Less funding available in Pine Cove in absence of ambulance fee

The Advisory Committee for County Service Area 38 (Pine Cove) began to review the fiscal year 2017-18 budget and received status reports on several current year equipment purchases at last week's meeting.

The tentative budget for the next fiscal year, which begins July 1, is anticipated to drop by more than 50 percent. The current-year budget, including the new engine, is \$680,000 and the 2017-18 projection is \$300,000.

The committee is not strictly tightening its belt. This year, the committee, through the Riverside County Fire Department, purchased a new Type 6 engine for Station 23 (Pine Cove). Its cost was near-

ly \$250,000, thus this expense will not carry forward.

Riverside County Deputy Chief Greg Everhart attended the meeting and reported that the new vehicle was in Indio being outfitted for service and would soon be assigned to the Pine Cove station. It is likely to be designated Medic Patrol 23.

The county has been impressed with these Type 6 engines, according to Everhart, and has ordered five more engines.

The CSA 38 revenue also is decreasing this year and into the future. The committee recommended that the county stop collecting the special parcel fee for ambulance service. This was approved in 2004. Beginning in July 2016, American Medical Response, instead of

Idyllwild Fire, began providing ambulance service to CSA 38 residents.

Just as other unincorporated areas of Riverside County, which are served by AMR through the master county ambulance contract, Pine Cove will no longer have to make a community payment for ambulance service; consequently, the need for the special parcel fee was avoided.

Ambulance fee collections approached \$95,000 annually. The other revenue source, which is about \$60,000 from a long-standing property tax, the county shares with CSA 38.

Committee member Marge Muir requested a financial report before approving the new budget. She wanted to be sure what the carryover balance would be at the end of this year before com-

mitting too much of CSA's funds for next year.

"The money is going pretty fast. We should be a little bit frugal buying huge equipment," Muir advised. "We don't have much money and don't replenish it quickly."

A few of the major proj-

ects being requested for 2017-18 include \$75,000 for the environmental review for the fuelbreak work, new extrication equipment for the new engine and capital improvements (\$100,000) at Station 23, such as a shade cover for the fuel tank and

equipment.

Chair Jerry Holldber, who agreed with Muir, asked Everhart if the fire department could discuss the priorities of each request at the June meeting.

Pine Cove Water adopts revised water rules

New ordinance replaces 1957 version

More than a year later, the revision of Pine Cove Water District's original water policy ordinance has been completed and accepted. At the May 10 meeting, Ordinance 9, a new set of rules and regulations for setting water policies, was unanimously approved and replaces Ordinance 4, originally adopted March 16, 1957.

The major change is an expansion of the section and rules regarding cross-connections, which water districts limit and monitor to prevent private water sources from polluting the public system.

"There have been a lot of new state laws and this updates our backflow requirements," General Manager Jerry Holldber told the board in response to a question from Director Lou Padula. "It also spells out the methodology for how we will set water charges, which will be done through resolutions."

The regulation for cross-connections will require periodic inspections. Later, Padula asked who would pay for these inspections. "The customer," replied Holldber. "However, there will be some costs for the water district, but I can't estimate

them yet."

Customer inspections will only be needed for properties with private wells that have a potential to get into the water system, not all water customers, he stressed.

Director Vicki Jakubac asked about the section that discusses properties with multiple housing units, to which Holldber explained that there may be just one meter for the property, but each additional unit may affect the rates to be set by a board resolution.

Holldber also confirmed that there was no change to the policy of dealing with a catastrophic bill. "There is no forgiveness. By law we can give them up to 12 months to pay the bill, as long as the current charges are being paid."

Pine Cove resident Marge Muir did request an estimate of the cost to develop Ordinance 9. "I'd like to find out what the document cost," she said.

The board also reviewed the draft budget, which Holldber proposes, for fiscal year 2017-18, which begins July 1. The new budget will be \$900,000, a \$50,000 increase over the current year.

The growth in revenue comes for anticipated water sales revenue, increased lease rates for Rocky Point customers and selling new water meters.

