Library to get new 3D printer and accessories

Pine Cove Property Owners Association is major funder

Three-dimensional printing is the rage, especially at the Idyllwild Library. "It's cutting edge and it's here," said Shannon Ng, branch library manager. "So many people are interested in it, both young and older patrons of the library. With 3D printing [also called additive manufacturing] you can print food, jewelry with gold and [human] hearts [using bio-printing processes]. There are thousands of jobs opening in this new technology.

"And what better place is there to learn about this new technology than at a library? And it's free. This is lifelong learning at its best and has been one of my huge goals as an educator," she said. 3D printing is being used in tool, clothing, food, car, truck and aircraft design and production, and new uses are constantly being explored.


Ng said it takes a town such as Idyllwild, with many people interested in learning, to appreciate and be open to new technology. "There's an open-mindedness here and a willingness to try something different. It's like a college town in that respect." Ng noted it's even more impressive that local nonprofits step up to fund this technology for public use at the library.

Altogether, the printer and accessories price out at nearly \$5,000, according to Ng. The Pine Cove Property Owners Association has pledged \$3,000, the Rotary International of Idyllwild \$500, and several other organizations, including Idyllwild Association of Realtors, Soroptimists International of Idyllwild and Friends of the Idyllwild Library are planning to contribute.

In addition to the printer, the library project includes purchasing hand-held microscopes that transmit images to a computer screen to help illustrate the object to be printed, a scanner and two laptops to assist with programming.

"It's all about exploration," said Ng. "There are tons of potentials for education in this technology."







Grinding facility open Mondays
The Idyllwild grinding facility resumed Monday operations effective May 1. The facility is open from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Mondays, Wednesdays and Friday, from May 1 through Nov. 29, 2017. (It is closed from noon to 1 p.m. for lunch.)

The facility will then close again on Mondays during the winter months (December through April) due to low

tonnage volumes and customer participation. The grinding facility accepts wood waste affected by the bark beetle. Prohibited waste includes household waste, appliances, e-waste, metals, tires and other hazardous, explosive and medical wastes. Customers who use the facility pay a per-ton rate on pre-paid accounts.

Pete Coy replaces Pat Boss

Pete Coy, longtime U.S. Forest Service supervisory forestry technician and Hotshot Crew superintendent replaced Pat Boss as project manager of the nonprofit Mountain Communities Fire Safe Coun-

Coy recently retired from the Forest Service and takes charge of MCFSC's primary responsibility of educating the local public about fire-abatement practices that can save their homes in the event of a wildland

Boss, who has lived in Idyllwild since age 2, has served as MCFSC project manager for more than 10

years. Boss commented that his tenure has given him enormous satisfaction in providing opportunities to Hill residents to use MCFSC services, including property tree thinning and abatement, and grant-funded replacement of shake roofs. "I feel very good about what I've done and what our agency has been able to accomplish," said Boss.

Coy, who has lived in Idyllwild for 36 years, said he already is involved in getting up to speed with MCFSC projects and plans. "I enjoy the field position," said Coy, "walking residents' properties, edabatement and how fire affects an environment." He noted the importance of abating grasses, removing lower tree limbs to pre-

Fire chief closes hiking areas for wildfire reasons

(This story is taken from a Riverside County press release.) Cal Fire/Riverside County Fire Chief John R. Hawkins received approval from the Riverside County Board of Supervisors to close seven hazardous fire areas throughout the region on June 6.

The closures will remain in effect until further notice in the following areas:

- Avery Canyon (Gibbel Road east of State Street in • North Mountain and Indian Canvon (San Jacinto area)
- Whitewater Canyon (Cabazon, north of Palm Springs) Nuevo/Lakeview (east of Menifee Road and San
- Jacinto Avenue)
- Minto (Sage) • Reinhardt Canyon (north of Highway 74 and California Avenue in Hemet)
- Ramona Bowl and Bautista Canyon (southeast Hemet) Riverside County Ordinance 787.8 restricts public access to these identified hazardous fire areas unless private property access is required. Public roadway travel is permitted; providing travel is confined to those roadway surfaces within hazardous fire areas. Those violating the ordinance may be subject to a minimum fine of \$100 for first-time offenses.

Future closures may be implemented based on weather conditions, fuel moisture and increased wildland fire threat. Maps for each of the affected areas can be located at www. rvcfire.org. Rick Barker, muchloved Idyllwild author and community volunteer, served on the Idyllwild Community Center board and was an advocate for the Idyllwild Dog Park, now under ICC management.

