Wrong way runners, car chase ...

But all for a good cause

Race day, Saturday, June 10, Idyllwild at 7 a.m.: Runners and fitness walkers mill around seeking patches of sunlight. Temperatures are in the 40s, about to break 50 degrees. Brilliant light heralds a perfect day for the Idyllwild 5k/10k and Fitness Walk. Completing the picture is Dr. Chip Schelly on the microphone, doing his standup shtick of kidding the crowd.

Local Jayden Emerson, 20, expected to win both the 5k and 10k, brought a friend from Beaumont who had never run the course before, Jacob Boatman, also 20. Emerson decided to run the 10k and Jacob the 5k. "Jayden had said he had shown his friend the course," said Chip.

So with the sun breaking, and a 5-minute warning sounded, Chip began kidding Boatman who was wearing red, white and blue American flag shorts.

"Hey all you runners, just follow this guy in the red, white and blue shorts, and it'll all be good."

And they did. At least half of the assembled 5k runners followed Boatman. The problem became that Boatman did not turn right to pass between the Fort and JoAn's, which was the correct course. He kept going straight past Suburban Propane toward the Shell station then turned left on Highway 243 with half the runners following behind him. At this point, the Mountain Community Patrol car gave chase attempting to

catch and redirect the errant runners. It was like a Mack Sennett silent movie, complete with a comical music soundtrack.

When the Boatman group turned right on Delano, MCP managed to halt them at the dead end, and directed them to turn around. "They [MCP] said their odometer read about 3 miles when they got back from their chase" said

Chip, "so it should have evened out." Five kilometers is 3.1 miles.

This is not a qualifying race and most of the runners took it in good stride, since the purpose of the race is to raise money for Idyllwild School physical education.

Newlyweds Bill and Melissa Whitman finished first in their respective age groups. The Gnomettes,

a five-woman team all of whom work at the Gastrognome — Kendra Wines, Brianna Ziegler, Tara Wilson, Amanda Tell and Laura Klingaman — finished together as rules required and donated their winnings to Idyllwild School.

It was a good day — an only-in-Idyllwild day.

Library to get new 3D printer and accessories

Pine Cove Property Owners Association is major funder

Three-dimensional printing is the rage, especially at the Idyllwild Library. "It's cutting edge and it's here," said Shannon Ng, branch library manager. "So many people are interested in it, both young and older patrons of the library. With 3D printing [also called additive manufacturing] you can print food, jewelry with gold and [human] hearts [using bio-printing processes]. There are thousands of jobs opening in this new technology.

"And what better place is there to learn about this new technology than at a library? And it's free. This is life-long learning at its best and has been one of my huge goals as an educator," she said. 3D printing is being used in tool, clothing, food, car, truck and aircraft design and production, and new uses are constantly being explored.

Ng said it takes a town such as Idyllwild, with many people interested in learning, to appreciate and be open to new technology. "There's an