Salaries and benefits increase \$25,000. This is a combination of the second field staff member, who was hired this year, being on board for the entire fiscal year and a proposed salary increase of 3 percent, for \$14,000 for salaries.

The investment in improvements increases \$50,000, the largest increase. This is primarily for materials, such as pipeline, for the south-central Pine Cove project, which Holldber said would require several years to complete.

The final payment for the tractor, bought in 2014, was made this fiscal year, which reduces expenses about \$27,500 going forward, for a net increase of \$50,000 for the entire fiscal year.

The current fiscal year is doing well, Holldber told the board. The cash balance of \$280,000 is nearing a high.

Water production in April was about 2.9 million gallons, about 300,000 gallons more than March and 750,000 gallons more than April 2016. For the first four months of 2017,

total production has been 9.9 million gallons, which is 1.6 million more than the same period last year.

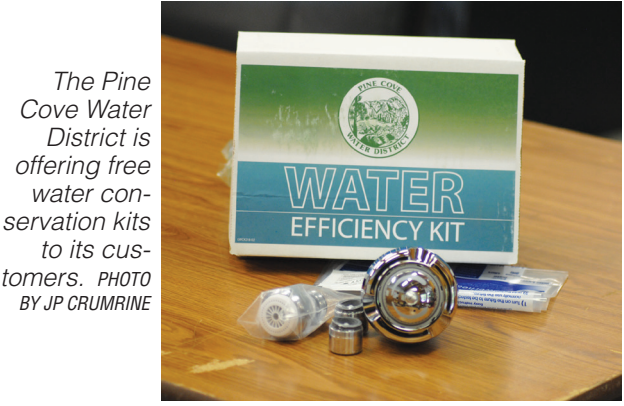
Besides moving to Stage 1 water conservation, Holldber attributed a portion of the increased production to "some leaks."

The winter precipitation is beginning to be seen in PCWD's wells, he said. The groundwater level of the monitoring well, no. 10, rose 9 feet in April, to 134 feet, the highest it has been since October 2015.

"I don't know what it will do every month, but I expect another 30- to 40-foot increase over the summer," he told the board.

At the June board meeting, the directors will hold a hearing on the standby fees and approve the 2017-18 budget.

V. Manny Perez new Supervisor for 4th District

Brown makes appointment to replace Benoit

When it meets on May 23, the Riverside County Board of Supervisors will have five members. Last week, Gov. Jerry Brown appointed former Assemblyman V. Manny Perez, 44, as the county's 4th District supervisor, who took the oath of office Friday, May 12.

In the county's press release, Perez said, "I am humbled and excited. We have a lot of work to do together as a district. I will

be reaching out to all communities in the form of listening tours to better understand the concerns of my constituents. This morning was my first official briefing on the budget and I will be following up with staff next week on next steps..."

He is the second Democrat appointed to the board. In 2015, after former Supervisor Jeff Stone was elected to the state Senate, Brown appointed Democrat Chuck Washington to finish his term.

Craig Wills survives head-on crash

Suffered spinal fractures from uncontrolled driver

Monday evening, May 8, a fatal accident occurred in Valle Vista. The story was in the Town Crier's May 11 edition.

While driving from work, an Idyllwild resident, Craig Wills, 62, the California Highway Patrol identified him as Phillip, was hit by a Toyota Tundra. Wills saw the Toyota's erratic movements, tried to avoid it and had to brace for the head-on collision.

The driver of the Toyota veered into Wills lane, after swerving between lanes. According to the CHP press release, "The man driving the truck was not wearing his seatbelt and was ejected. He sustained fatal injuries and was pronounced deceased at the scene."

Wills was injured and had to spend several days in the hospital. He is home now, with fractured vertebrae, said his wife, Kelly. Eventually, he will return to work at the Riverside County Coroner's office. At home he has to wear a back brace and use a walker in the house.

But the commute will be much more difficult because as shown in the accompanying photo, his 14-year-old Honda was totaled. The couple's second vehicle is a 27-year-old truck.