Preston Sparks, local actor, craftsman and community volunteer, recently installed a memorial bench he created to honor Barker, who died this year on Jan. 20. Sparks said that while he was crafting the bench, there were moments when he strongly felt Barker's presence. "I got a chill, the hair was standing up on my neck," said Sparks. "He was there." Sparks carved the sign naming the park as a living memorial in Barker's honor.


He also carved the near Higher Grounds honoring Pete "Pedro" Anderson. "I just want to make sure they're not forgotten," said Sparks. "Both were

Barker shared his vision for a more hospitable world and evolved social structure in his writing and in his volunteer activities. "None of our global problems will be solved from the top down," Barker said. "Meaningful social change can only happen from the bottom up so that people feel more

Leemhuis extradited on felony charges

Joseph Leemhuis, 39, of Idyllwild, arrested in Idyllwild on April 14, 2017, on suspicion of possession for sale of marijuana, was extradited to Ramsey County, Minnesota, on a "no bail" warrant for felony fraud.

According to Darren Meyer, California Highway Patrol public information officer, a tip led to Leemhuis' arrest in Idyllwild. The tip said Leemhuis was staying at a particular residence.

When Riverside County Sheriff's deputies arrived at the residence, Meyer said Leemhuis fled into the forest. Deputies located him and arrested him on two felony warrants. He was held in Riverside County until his extradition to Minnesota on May 10.

My Navy son's birthday happened last week so we took his kids to him last weekend for some family fun time. Saturday we spent at the San Diego Natural History Museum, managing to walk 2.8 miles, and up or down five floors (according to my iPhone) visiting the bones of ancient dinosaurs.

My grandson is a sponge, like many kids, for dinosaur information. He walks the halls telling me all he knows about each animal and then soaks up whatever new information he gathers from the graphs, signs and other details provided.

After leaving, we took the kids to the Balboa Park carousel. My son encouraged me to take a ride, too, so I climbed up onto an inside ostrich, strapped myself in and hung on tight. It was surprising how fast the carousel spun and with the ostrich gyrating up and down, the ride required me to keep a tight grip.

I can honestly say I can go the rest of my life without riding a carousel again. Back on flat ground, I felt a bit dizzy and queasy inside my guts, but probably no worse than I would have felt after the 5k walk. Either way, at the end of the day, walking always gives me a great sense of accomplishment not being an athlete.

At dinner, the five of us tossed around ideas for the following day that had earlier leaned toward a SD Padres vs. KC Royals afternoon game. In the end, we decided on the SD Zoo and to invite the two grandchildren who live in SD. Their parents came, too, so nine of us met up at the zoo entrance and headed in.

Up until noon when the four of them had to leave, interpreting the zoo map and herding and pleasing nine people, including four children, proved a challenge. But we succeeded.

After they left, we found ourselves at a small comedy act learning about koala bears and other zoo animals. My grandson volunteered for an act in front of the audience and surprised us all by taking the dare of eating a meal worm. "It was actually tasty," he said, but not as tasty as fried mozarella, he said later.

We stayed to the end, walking as much of the zoo as possible, soaring in a sky bucket and then taking the last bus tour of the day.

After we gathered the kids and their things back in our car and said goodbye to my son, everyone collapsed. I visited my iPhone app to see what it had logged for our walk that day and was quite impressed to see 4.6 miles.

So, I have no excuse for a 5k walk in the future, except for a prior commitment.

Do I breach the barrier and run the correct distance, then file a formal complaint with the judges that I'm the one and only, and "overall," winner of the 10k race, disqualifying every other runner who failed to stay on the (mapped) course? Perfect.

No, I decided in an instant, I needed to stay on the directed course with everyone else in hopes of winning my coveted winner's mug that goes to the top three in each age category.

And it's a good thing I did. I finished third, with fourth place not far behind. At the finish line, it was especially fascinating as dozens of seasoned runners commiserated about their Garmin and GPS devices all telling them their 10k races (6.2 miles) had only logged a distance of 5.9 miles. I wondered if the race organizers were going to refund each 10k racer \$1.75 for the distance they were shorted.

As for me, my finish time was a PR for this race, and CATHY EDBERG would have been even with the calculated extra time added in. (Not bad for a 64-year-old geezer).

And, sometimes, it takes a misstep or two to cause reflection and correction for the next time. That's how I'm seeing it. And as I reflected on it all at the pancake breakfast, I thought that on balance, the day was just, well, perfect!

