross loss of \$98.75. No business can or should sustain these type of loses. What is even more insidious is Medi-Cal will go back 2 years and recoup 10% of the total reimbursements.



For Idyllwild, one of the 2013 entertainers will be local and American Idol finalist Casey Abrams, who performs in the Holmes Amphitheatre at noon Sunday. the Idyllwild Fire Protection District financial difficulties and figure out for yourselves when the finances became so murky. When did the audits fall into arrears? When did the health care overpayment start? When did the bailout loans from the county start? The same people who are running for commissioner were in charge then.

The lack of audits started on Steve Kunkle's watch, as did the determination of the [Riverside County] Grand Jury "that the local fire department had used intimidation against individuals, violated open meeting rules and was underskilled in medical emergencies."

Rhonda Andrewson was administrative assistant when the 17 months of overpayments to firefighters occurred.

Jeannine Charles-Stigall authorized begging the county for bailout loans since IFPD wouldn't stay within budget. She has been ineffective in developing and enforcing the policies and protocols that could regenerate this department.

Nancy Layton, the most recent financial advisor, didn't catch the overpayments to firefighters. She had a flier at Honey Buns and Joe with prominently displayed logos of several organizations, implying that they are endorsing her.



Lola's kitchen

I started reading a book about cooking that a close friend gave me for my birthday.

What I have read so far gives me a clue as to what the book will hold. "Cooked," by Michael Pollan, was on the bestseller list, although it contains no recipes. He also authored "The Omnivore's Dilemma" and



"Food Rules." Several of his other books also made the bestseller list.

Pollan has a different way of looking at food and as far as I have read, his writing brings memories of my Dad who connected everything — rain, sun, earth, soil and nature — in spirit to his orchard.

Pollan also mentions family dinners of the past. He also writes about the introduction of processed foods into American diets and urges a return to family meals. Pick up the book, it's great reading.

With that said, less and less time is spent in the family kitchen. I can understand the reasons. For example, in many families today, both parents work. Time to prepare meals from scratch with fresh vegetables and protein is too precious and rarely available.

My childhood memories of family suppers include my siblings and me with glasses of milk, my Dad with his beloved wine and the table always loaded with Mexican food. Oh, how I miss Mama's food.

Now, do I send you to the market to buy Stouffer's lasagna or do I give you a healthy recipe? By the way, have you ever flipped over a box of Stouffer's lasagna. Check out the fat and cholesterol content. Most processed foods are loaded with sugar and salt.

I just subscribed to allrecipes.com magazine. Here is a great recipe from my first magazine. It is yummy.

Baja fish tacos

6 tomatoes, diced

1 small onion, diced

1/2 cup chopped fresh cilantro

2 tbsps canned and diced jalapeno peppers,

or more to taste, juice reserved

1/2 tsp garlic salt

1/2 lime, juiced

3 cups coleslaw mix

3 tbsps ranch dressing

2 cups vegetable oil for frying

1 (9 ounce) box batter mix (such as Shore Lunch)

1 (12 ounce) can or bottle Mexican beer

24 corn tortillas

1 pound cod fillets, cut into 2-inch chunks

2 cups shredded Mexican cheese blend

2 limes, sliced into wedges

1 dash chile-garlic sauce (such as Sriracha; optional)

Mix tomatoes, onion, cilantro, jalapeno peppers, 1 tablespoon juice from jalapeno peppers and garlic salt in a bowl. Squeeze 1/2 a lime over salsa fresca; then cover with plastic wrap and chill while preparing fish.

Toss coleslaw mix in a bowl with ranch dressing and set aside for flavors to blend.

Heat the oil in a deep fryer or large sauce pan to 350 degrees. Stir the batter mix and beer together in a bowl.

Wrap the corn tortillas together in wet paper towels and set aside.

Dip the cod in the batter mix and fry the coated cod in batches of hot oil until it is cooked through and coating is brown. Four to five minutes seems appropriate. Remove cod with a slotted spoon and drain on paper-towel-lined plate.

Microwave the tortillas on high until warmed, about 1 minute.

Stack two tortillas on a plate. Then top with fish and a sprinkle of Mexican cheese, coleslaw mixture, salsa fresca, and a squeeze from a lime wedge. Drizzle the chile-garlic sauce, if using.

Repeat with remaining ingredients.

Note: I added a sliced avocado to the plate, and finely chopped green onions to the taco. Also, I reduced the amount of heat ingredients. Just a little too spicy. Enjoy.

County closes underground tank case

The Pine Cove underground storage tank project, which the Riverside County Department of Environmental Health has been monitoring since 1994, has officially been closed, according to a June 25 letter from the department to Howard Friedman of Santee.

The site was located at the Pine Cove Market, which Friedman formerly owned. The case was initiated under his ownership.

The letter "confirms the completion of a site investigation and corrective action for the underground storage tanks," wrote Steve Van Stockum, director of Environmental Health.

Friedman's actions complied with the appropriate sections of the state's Health and Safety Code, consequently, "... no further action related to the petroleum release at the site is required."

In May, the seven monitoring wells at the site were closed and removed.



Fire fee begins court journey

The Howard Jarvis Taxpayers Association lawsuit, which attempts to overturn California's State Regulated Area Fire Fee will begin Friday, July 19, in the Sacramento Superior Court.

The initial proceeding is a hearing in response to the state's request that the case be dismissed.

The Jarvis association filed the litigation in October 2012. The suit alleges that the fee, being applied to parcels and structures with State Regulated Areas, is actually a tax. Consequently, its passage requires a two-thirds majority of the state legislature, not a simple majority, which enacted the fee in July 2011. The Jarvis litigation also challenges the fee's implementation, too.

