Sheriff candidates: Sniff and Robles

ppointed Riverside County Sheriff (RCSD) Stan Sniff and retired Riverside County Sheriff's Chief Deputy Frank Robles share a piece of history but have different visions for the Department.

What they share is former Sheriff Bob Doyle. Sniff was fired in 2006 by Doyle, who now supports Robles. Sniff said his 2006 firing was without cause.

After Doyle abruptly retired in the summer of 2007, the Riverside County Board of Supervisors (BOS), by a 3- to 2-vote, appointed Sniff to the balance of Doyle's term. Sniff, a retired colonel

in the United States Army Reserve, as well as a 34-year law enforcement veteran with the Coachella Police Department and RCSD, opened his personnel file upon appointment as sheriff. There were no blemishes on his record.

As to visions for the Department, Sniff touts his efforts at promoting diversity within the ranks and raising educational requirements for officers; reducing crime 20 percent in unincorporated regions of the county; and prudently managing the Department budget so as to end the fiscal year with a \$5 million surplus. Sniff also notes his push for transparency and accessibility in the Department eliminating the

Outside Idyllwild

Lightening bug

Sooner or later all hikers need to lighten their pack weight. Whether the reason is advancing age, injuries or just common

sense, carrying a heavy pack is no longer an option. Why carry 50 pounds when you can have comfortable gear that weighs in at less than half that amount? You don't have to give up anything to be lighter on the trail, other than the dollars for new gear.

The first thing to look at is the pack itself. Old school packs weighed in at 5 to 8 pounds and were designed to carry your 3- to 4-pound sleeping bag and your 5-plus- pound tent. With the new ultralight gear on the market, you no longer need a big, heavy pack to cart around your massive load. You can easily save 2 to 4 pounds buying a new lighter pack.

The other big weight-saving items are your tent, sleeping bag and sleeping pad. You can easily drop some serious poundage when you convert to ultralight gear. These are the hardest things to replace because they are the high-ticket items and you really have to be committed to buying high-quality gear that will last for years to come.

After you have finished with the big ticket items, it is time to turn your attention to all the small items in your pack. I find the best way to deal with these items is to weigh each item individually, then think of a lighter alternative.

If you have an older flashlight or headlamp, you would be surprised how much they actually weigh. A headlamp with a halogen bulb and four AA batteries can weigh in at a half a pound or more. Unless you are doing route finding at night or you are on the rescue team you don't need a super bright headlamp. A good LED headlamp can weigh in at about 2.75 ounces.

Your first aid kit is another item that has redundancy and usually a heavy case that comes with the first aid supplies. Look for things like metal scissors that you may already have on your pocket knife or multi tool. You should be able to eliminate about half the items in your first aid kit by taking only what you think you need. If your kit has eight gauze pads, you may want to take only four of them with you on your hike. Finally, I would get rid of the carrying case and put your supplies in a much lighter ziplock baggie.

Hikers frequently overlook their stuff sacks. Sure, your 10-year-old stuff sack is made from Cordura and it will probably last another 10 years, but it weighs a full ounce and it can be replaced with a silk-nylon stuff sack that is half the weight. If you have four or five stuff sacks that can mean a drop of a couple of

By looking at the gear in your pack one item at a time, you can really trim your weight significantly. Your fully loaded 50-pound pack can easily be a 25pound pack and you will end up wondering why you waited so long to lighten up.

Now, if someone can just come up with a way to make water lighter, everyone would be a lot happier.





Idyllwild or Pinkbract Manzanita (Arctostaphylos pringlei drupacea) grows 6- to 12-feet tall. It grows on dry slopes in chaparral and yellow pine forest plant communities from the San Bernardino mountains south. This manzanita is currently (Mid-May) in bloom throughout our Idyllwild area. Native people use an infusion of leaves for medicinal purposes including poison oak rash. The fruits were mashed to make a drink, eaten fresh or dried for later consumption. The branches were used for building; wood made into tools; and, leaves were mixed with tobacco for smoking.







HUSD joins finance suit

On May 20, nine California school districts, the parents of Michael and Martha Robles-Wong and 60 other students sued the state over its financial obligations to local districts.

One of the school districts is Hemet Unified School district. "We were approached about eight months ago," said Trustee Bill Sanborn. They went to a variety of districts from large to small, wealthy to poor and across the state. HUSD was not willing to

finance the litigation, and has not been asked to do that, he said.

The plaintiffs are asking the state to fulfill its constitutional obligation to support public schools and their students.

The suit asks the court to compel the state to align its school finance system — its funding policies and mechanisms — with the educational program that the state has put in place. To do this, plaintiffs allege the State must scrap its existing finance system; do the work to determine how much it actually costs to fund public invest a substantial sum to education to meet the state's

own program requirements and the needs of California's school children; and develop and implement a new finance system consistent with Constitutional requirements.

Sanborn said the state's school districts are caught between state requirements for instructional programs and other school mandates and the continuous decline of state funds to pay for these requirements.