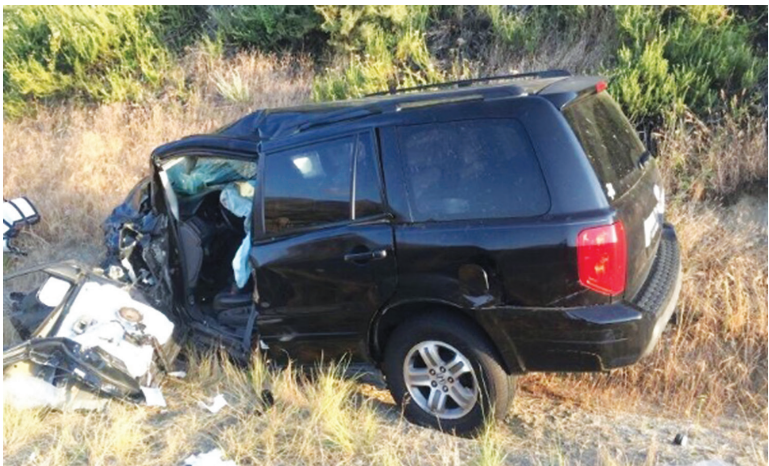
Kelly's mother, Debra Gooch, is trying to raise funds to help the couple replace the truck. The Go Fund site, <https://www.gofundme.com/wills-family-needs-help>, has a photo of Wills' Honda at the accident site.

"Kelly and Craig depended their vehicle to get him back and forth to work. Their only other vehicle is a 27 year-old truck. I am hoping to raise enough money for them to buy a dependable vehicle and help with money while Craig is home recovering," Gooch wrote in her story seeking help. "It will help a very special family get back on their feet."

Through Sunday, helpful and sympathetic friends have contributed about \$2,000 toward Gooch's goal of \$12,000.

In a grateful response to the help, Craig said in an email, "This is a miracle from God and we are overwhelmed by all the prayers, love, and support that we have received."

More and more, we in the newsroom at the TC have experienced an impediment to covering local students at Idyllwild School: parents or guardians.

Last week, one of our freelance photographers went to Open House at the school and took lots of photos. He turned in four photos of the school concert without getting names. JP forwarded them to the front office for identification. Of the six performers' photos taken that evening, we were not given names of four of the students.

Their parents had denied this request the school district provides at the beginning of the year:

“Granted Media Release — I give permission for my student to be interviewed, photographed, or filmed by members of the media or other agencies.”

No law currently exists in California denying journalists access to this information. And we realize that the front office must follow district rules and deny this information.

But, if we want to, we can get the names through another source, such as another parent. But we choose not to do so.

Primarily because we realize that some children may be endangered by having their names published in a newspaper — maybe because of a domestic violence issue or potential domestic abduction.

But it's difficult to believe four out of six children randomly photographed all are in such a situation.

What we don't think parents realize when they deny that school district — not media — release is that their kids don't get to appear in their local newspaper. They're denied the opportunity to be a student of the week. They're denied the opportunity to celebrate being published in the local newspaper.

That child is denied the opportunity to feel pride in being published in the local newspaper that thousands of people read, including fellow students.

After my mother passed away, we found a scrapbook full of newspaper clipping about her children, grandchildren and other family members. Newspaper clippings celebrate life.

The parents/guardians who deny media access probably post photos of their children on social media, such as Facebook, for all to see. A fleeting moment; nothing tangible to hold onto as precious as that indelible, eternal newsprint captured for all time.

What inevitably will occur sometime soon is that we will take a photo of a group of students, send it to the front office for identification and be told that a kid somewhere in the front row has a parent who denied publication. What do we do then? Photoshop out the image? No, that's not ethical. Then, do we discard the photo and deny all the other kids the opportunity to be published in their local newspaper? Yes, that's what we will have to do.

In essence, this is creating a chilling effect on our coverage of Idyllwild School. We will stop photographing the open houses, the school sports programs, the book sales, the smARTS events, the concerts, the plays, the barbecue days, back-to-school nights, Back to the Future nights, school dances, first day of school, etc., etc.

I put this out there to other newspaper editors this week and already, some of them have pulled away from local school coverage because of this issue.