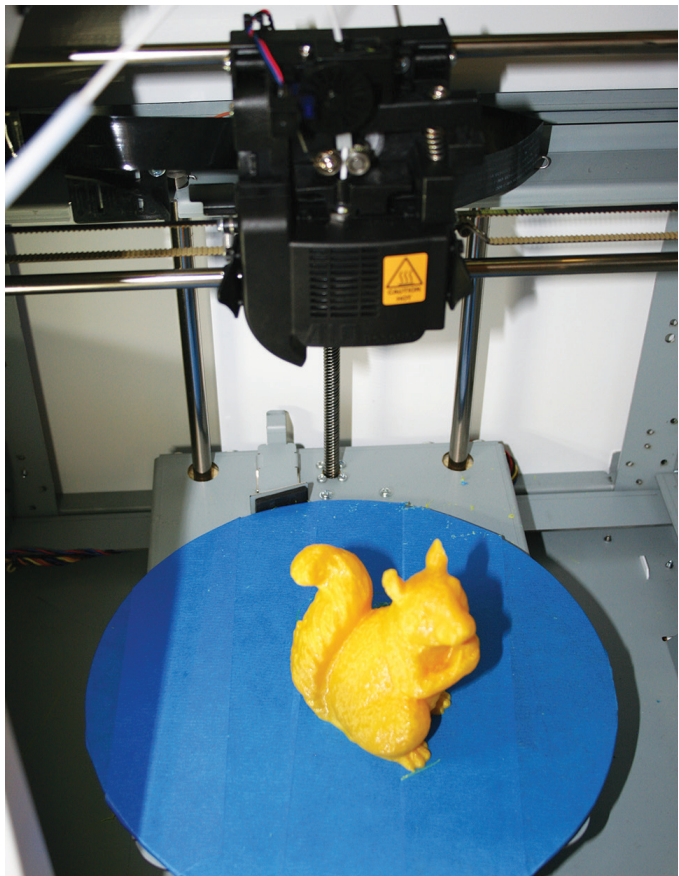
open-mindedness here and a willingness to try something different. It's like a college town in that respect." Ng noted it's even more impressive that local nonprofits step up to fund this technology for public use at the library.

Altogether, the printer and accessories price out at nearly \$5,000, according to Ng. The Pine Cove Property Owners Association has pledged \$3,000, the Rotary International of Idyllwild \$500, and several other organizations, including Idyllwild Association of Realtors, Soroptimists International of Idyllwild and Friends of the Idyllwild Library are planning to contribute.

In addition to the printer, the library project includes purchasing hand-held microscopes that transmit images to a computer screen to help illustrate the object to be printed, a scanner and two laptops to assist with programming.

"It's all about exploration," said Ng. "There are tons of potentials for education in this technology."

# Fire Safe Council has new project manager

## Pete Coy replaces Pat Boss

Pete Coy, longtime U.S. Forest Service supervisory forestry technician and Hotshot Crew superintendent replaced Pat Boss as project manager of the nonprofit Mountain Communities Fire Safe Council.

Coy recently retired from the Forest Service and takes charge of MCFSC's primary responsibility of educating the local public about fire-abatement practices that can save their homes in the event of a wildland fire.

Boss, who has lived in Idyllwild since age 2, has served as MCFSC project manager for more than 10

years. Boss commented that his tenure has given him enormous satisfaction in providing opportunities to Hill residents to use MCFSC services, including property tree thinning and abatement, and grant-funded replacement of shake roofs. "I feel very good about what I've done and what our agency has been able to accomplish," said Boss.

Coy, who has lived in Idyllwild for 36 years, said he already is involved in getting up to speed with MCFSC projects and plans. "I enjoy the field position," said Coy, "walking residents' properties, educating them on hazard abatement and how fire affects an environment." He noted the importance of abating grasses, removing lower tree limbs to prevent ground fire from getting into tree canopies, removing stacked firewood from being too close to a

home and tarping it, and encasing eaves so embers cannot get under them and cause fire to spread.

"When fire threatens, your house has to protect itself," he reminded readers. "You can't count on having a fire truck being parked in your driveway

when there is a fire. And fire season is year-round. Abate your property before June 1 each year and then keep grass cleared as the summer progresses. Abatement is ongoing."

## Grinding facility open Mondays

The Idyllwild grinding facility resumed Monday operations effective May 1. The facility is open from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Mondays, Wednesdays and Friday, from May 1 through Nov. 29, 2017. (It is closed from noon to 1 p.m. for lunch.)

The facility will then close again on Mondays during the winter months (December through April) due to low tonnage volumes and customer participation.

The grinding facility accepts wood waste affected by the bark beetle. Prohibited waste includes household waste, appliances, e-waste, metals, tires and other hazardous, explosive and medical wastes. Customers who use the facility pay a per-ton rate on pre-paid accounts.