Bob Krone's 50-year reflections on the Associates

Editor's note: In celebration of the Associates of ship came to the conclusion that the University of South-Idyllwild Arts Foundation's 50th anniversary, Bob Krone, son of Idyllwild School of Music and the Arts (now Idyllwild Arts) founders Max and Bee Krone, wrote this

Max and Bee Krone retired from ISOMATA leadership in the summer of 1967, 22 years after they created the Idyllwild Arts Foundation and 17 years after the first Summer Program in 1950. Ray and Virginia Garner, professional filmmakers, had moved to Idyllwild in the late 1950s. They had been part of the small staff that had run ISOMATA through its first two decades.

Ray gave Max and Bee his idea to create a volunteer support group in 1967 and they endorsed the idea at their retirement party that summer. Ray became the first president of the ISOMATA Associates. Membership was a mix of ISOMATA faculty and staff, and Idyllwild residents who wanted to take an active role in the school's activities.

As far as I can determine, I am the sole survivor of the 1950 first ISOMATA summer who also was present at the 1967 beginning of the Associates.

For 50 years now, the Associates have been a critically important group for the continuous building of ISO-MATA/IA to its current rating as one of the top-quality in-resident music and arts schools in the world. It helped perpetuate "The Essence of Idyllwild Arts" that leadership has steadfastly maintained.

At one point in the school's history, the Associates saved the school when it could have become a failure. That was the early 1980s period when the IAF leader-

ern California management of its Idyllwild Campus was preventing desired growth. Max had astutely included in that 1967 agreement with USC that if either side became dissatisfied with the partnership, USC would, before taking any other action, offer the campus back to

That happened in 1985. Bill Lowman then became the new director. The USC-IAF partnership ended and IAF became fully responsible. Max had passed in June 1970. Bee Krone was very worried that resources would not be available for IAF to successfully make the change. Foundation members and the Associates stepped forward and the transition was successful.

Salena and I congratulate the current Associates leadership and all its membership for making "The Impossible Dream" a continuing, and improving, reality.



If you follow this column, then you'll know that the last couple of articles have dealt with darker topics. So, to quote a phrase: "And now for something completely different." The clean, healthful home.

Using time-honored, homemade cleaning recipes can be inexpensive and healthy. It may require a bit more time and effort but could be worth it in the long run.

Fresno Metro Ministries (see first website above) has created a lovely page replete with recipes for every cleaning need in the everyday home. Below is a sampling.

Kitchen: To make an all-purpose cleaner, in a glass jar with spray nozzle, create a mix of 50-percent white vinegar; and 50-percent water with 20 to 30 drops of essential oil such as orange, lemon, peppermint or eucalyptus. The use of essential oils can create a pleasant customized aroma that is often not toxic to those with allergies and has the added benefit of not spoiling the fresh air between you and your neighbors. (By the way, do not mix vinegar and chlorine: toxic.)

For a heavy-duty version of a kitchen cleanser, try 1 teaspoon borax mixed with 4 cups of warm water, and add a squeeze of lemon juice.

A great scouring powder is made by combining borax, salt and baking soda. (Never ingest the borax).

For dishwashing liquid, use simple, pure, liquid soap, and add lemon juice directly to the water to cut grease. (See second link above for an easy recipe for homemade pure liquid soap. Note her use of inexpensive vegetable-bar soap.).

Bathroom: For the toilet bowl, sprinkle the bowl with baking soda, then drizzle white vinegar and leave it to soak for 30 minutes before scrubbing with your usual brush. Soaking makes the scrubbing go easier so be sure to include this step.

Laundry: Using a humble cheese grater, grate enough natural soap flakes (use pure, vegetable-bar soap for this) to fill one cup; combine with 1/2 cup each of baking soda and borax. Store in a glass container. Use 1 tablespoon for a normal load and double that for really dirty clothes. This can be used in warm- or cold-water

For brightening, add 1/2 cup of borax separate from, but alongside, the laundry soap to the wash. Borax is quite useful and not costly. To cut any soap scum, add white vinegar to the final rinse. (Remember, don't use it with bleach.) On the other hand, you can add 1/4- to 1/2cup of baking soda to this same rinse to soften fabrics.

Furniture polish: An easy mix of two parts vegetable oil with one part lemon juice will do the trick.

Foul-smelling trach cans: Sprinkle borax or baking soda into the bottoms of the cans.

Funky-smelling rugs: Sprinkle baking soda over the dry carpet; let it sit preferably overnight, then vacuum.

Alcohol and/or drugs have not yet been ruled out as caus-



Two earthquakes in two days felt on Hill

Two 3.2-magnitude earthquakes, one early Wednesday morning and the second early Friday morning, were felt on the Hill.