Is this the age we live in now or is it just that parents/guardians don't know what they denied? I will be glad to continue this conversation with any of you, anonymously or not. Looking forward to it.

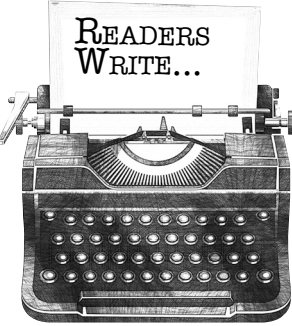

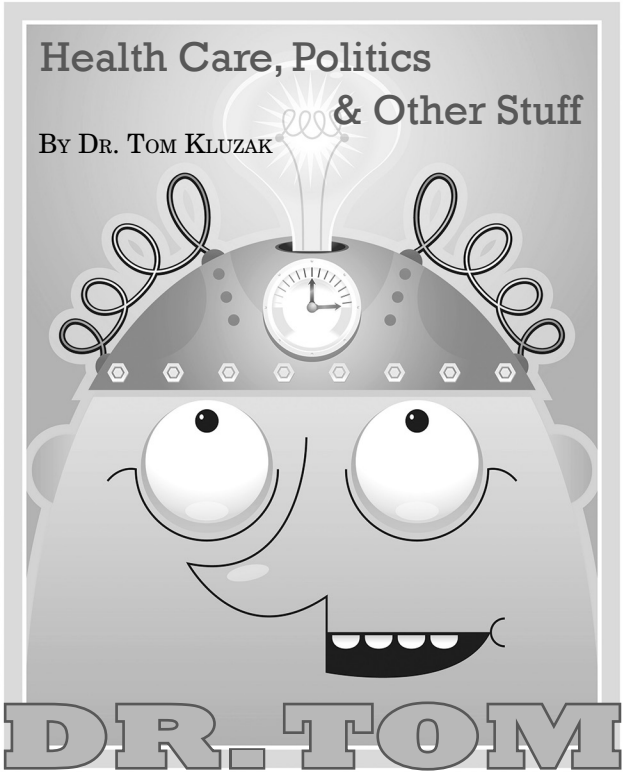
Speakers at next Idyllwild Indivisibles

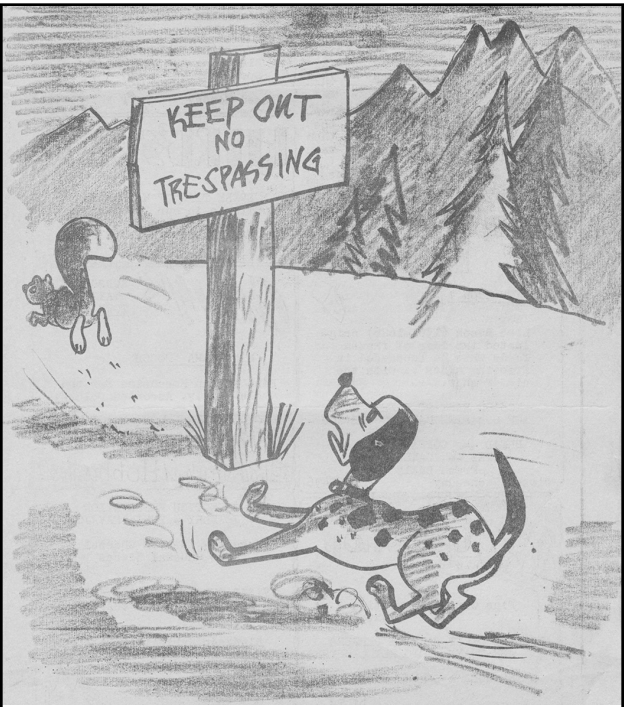

Which four entities opened in 1946?