Fire chief closes hiking areas for wildfire reasons

(This story is taken from a Riverside County press release.)  
Cal Fire/Riverside County Fire Chief John R. Hawkins received approval from the Riverside County Board of Supervisors to close seven hazardous fire areas throughout the region on June 6.  
The closures will remain in effect until further notice in the following areas:  
• Avery Canyon (Gibbel Road east of State Street in Hemet)  
• North Mountain and Indian Canyon (San Jacinto area)  
• Whitewater Canyon (Cabazon, north of Palm Springs)  
• Nuevo/Lakeview (east of Menifee Road and San Jacinto Avenue)  
• Minto (Sage)  
• Reinhardt Canyon (north of Highway 74 and California Avenue in Hemet)  
• Ramona Bowl and Bautista Canyon (southeast Hemet)  
Riverside County Ordinance 787.8 restricts public access to these identified hazardous fire areas unless private property access is required. Public roadway travel is permitted; providing travel is confined to those roadway surfaces within hazardous fire areas. Those violating the ordinance may be subject to a minimum fine of \$100 for first-time offenses.  
Future closures may be implemented based on weather conditions, fuel moisture and increased wildland fire threat. Idyllwild Dog Park dedicated in Rick Barker's honor

Rick Barker, much-loved Idyllwild author and community volunteer, served on the Idyllwild Community Center board and was an advocate for the Idyllwild Dog Park, now under ICC management.  
Preston Sparks, local actor, craftsman and community volunteer, recently installed a memorial bench he created to honor Barker, who died this year on Jan. 20. Sparks said that while he was crafting the bench, there were moments when he strongly felt Barker's presence. "I got a chill, the hair was standing up on my neck," said Sparks. "He was there." Sparks carved the sign naming the park as a living memorial in Barker's honor.  
He also carved the bench near Higher Grounds honoring Pete "Pedro" Anderson. "I just want to make sure they're not forgotten," said Sparks. "Both were

such gentle men."  
Barker and his dog Stavro were frequent visitors to the park. He volunteered his time for ICC as part of his commitment and connection to Idyllwild and its people.  
In January 2016, Barker was interviewed prior to speaking as part of the ICC Speaker Series. He talked in the interview about the importance of connecting with others and finding common ground. "If I focus on the differences in another's story, that can be distancing," he said. "But if I choose to focus on what we share, that can promote a sense of connection."  
Barker shared his vision for a more hospitable world and evolved social structure in his writing and in his volunteer activities. "None of our global problems will be solved from the top down," Barker said. "Meaningful social change can only happen from the bottom up so that people feel more

connection and more commonality."

I only participated in the 5k/10k race once and that was years ago. I did the 5k walk and actually managed not to come in last. I still keep my number from that year hanging on my softball glove, an item with little wear even after three seasons. That’s the athlete I am.

Every year, I consider preparing myself for the walk and signing up again. But I don’t. This year was no exception, though from what I read in Marshall’s story, I think it would have been a blast. What a Keystone Kops moment with Mountain Community Patrol chasing down the wayward 5kers and redirecting them back to the finish line. What a kick.

My Navy son’s birthday happened last week so we took his kids to him last weekend for some family fun time. Saturday we spent at the San Diego Natural History Museum, managing to walk 2.8 miles, and up or down five floors (according to my iPhone) visiting the bones of ancient dinosaurs.

My grandson is a sponge, like many kids, for dinosaur information. He walks the halls telling me all he knows about each animal and then soaks up whatever new information he gathers from the graphs, signs and other details provided.

After leaving, we took the kids to the Balboa Park carousel. My son encouraged me to take a ride, too, so I climbed up onto an inside ostrich, strapped myself in and hung on tight. It was surprising how fast the carousel spun and with the ostrich gyrating up and down, the ride required me to keep a tight grip.

I can honestly say I can go the rest of my life without riding a carousel again. Back on flat ground, I felt a bit dizzy and queasy inside my guts, but probably no worse than I would have felt after the 5k walk. Either way, at the end of the day, walking always gives me a great sense of accomplishment not being an athlete.