One consequence is local priorities and programs suffer in order to satisfy the state demands," he said.

Before our time

IAHS protects and shares our history

I don't mean to use my columns as an advertising medium for the Idyllwild Area Historical Society (IAHS), but today an extraordinary achievement requires an exception.

In April, the IAHS board of directors was stunned by news that the society had been selected by the state's professional archivists to receive their Archive Appreciation Award. Each year, the Society of California Archivists bestows this recognition on one organization in the state that has demonstrated an outstanding record of support for its archive program.

Past winners included the likes of the Walt Disney Co., Levi Strauss Co., Stanford Linear Accelerator Center, Auto Club of Southern California and renowned A. K. Smiley Public Library of Redlands — pretty fast company.

Not only is IAHS by far the tiniest organization, but it is also the only local historical society in California to be so honored.

Now, to most people "archives" - collections of photographs, documents, letters and the like - sound like pretty dull stuff. There's some truth to that but, in fact, it's pretty important dull stuff. Let me explain.

IAHS' mission is both to preserve and to share San Jacinto mountain history. The sharing takes place publicly through its museum and publications. In contrast, the preserving occurs out of sight, carried on by dedicated volunteers who rarely attract publicity. But their work is really more fundamental, for without preservation there would be nothing to share.

Proper archiving is indeed a meticulous and repetitive activity, governed by consistently applied policy and detailed procedures that dictate careful documenting, handling, packaging and storage. Specialized computer software is needed nowadays to do the job right.

The secret of IAHS' archive program is simple. Its founders back at the turn of the millennium, led by president Sheila Meyer, curator Lynnda Hart and assistant curator Shirl Reid, realized that if they were going to ask people to donate treasured materials, they'd darn well better be able to guarantee that the donations would be well cared for in perpetuity.

These folks had no experience in archiving, but did have the good sense to find professional help and get trained in the tools and procedures of the trade. Reid, in particular, became the chief archivist who has guided the activity ever since. As primary user of the IAHS archive, I can well appreciate what she and her crew of helpers have achieved.

Starting from scratch, they've built and managed a wonderful community resource now nearing 7,500 items.

A factor that particularly impressed the Society of California Archivists was the way the IAHS board has consistently supported the unglamorous task of preservation. Its dominant priority for seven years has been to create the secure, climate-controlled home for its archive that's now under construction behind the museum on North Circle Drive.

Catalyzed by \$32,000 in county grants engineered by supervisors Kay Ceniceros, Jim Venable and Jeff Stone, the board has tapped the generosity of IAHS members and friends to raise over \$150,000 for the new Archive & Research Center. With its completion, Hill communities can rest assured that their heritage will indeed be preserved.

It's deeply satisfying for a group of nonprofessional volunteers in a remote mountain village to be honored by a professional organization in a huge state like California. It's also a marvelous example of Idyllwild's spirit, expertise and tenacity in action.

Hiker lost more than 24 hours

A hiker separated from his friends, who was lost for about 28 hours in a search area from Humber Park to the Saddle and over to Tahquitz Peak, walked into the tram station shortly after 6 p.m. Tuesday, June 1. Riverside County Sheriff's Department Deputy Zeke Escobedo confirmed that Richard Wong, a male college student from San Francisco, and resident of Valencia, had been missing from around noon on Monday, May 31.

Friends with whom Wong

had begun to hike said that at 3:30 a.m. Tuesday, June a mile short of the Saddle, 1 and later mobilized Desert he said he was not feeling well, was experiencing extreme fatigue and was going to go back down to the Humber Park parking lot. He separated from his friends just before noon on Monday, but did not make it back to Humber Park. His friends did not report Wong missing until 10:53 p.m. Monday when, according to Escobedo, they made the report at the Idyllwild Fire Department.

The Sheriff's Department mobilized Riverside Mountain Rescue Unit (RMRU)

Search and Rescue who took the tram up to the mountain station to cover the area, along with RMRU, between the mountain station and Humber Park, A Sheriff's Department helicopter unit conducted an aerial search but did not locate Wong.

Wong's parents drove from Valencia and arrived in Idyllwild around 5:30 on June 1, only a short time before their son turned up at the lower tram station.

Proposition 17: who wins, who loses

Proposition 17, funded almost entirely by Mercury Insurance, California's fourth largest auto insurance company, takes aim at previously passed Proposition 103, which gave the state insurance commissioner power to regulate rates and set rating standards. Under existing law, companies are allowed to provide discounts to their long-term customers but they can't discriminate against new customers who are not insured.

Proposition 17 propos-

a benefit in the name of competition — to allow customer loyalty discounts to become transferable so that if one changes carriers, the new carrier can use the time of being insured by a previous carrier as evidence of continuous coverage.

Currently, drivers are charged up to \$250 for changing companies. So who pays for the revenue lost to insurers by making loyalty discounts transferable?

The answer, according to opponents, including most of the state's major news-

es to alter 103 to confer permit insurers to impose regulated rate hikes that surcharges, without legislative restrictions, on insureds who cannot demonstrate previous continuous insurance coverage — those who did not own a car, were first time drivers, were attending college and not driving, using mass transit or a variety of other reasons.