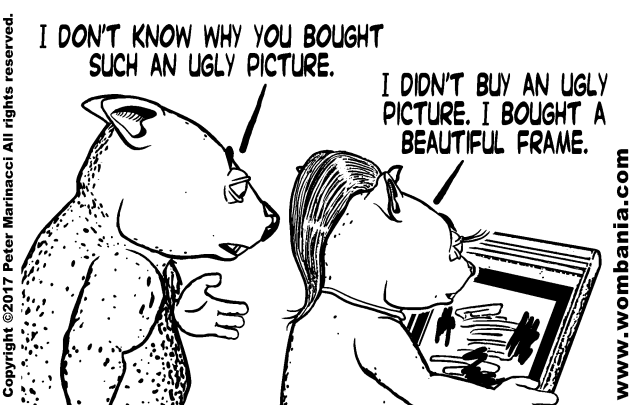

Washington was elected to a full four-year term last year.

After learning of Perez’s appointment, Stone said in a press release, “As a former Riverside County supervisor myself, I wish Manny Perez the best of luck in his new position and look forward to working with him to improve the quality of life for the residents of Riverside County.”

Perez replaces former Supervisor John Benoit who died in December. The term will expire in 2018, and challengers to Perez, if he decides to run for a full term, are already beginning to appear.

He joins the board just in time for the fiscal year 2017-18 budget decisions.

As an assemblyman from 2008 to 2014, Perez

represented the 80th District, which encompasses eastern Riverside County (Cathedral City to Blythe) and all of Imperial County.

With his Assembly term ending in 2014, Perez challenged Benoit for the supervisor’s seat, but Benoit was easily re-elected with 57 percent of the vote.

Perez grew up in the Coachella Valley. He earned his bachelor’s degree from the University of California, Riverside, and a Master of Education degree in administrative planning and social policy from the Harvard Graduate School of Education.

Perez was a high school teacher before being elected to the Coachella Valley Unified School District in 2004, which launched his political career.

19th century California trademarks

California Secretary of State Alex Padilla announced the release of nearly 4,000 digitized California trademark images and applications filed with the secretary of state between 1861 and 1900. These images and documents are the largest digital collection ever assembled by the State Archives, a division of the secretary of state’s office.

“This is our history and it should be shared,” said Padilla. “I encourage Californians to explore these images, which for the first time are easily accessible to the public online.”

File for tax refunds by Aug. 1

Owners of residential or business property in Riverside County have until Aug. 1 to file for unclaimed property tax refunds.

Board of Supervisors Chairman John F. Tavaglione and Treasurer-Tax Collector Don Kent issued the reminder to give taxpayers sufficient time to file for refunds and not be caught short by the deadline. Filing instructions and a list of all unclaimed property tax refunds from tax year 2012 and prior are available on the Treasurer-Tax Collector’s website at www.countytreasurer.org/TaxCollector/UnclaimedMoney/PropertyTaxUnclaimedRefund.aspx.

Kent said 575 refunds totaling \$586,728.78 remain unclaimed. Most refunds stem from valuation reductions by the assessor and are related to corrections or cancellations to the tax roll after taxes already had been paid. Under California law, property tax refunds unclaimed for four years after the payment date — or one year after a requested claim form has been mailed back to a taxpayer by the county, whichever is later — may be transferred to the county general fund by order of the supervisors. After Aug. 1, any unclaimed money shifts to the general fund and no longer can be claimed.

Casino makes world record

Under the watchful eye of Guinness Book of World Records Official Adjudicator Michael Empric, and the City of San Jacinto Mayor Scott Miller and his wife Linda, hundreds of patrons gathered in the Soboba Casino’s events arena in an attempt to officially break the Guinness World Record for the Largest Rubber Chicken Toss on April 29.

Guests received a numbered wristband and a rubber chicken. Once in the arena the guests were instructed to hold onto their rubber chicken until it was time to toss.

More 60 volunteers from the local Hemet Future Farmers of America acted as official stewards, monitoring the chickens being tossed within specified sections and ensuring each chicken was tossed at the sound of an air-horn. If the chicken was not tossed, the guest would be deducted from the total record count.

Once the horn sounded, the chicken tossing was underway. It took mere seconds for the featherless flock of rubber birds to come crashing down on the target area.