At dinner, the five of us tossed around ideas for the following day that had earlier leaned toward a SD Padres vs. KC Royals afternoon game. In the end, we decided on the SD Zoo and to invite the two grandchildren who live in SD. Their parents came, too, so nine of us met up at the zoo entrance and headed in.

Up until noon when the four of them had to leave, interpreting the zoo map and herding and pleasing nine people, including four children, proved a challenge. But we succeeded.

After they left, we found ourselves at a small comedy act learning about koala bears and other zoo animals. My grandson volunteered for an act in front of the audience and surprised us all by taking the dare of eating a meal worm. “It was actually tasty,” he said, but not as tasty as fried mozzarella, he said later.

But why invite danger to them, to our pets, and to our residents by encouraging deer, and inevitably those who stalk them, to come into our yards? Just sayin’.

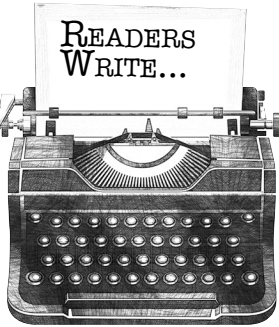

Bob Krone’s 50-year reflections on the Associates

*Editor’s note: In celebration of the Associates of Idyllwild Arts Foundation’s 50th anniversary, Bob Krone, son of Idyllwild School of Music and the Arts (now Idyllwild Arts) founders Max and Bee Krone, wrote this article.*

Max and Bee Krone retired from ISOMATA leadership in the summer of 1967, 22 years after they created the Idyllwild Arts Foundation and 17 years after the first Summer Program in 1950. Ray and Virginia Garner, professional filmmakers, had moved to Idyllwild in the late 1950s. They had been part of the small staff that had run ISOMATA through its first two decades.

Ray gave Max and Bee his idea to create a volunteer support group in 1967 and they endorsed the idea at their retirement party that summer. Ray became the first president of the ISOMATA Associates. Membership was a mix of ISOMATA faculty and staff, and Idyllwild residents who wanted to take an active role in the school’s activities.

As far as I can determine, I am the sole survivor of the 1950 first ISOMATA summer who also was present at the 1967 beginning of the Associates.

For 50 years now, the Associates have been a critically important group for the continuous building of ISOMATA/IA to its current rating as one of the top-quality in-resident music and arts schools in the world. It helped perpetuate “The Essence of Idyllwild Arts” that leadership has steadfastly maintained.

At one point in the school’s history, the Associates saved the school when it could have become a failure. That was the early 1980s period when the IAF leader-

ship came to the conclusion that the University of Southern California management of its Idyllwild Campus was preventing desired growth. Max had astutely included in that 1967 agreement with USC that if either side became dissatisfied with the partnership, USC would, before taking any other action, offer the campus back to IAF.

That happened in 1985. Bill Lowman then became the new director. The USC-IAF partnership ended and IAF became fully responsible. Max had passed in June 1970. Bee Krone was very worried that resources would not be available for IAF to successfully make the change. Foundation members and the Associates stepped forward and the transition was successful.

Salena and I congratulate the current Associates leadership and all its membership for making “The Impossible Dream” a continuing, and improving, reality.