The effect, according to opponents, would be to further discourage the 20 percent without continuous coverage from obtaining auto insurance, thereby undermining the original intent of Proposition 103, papers, is that Prop. 17 will which was to prevent un-

made insurance unaffordable to many lower income drivers. Advocates argue that making continuity discounts transferable encourages competition which ultimately benefits consumers.

Section 1861.02 (Prop. 103) states: "the absence of prior automobile insurance coverage, in and of itself, shall not be a criterion for determining eligibility for Good Driver Discount policy." The current law goes on to state that insurers can consider persistency or continuity of coverage as See Prop. 17, page 10

Old, abandoned gold mine to be closed

The San Jacinto Ranger District is proposing to close unsafe mine shafts, and remove trash and vandalized camper shells from the Gold Shot Mine site. The mine is located above Garner Valley in the San Bernardino National Forest, near Butterfly Peak. The mine is inactive and abandoned, according to District Ranger Laurie Rosenthal, and poses a safety and health risk to the pub-

The District's "Scoping Notice" describes the mine as having two open vertical shafts and one horizontal mine opening. Unstable rock and rotting timbers surround the shafts. In addition to being full of trash,

Robles sees illegal immigration and foreign drug cartel influence as issues meriting major Departmental focus — that with the recent Arizona law authorizing major state initiatives in curbing illegal immigration, illegal immigrants and attendant drug running gangs will increasingly focus on California

Both Sniff and Robles acknowledge the biggest challenge ahead will be the budget. Sniff notes that the BOS determines final budget allocations. "My job is not to be a potted plant," he said, recounting that he has strenuously argued for Department budget priorities before the BOS.

"Our budget is in balance and we will continue with cost controls."

Robles thinks Sniff has spent too much time amassing countywide endorsements and has not trimmed enough fat from the budget. "He's not responding to the crisis," Robles alleged. "The cuts are coming, so start at the top [and consolidate or vacate certain administrative positions] and set an example." Sniff says he has already done just that.

Robles campaign has received a major cash infusion, about \$200,000 out of marshall@towncrier.com.

COLONEL BO'S MEMORIAL DAY



I'm always sort of bragging about how the Service is strong on 'Teamwork' — and how in the Army kids from all over find 'buddies' from all over and how in fighting and dying together, men and women find a deeper, caring love that is one of those eternal, soul things that unless you've served, you can't fully understand. On Monday, I found my match. I was invited to speak at the Wildomar

Memorial Service. As you probably know, Memorial Day originated when a group of southern women chose the last Monday in May to place flowers on Civil War soldiers' graves. When I was young, it was called 'Decoration Day' or 'Poppy Day.' My Pop and his WWI buddies sold tiny, red, artificial poppies which folk wore honoring the war dead. In 1971, President Johnson, who had won the Silver Star for valor in WWII, made it a National Holiday. In my cemetery speech on Monday, I mentioned that I was ninety. After a beautiful ceremony and 'Taps,' two local men came up to hug me and explained that they

were both ninety-two and had served together in the Coast Artillery from the day after Pearl Harbor, 1941 clear to V-J Day in 1945. Day-after-lonely-day, they served alone together at Dana Point, watching for enemy submarines. My WWII stories, while not so ardu-

Idyllwild's Drell Hemet salutatorian



"The one rating factor that Proposition 103 prohibits is the one that insurance companies used before [passage in 1988]," he noted. "Prop. 103 says you cannot base insurance premiums or refusing to insure somebody on the absence of prior insurance. Under

Mercury's initiative, if you've never had prior insurance, you can be surcharged for the first time. It overturns the Prop. 103 provision and legalizes these surcharges."



Idyllwild purchases new well

By J.P. CRUMRINE **EDITOR**

The Idyllwild Water District (IWD) held a special meeting Thursday, May 27 to discuss and authorize the purchase of a new well. Rather than locating a promising site, assessing the likelihood of water and then drilling a test well, IWD chose to eliminate the interim steps and authorize the purchase of an existing producing well. Negotiations are not yet complete.

For \$40,000, IWD will have a new well, which has proven its production exceeds 30 gallons per minute (gpm). IWD's most recent two test wells have proven disappointing; neither has been added to the production system although one was capped and may be a reserve well in water-stressed times. The combined cost to assess the potential of these two wells was about \$75,000, according to IWD

General manager Terry Lyons. Additional costs will be incurred finishing the second well, he added.

"We've used this well previously," Lyons said describing the potential new purchase. "In 2002, in midst of the drought it was producing 32 gpm for us.'

"The purchase of an existing well that has good production is a win-win," said Allan Morphett, IWD president. "Obtaining a proven well is certainly better than drilling a well hoping for a new source for water ... Even though this well has some treatment that will have to done to meet quality standards it is, without saying, a good addition."

There will be some cost to integrate the well into the IWD production system, but Lyons feels that is a very good investment for the district.