According to Empric, “We had enough people out there to break the record, but we had a large number of disqualifications. That is people who left, and people who didn’t throw their chickens. There was a total of 27 deductions. The number to beat was 999 chickens. I can now say that I have gone through the forms, reviewed the evidence, and today, at Soboba, we had 1,013 people toss, that’s a new world record!”

After the event, 20 winners were drawn to win \$450 in free slot play, and local Soboba guest John Brewster took the grand prize, a brand-new Nissan 370Z.

Governor’s May budget increases slightly from January

Concern over future revenue drop still paramount

Last week, Gov. Jerry Brown released his “May Revision” for the 2017-18 state budget. Changes from the January budget proposal were modest. As a result of a slight higher revenue forecast, Brown’s May budget proposal totals \$124 billion of state funds, which is \$1.5 billion more than the January submission.

Including special funds and bond revenue, the total budget is \$183.4 billion, or \$4 billion greater than January’s proposal.

While the state revenue forecast is \$2.5 billion greater than the January forecast, the total is \$3.3 billion less than the 2017-18 forecast made one year ago.

Brown directed the added funding to schools (about another \$1.1 billion), health services, child care and state pension liabilities.

While Brown is still proposing to shift

the funding for In-house Supportive Services to the counties, the May proposal recommends that the state provide \$400 million of the \$600 million cost. This would be a substantial benefit for the counties’ budgets.

Since January, Riverside County has been struggling to find another \$40 million to fund the program. This would reduce the county’s cost to about \$12 to \$14 million.

Brown has included a \$6 billion added payment to CalPERS for state pensions. This would reduce the state’s cost nearly \$11 billion over the next two decades, according to the budget report.

In presenting the revised budget, Brown emphasized that potential budget problems lurk on the horizon. The revenue growth is now in its eighth year, three years longer than the average economic expansion.

“A moderate recession will drop state revenues by about \$20 billion annually for several years,” the budget document states.

Also, action in the U.S. Congress to change the healthcare funding, such as

reducing Medicaid support to the states, could have a drastic effect on California’s budget in future years.

At the end of next fiscal year, the state’s reserves will be about \$10.1 billion, of which the “Rainy Day Fund” will total about \$8.5 billion and the discretionary reserves about \$1.6 billion. Total reserves are \$700 million greater than the January budget estimate and \$3.6 billion more than this year’s balance of \$6.7 billion.

In its preliminary review of the governor’s budget, the Legislative Analyst’s Office wrote, “These reserves will be a key tool for the Legislature as it prepares for the next economic downturn and federal actions that could significantly affect the state budget’s bottom line in future years. Facing these uncertainties, we would encourage the Legislature to set its total reserve level for 2017-18 at — or preferably above — the level the governor now proposes.”


Despite the wet winter, Brown’s budget for Cal Fire continues to recognize the damage done to state forests from pest and climate. The proposed budget for Cal

Fire includes funding for another 42 engines and the ability to staff engines and helibases for another month each spring. However, funding for drought responses was reduced \$115 million.

There also is more funding to repair the state’s park road system, bridges and water systems.

Thursday afternoon, state Sen. Jeff Stone commented on Brown’s May revision. “As the governor said, we’ve spent billions of dollars on anti-poverty programs, but still one in four children go to bed hungry every night. At some point, you have to ask, what are the Democrats spending money on? Why hasn’t the billions already spent reduced the growth of poverty in California? Well, the answer is pretty simple — they’re misspending taxpayer dollars on things like a billion dollar boondoggle known as highspeed rail. They’re spending tax dollars on pay raises for public employees — and many of those employees work for a department where they have nothing to do.”

in the future. We’re seeking help from the entire community. We need to terrace the land and have a paved driveway access. It’s an evolutionary process.”

The Young Idyllwild board is looking for sponsors to help fund costs of planter boxes, a green house, garden tools, systems to collect rain water, trellis planters and top soil.

The board plans to sell some produce once the garden is up and running to help fund ongoing infrastructure development, but the majority will be donated to the HELP Center. “Our main produce will be

organic, which we’ll donate to the HELP Center to be distributed through their voucher system,” said Wilson.

The board is asking local restaurants and others to donate their green waste for composting. “We will supply 5-gallon buckets to collect the waste.”