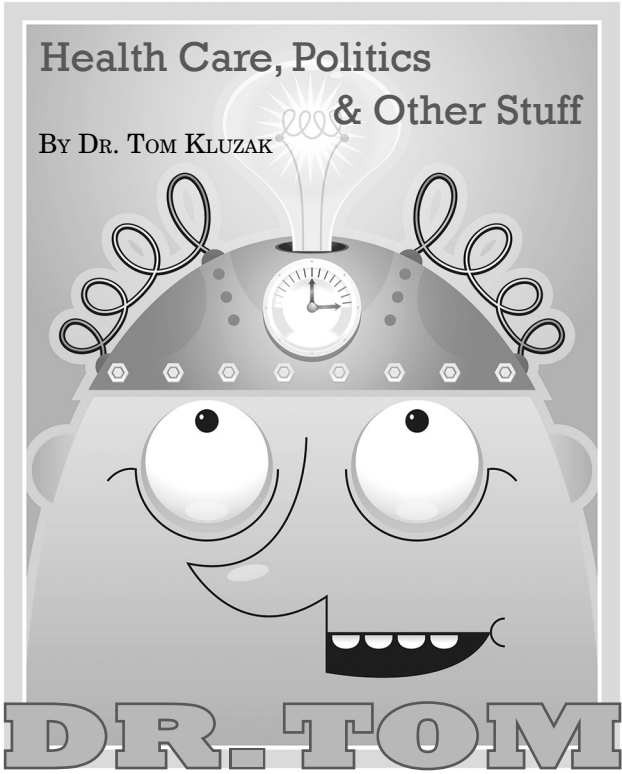

If you follow this column, then you'll know that the last couple of articles have dealt with darker topics. So, to quote a phrase: "And now for something completely different." The clean, healthful home.

Using time-honored, homemade cleaning recipes can be inexpensive and healthy. It may require a bit more time and effort but could be worth it in the long run.

Fresno Metro Ministries (see first website above) has created a lovely page replete with recipes for every cleaning need in the everyday home. Below is a sampling.

**Kitchen:** To make an all-purpose cleaner, in a glass jar with spray nozzle, create a mix of 50-percent white vinegar; and 50-percent water with 20 to 30 drops of essential oil such as orange, lemon, peppermint or eucalyptus. The use of essential oils can create a pleasant customized aroma that is often not toxic to those with allergies and has the added benefit of not spoiling the fresh air between you and your neighbors. (By the way, do not mix vinegar and chlorine: toxic.)

For a heavy-duty version of a kitchen cleanser, try 1 teaspoon borax mixed with 4 cups of warm water, and add a squeeze of lemon juice.

A great scouring powder is made by combining borax, salt and baking soda. (Never ingest the borax).

For dishwashing liquid, use simple, pure, liquid soap, and add lemon juice directly to the water to cut grease. (See second link above for an easy recipe for homemade pure liquid soap. Note her use of inexpensive vegetable-bar soap.)

**Bathroom:** For the toilet bowl, sprinkle the bowl with baking soda, then drizzle white vinegar and leave it to soak for 30 minutes before scrubbing with your usual brush. Soaking makes the scrubbing go easier so be sure to include this step.

**Laundry:** Using a humble cheese grater, grate enough natural soap flakes (use pure, vegetable-bar soap for this) to fill one cup; combine with 1/2 cup each of baking soda and borax. Store in a glass container. Use 1 tablespoon for a normal load and double that for really dirty clothes. This can be used in warm- or cold-water washes.

For brightening, add 1/2 cup of borax separate from, but alongside, the laundry soap to the wash. Borax is quite useful and not costly. To cut any soap scum, add white vinegar to the final rinse. (Remember, don't use it with bleach.) On the other hand, you can add 1/4- to 1/2-cup of baking soda to this same rinse to soften fabrics.

**Furniture polish:** An easy mix of two parts vegetable oil with one part lemon juice will do the trick.

**Foul-smelling trash cans:** Sprinkle borax or baking soda into the bottoms of the cans.

**Funky-smelling rugs:** Sprinkle baking soda over the dry carpet; let it sit preferably overnight, then vacuum. Enjoy and explore.