The epicenter of the first quake was 3.1 miles south/ southwest of Cabazon and occurred at 12:12 a.m. Wednesday, June 7. The second was 8 miles south of Idyllwild and was felt locally at 2:24 a.m. Friday, June 9.

These are preliminary magnitudes but anything under 4 magnitude is considered a minor quake, according to 24 Hour Earthquakes Report.

An eye for design, hard work, perseverance and seizing the moment

Idyllwild has been a seminal player in Kenny Gioeli's career

Hard work, perseverance and recognizing opportunities others failed to see characterize Idyllwild resident Kenny Gioeli's career. Idyllwild has been a seminal player in the way Kenny's personal and professional journey has unfolded.

"Landscape design is my passion," said Kenny, whose garden and family compound on Double View Drive were featured in the recent public tour of select Idyllwild gardens. But the serendipitous path Gioeli navigated to achieve a career based on his artistic passion is the real story.

"I came here when I was 10 to live with my dad [Almadeus Star Gioeli]," said Kenny. After seventh grade at Idyllwild School, his dad home-schooled him, part of the year in Idyllwild and part in Mexico, south of Puerto Vallarta

At 17, Kenny struck out on his own, making his way north from Mexico to the Temecula and San Diego areas where he worked various jobs before landing one with Thrifty Drug. "After five years, I left as store manager," Kenny remembered.

At 25, he was back in Idyllwild working with artist David Reid-Marr. "He taught me everything I know about design, landscaping, form and function," said Kenny. "I arrived back in Idyllwild with a backpack, some bologna and a skateboard, but after five years of working with David, I had learned a craft. He taught me patience and helped me shape my eye for visual design. Primarily, he continued to remind me about the patience that is key to landscape design. I worked with David from 1996 to 2001

"The second day I was back in Idyllwild, I met my wife Eva at a gallery," he shared. "And from that point on, Eva and our family were what grounded me and gave me the strength to try new things."

In 2001, Kenny again struck out on his own, contracting for raking and small construction projects such as fences and retaining walls. "From 2001 until 2003, the most valuable thing I did was to learn to network," he said, "how to build a network of people sharing the workload and referrals, rather than doing 100

percent of the work myself."

Again, timing, serendipity and being in exactly the right place at the right time played a key role in Kenny's career evolution. "Kosha Pino taught me the art of falling trees, just before the bark beetle crisis in 2003," he said. With the rapid death of trees in this forest and those north of I-10 in Arrowhead, felling trees and harvesting wood proved a highly profitable business for Kenny and his partner Mike Pearson. "I remembered telling Mike, Tve got the crew, and you've got the license, so let's do this.'

"I lost my landscaping and my passion for design during that time," he remembered. "And there was no artistic satisfaction in what I was doing." But with the intense need for dead-tree removal, the seed money that Kenny used to launch his tree-removal business grew into a comfortable financial cushion. "It was constant hard work," he remembered. "We had to live away from home in hotels while we were in Arrowhead, and the work was physically draining." But he had been in the right place at the right time, recognized and seized the work opportunity and ran a strong operation with Mike.

Starting in 2008, he began to reestablish his landscaping business in Idyllwild. "Eva was always a part of what I did," Kenny acknowledged. "Her advice and her eye for color and materials were always important.

I can't imagine having this life and this career without her " $^{\prime\prime}$

Kenny credits his growing up in Mexico and in Idyllwild with his intuitive approach to design. "Through all my career I've never drawn a plan. I've learned the simplicity of life, the patience of waiting for and seeing the design approach," he said. "And most important for me has been the drive to have a partner and a family. That is everything. I give till it's gone."

Checking for ID theft of a child The Federal Trade Commission advises: Any parent

or guardian of a child knows the milestones that come with turning 16 – learning to drive, maybe dating, or thinking about college. But now, there's one more: checking their credit report.


But my kids don't have a credit card, house or car. Why should I check their credit report?

Because somebody else could be using your child's personal information. Once a child's — or anyone's — Social Security number is stolen, it can be used by identity

Checking to see if your child has a credit history, and then thoroughly reviewing it when they turn 16, can help you spot signs of identity theft. If you find false or inaccurate information, you'll have time to correct it before your child applies for a job, a loan for college or a car, or tries to get a credit card or a place to live.

Generally, children won't have credit reports unless someone is using their information for fraud.

What if my child has a credit report with incorrect or false information? Visit IdentityTheft.gov/child to report the problem and follow the steps outlined to resolve it.