A portrait of the artist as a young man

"The object of the artist is the creation of the beautiful. What the beautiful is is another question." James Joyce, "A Portrait of the Artist as a Young Man."

In talking with Idyllwild Art Academy senior Quincy Ryan, one is struck by his brooding restlessness and his struggle of coming to grips with philosophical contradictions — of finding his unique voice and identity through rigorous introspection and self-examination. It was surprising to find a young man working through existential issues that many older people never choose to examine or consider.

Quincy remembered an early such encounter. He recounted being 10 and going to the dentist. "I thought at the time that pain was a state of mind, that it was not really real," he said. He noted the realization allowed him to work to remove the pain — to actively affect what was affecting him.

"My family was kind of alternative," said Quincy (probably named after Quincy Jones, with whom his father Bruce Ryan has worked). "I was always surrounded by artists. I was a very emotional kid, more than most. At a very young age, I learned to respect my emotions. By being guarded it made me less vulnerable to what was going on around me and led to some detachment issues."

Quincy remembered his first year, as a sophomore jazz music student, at IAA. "When I first came to Idyllwild Arts, I was

nervous and a little shut off," he said. "But though the study of humanities, I began to see the importance of a narrative. Music is abstract but also overt. It is kinetic and manipulates energy and transfers that energy directly to an audience by putting out an emotion, such as anger or happiness."

"But music can be more complex, when there is a narrative, a way to contextualize it and give it more meaning — where the mood of the music is tied to a message."

"I thought I wanted to become a virtuosic performer. Now I understand I want to be something more — I want to be a creator, an artist."

"Understanding literature as an art form,

something less abstract than music, has helped me know who I am and what I need to be doing. It's opened my creative and emotional personality."

Quincy credits IAA Jazz Director Marshall Hawkins with helping to break his early shell so that he could be more open to grow and experiment. "He told me to relax and be more spiritually involved," Quincy remembered. "I am so lucky to have had such academic and artistic stimulation here at Idyllwild Arts."

He remembered a seminal moment in freeing up his mind and musical taste. "When I first came here, my musical tastes were primarily metal," he said. "Everything had to be compressed, loud and intense. But later — I was

on a hike with Daniel Gray [faculty] and listening to acoustic music — David Lang 'Death Speaks.' Now I listen to jazz, to modernist classical, to whatever. I don't shut out any genres. My taste lies in music that has the most intention and the most attention to detail."

This year, Quincy has been part of the winning IAA jazz combos at both the Berklee High School Jazz Festival in Boston and the Reno Jazz Festival in Reno.

After graduation, Quincy will attend Cal Arts in Valencia, with a focus on composition — to expand, as he says, his artistic palette. "I'm not ready yet to reject anything. I'm trying to find a place for everything. My political philosophy is, I don't assume I know anything. I'm trying to navigate and understand what to move toward."

"My goal going forward is to get the richest and most diverse experience I can have, and to be the best artist and happiest person I can be."

Quincy will be in the composer/performer program at Cal Arts. "I'll be shifting towards composition — sitting down with a score and working things out."

Quincy talks a lot about navigating forward — finding channels to move through and working things out. His intense introspection and evolutionary journey are reminiscent of Stephen Dedalus in James Joyce's "Portrait of the Artist." It will be interesting to see the choices he makes.

Brendan Steele fired a 4-under-par 33-35 — 68 Sunday to tie for sixth at The Players Championship in Ponte Vedra Beach, Florida. His 72-hole score was 69-71-75-

68 — 283 to finish 5-under-par, five strokes behind the winner, but only two shots out of second place.

The Idyllwild native found more than 69 percent of the fairways with drives averaging 288 yards, and he hit 68 percent of the greens in reg-

ulation. He gained more than a stroke and a half against the field with his putter.

This was Brendan's seventh top-20 finish in 15 starts this season, including four top-10s and a win, and he's made the cut in every singles tournament he entered.

His performance at The Players boosted him into ninth place on the FedExCup points list. He now stands 52nd in the Official World Golf Ranking. Brendan will take this week off.