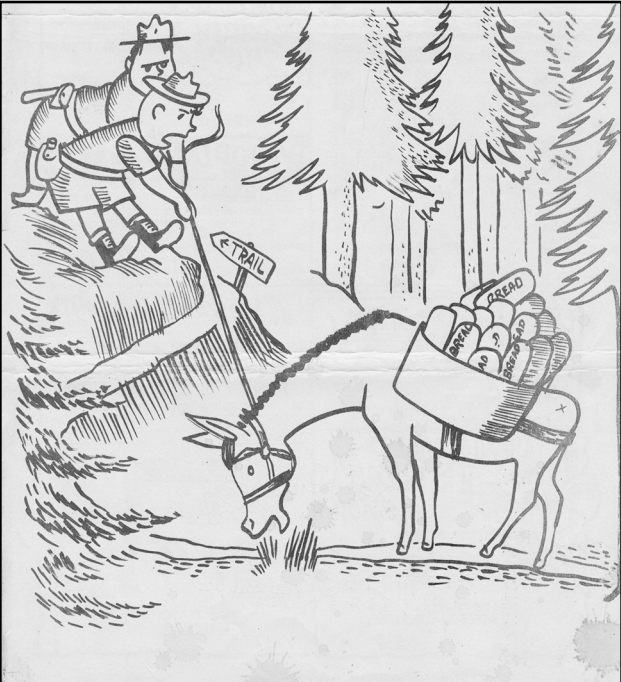

# Two motorcycle crashes on Hill roads last week

## One fatality

The California Highway Patrol San Geronio Pass Station reported two motorcycle crashes on Hill roads over the last week, one resulting in a fatality of a locally employed man.

At about 7:40 a.m. Thursday, June 8, Frederick Carlson, 53, of Hemet, was riding his 2014 Victory motorcycle northbound on Highway 243 about 250 feet south of Marian View Drive. As he rounded the curve approaching town, he lost control of his bike for unknown reasons. He was thrown onto the roadway and suffered severe injuries resulting in death.

The incident was reported at 7:45 a.m. Cal Fire, California Highway Patrol and Idyllwild Fire responded to the scene. A Riverside County coroner was dispatched at 8:31 a.m. and arrived at 9:41 a.m.

Carlson was wearing a regulation helmet, according to Darren Meyer, CHP public information officer. Idyllwild Garage owner Steve Friemoth confirmed Carlson had been employed at the garage for the past six months.

Alcohol and/or drugs have not yet been ruled out as causative factors.

Highway 243 was entirely closed in both directions for about three hours from just south of Marian View Drive to lower Saunders Meadow Road. Traffic in both directions was detoured along Saunders Meadow Road from near the transfer station to Idyllwild School. CHP cleared the scene at 10:44 a.m.

At 10:45 a.m. Sunday, June 11, Jason Anthony Nye, 40, of Laguna Beach, was riding his 2009 Ducati motorcycle eastbound on Highway 74, 150 feet east of McCall Park Road when he ran off the road. Nye suffered minor injuries, a broken right middle finger, and was transported by American Medical Response to Hemet Valley Medical Center in Hemet. No other vehicles were involved in the crash.

**65 years ago - 1952**  
MGM was filming “Desperate Search” around Lake Hemet, starring Jane Greer, Howard Keel and Keenan Wynn. The company headquartered at the Idyllwild Inn.

**60 years ago - 1957**  
Camping limits were put on state and county campgrounds in Idyllwild due to the increasing number of visitors.



The Rev. **Sharon Hudson**, regional support coordinator of the **Centers for Spiritual Living**, will be coming to Idyllwild on Sunday, June 25, for the ordination of the Rev. **Helen Henderson**.

Before becoming eligible for ordination, Henderson had to complete at least 6,000 hours of active service as a licensed minster and pass a review by a panel of other ordained ministers. Unlike other denominations, the Centers for Spiritual Living does not ordain its ministers upon graduation from seminary or ministerial school, but instead, allows ministers to work in the field before they fully commit their lives to ministry.

For Henderson, ordination then becomes the public acknowledgement of her commitment to the church and is one of the most important moments in her life.

Hudson, of Poway, will officially administer the vows of ordination. Other ordained ministers from Southern California also will be participating in this celebration.

**55 years ago - 1962**  
Idyllwild voted in favor of school bonds, but the issue didn't pass, regardless. About 85 percent of the registered voters on the Hill turned out for the elections. Nixon received 222 votes for governor, Brown followed with 115.