The state's response first challenges the facts and argues that a class action suit cannot be filed.

"... class relief against government defendants is unavailable unless the specific government claims statute permits the filing of class claims. Under AB29X, only 'a person from whom the fire prevention fee is determined to be due' may file a petition for re-determination. The term 'person' does not include a class. Thus, the class allegations and all other class references should be stricken from the ... complaint," wrote California Deputy Attorney General Jacob Berman in an April filing.

The court's ruling will determine whether the case proceeds.

Steele moving up the FedEx ladder

Brendan Steele improved his position on the FedEx Cup points list and added some insurance to his playing card for next season.

The native Idyllwilder shot a 3-under-par 66-70-72-69 — 277 in The Greenbrier Classic in West Virginia to gain 24 FedEx Cup points, bringing his running total to 429 and moving from 88th position to 85th on the points list. He also added more than \$20,000 to his official prize money for the season.

Steele continues to maintain his high-level iron play. Last week he averaged an excellent 29 feet, 2 inches, in proximity to the hole, which is a stat measuring the closeness to the pin of approach shots. In his final round he averaged an outstanding 24 feet, 2 inches in that category.

Sunday, on the 616-yard, par-5 17th hole, Steele slammed a drive of 321 yards to the left fairway, followed with a crushing 288-yard 3-wood to within 7 feet, 2 inches of the hole — then sank that putt for an eagle 3. Wow, wouldn't you have loved to have seen that?

This week Steele plays in the \$4.6 million John Deere Classic on the TPC Deere Run course in Silvia, Ill. Not quite as much money at stake this week, but the winner gets the bonus of qualifying for the Open Championship (often referred to in the U.S. as the British Open), which will be played next week at Muirfield in Scotland.

Brenna metaphorically discusses 'Murdering the Mom'

Don't expect "Murdering the Mom," Duff Brenna's latest work, to be a criminal confession of matricide, although a browser at one of his book signings asked Brenna's publisher if it was a death row confession.


Quite the opposite. Nearly 15 years after his mother's death, Brenna is writing his paean to her. The title derives from her frequent response to his behavior, "You're killing me, Duffy," she would tell him — something most of us have either heard or repeated.

"She influenced my life heavily," Brenna said. "My mother was all energy. She was straightforward and never looked back. She never regretted anything. It's over."

Although they seldom crossed paths for years, he credits her as "... one of the forces in my life." His mother instilled the lessons that developed his ambition to become a writer.

Thus, this book is his attempt to "immortalize her and remember her and how she was in my eyes." Brenna is the next presenter in Eduardo Santiago's Idyllwild Author Series.

Born in Minnesota, he left home at 15 years and



took a lot of courage to write that book and he did it beautifully — if unconventionally!"

"Murdering the Mom" requires some effort. Brenna foregoes quotation marks throughout and also shifts his voice from first, to second and even to third person at times. By reading his work out loud, he finds the right

"Using the various voices, I felt I could mine my conscious that addresses cluding the quality of life near its end. He questions whether he could make a choice to avoid entering the abyss of dementia and long-term hospice care.

'It's always a question about quantity versus quality. What's more important?"



Retired from teaching, he is the editor of an online literature journal — Serving House Journal — focusing on fostering literary arts. In fact, Brenna states, "Art is my religion." Symphonies, poems, sculptures and literature are all spiritual to him.

It's his belief in art that helps him through daily hardships. He describes his style as "neo-naturalism." It's simple and straightforward. There are "no compromises with sentimentality," he explained. His literary influences are Mark Twain, Jack London, Ernest Hemingway and Leo Tolstov.

Pursuing his art is his mission. He is working on two books, one true story about a woman whose husband killed her. Although he has finished a first draft, it is in abeyance until the man's trial in Orange County begins and ends.

The second is about a couple. The woman is dying and her husband becomes so traumatized he has to leave. The result is a re-birth for both.

Brenna and Eduardo Santiago will discuss "Murdering the Mom" and works from Brenna at 3 p.m. Sunday, July 14, at Café Aroma.



Brad Bobo, bassist and composer, Larry Washington, drummer, and Mike Simms, guitar, will accompany her on stage.


All the musicians have great voices, she said. But since she doesn't get to play any notes, they won't be allowed to sing, she explained.

Wildfire control campaign

The U.S. Forest Service and other land management agencies have a new fire safety campaign in California. The One Less Spark, One Less Wildfire campaign provides constant reminders during this fire season to reduce the numbers of human-caused vehicle and equipment wildfires throughout the state.

"All the stories we hear about sparks starting wildland fires are true, especially during this hot, dry summer," said Joe Aragon, U.S. Forest Service Region 5 Interagency Fire Prevention Action Team coordinator. "With the low precipitation winter brought, conditions are ideal for fire starts. We're here to coordinate with communities, agencies, organizations and schools to heighten awareness and ultimately protect the public from damaging fires in order to create more fire-adapted communities."

The campaign features posters, bumper stickers, informational cards and public service announcements giving safety messages about equipment such as lawn mowers igniting fires, tow chains sparking fires along roadways,

and safe campfires.

Partner agencies include the National Park Service, Bureau of Land Management, Cal Fire, Caltrans, California Department of Fish and Game, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, Bureau of Reclamation and many others.

Fire season in California has technically just begun, and already campfires have been blamed for 45 fires on national forest land. String trimmers, chain saws and mowers have sparked 13 fires. An abandoned campfire started the 1,708 acre Carstens Fire on the Sierra National Forest near Yosemite, costing millions of dollars.