**50 years ago - 1967**  
County supervisors voted to ban burning in the county except by special permit.

**45 years ago - 1972**  
George McGovern, Clayton Record, Craig Biddle and Don Kenny led the race in Riverside County voting in the primary election. Eighteen-year-olds voted for the first time.

**40 years ago - 1977**  
The San Jacinto Mountain Area Water Study Agency was told that raw water counts at the Idyllwild intake of Strawberry Creek indicated that human waste exceeded the acceptable level. That was one of the preliminary facts revealed by Peter Poutney, project engineer from Hirsch & Co., the San Diego-based firm that studied mountain wastewater treatment.

Doug Hamilton and Richard Montano, both of Idyllwild, worked independently and together to try to save a disintegrating film of the mountain community's early days. The silent movie of Idyllwild in the 1920s was dying of old age since it was printed on nitrate film stock.

**35 years ago - 1982**  
A 63-year-old Korean woman died from heart failure triggered by snake-venom poisoning she received while walking near Lake Alandale. It was believed she was bitten by a Western rattlesnake.

**30 years ago - 1987**  
An appeal to use the old fire station building in Idyllwild for commercial uses was rejected by the Riverside County Planning Commission because of inadequate

## Two earthquakes in two days felt on Hill

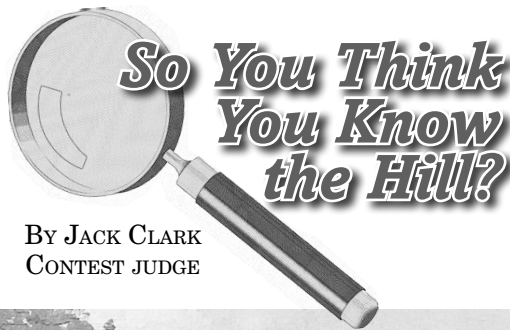

Two 3.2-magnitude earthquakes, one early Wednesday morning and the second early Friday morning, were felt on the Hill.

The epicenter of the first quake was 3.1 miles southwest of Cabazon and occurred at 12:12 a.m. Wednesday, June 7. The second was 8 miles south of Idyllwild and was felt locally at 2:24 a.m. Friday, June 9.

These are preliminary magnitudes but anything under 4 magnitude is considered a minor quake, according to 24 Hour Earthquakes Report.

Starting in 2008, he began to reestablish his landscaping business in Idyllwild. "Eva was always a part of what I did," Kenny acknowledged. "Her advice and her eye for color and materials were always important."



Kenny credits his growing up in Mexico and in Idyllwild with his intuitive approach to design. "Through all my career I've never drawn a plan. I've learned the simplicity of life, the patience of waiting for and seeing the design approach," he said. "And most important for me has been the drive to have a partner and a family. That is everything. I give till it's gone."

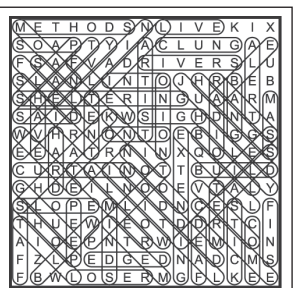



**Checking for ID theft of a child**

The Federal Trade Commission advises: Any parent or guardian of a child knows the milestones that come with turning 16 – learning to drive, maybe dating, or thinking about college. But now, there's one more: checking their credit report.


But my kids don't have a credit card, house or car. Why should I check their credit report?

Because somebody else could be using your child's personal information. Once a child's — or anyone's — Social Security number is stolen, it can be used by identity thieves.

Checking to see if your child has a credit history, and then thoroughly reviewing it when they turn 16, can help you spot signs of identity theft. If you find false or inaccurate information, you'll have time to correct it before your child applies for a job, a loan for college or a car, or tries to get a credit card or a place to live.

Generally, children won't have credit reports unless someone is using their information for fraud.

What if my child has a credit report with incorrect or false information? Visit [IdentityTheft.gov/child](http://IdentityTheft.gov/child) to report the problem and follow the steps outlined to resolve it.




