Uncounted ballots in legal limbo

The uncounted ballot story is now moving forward on several paths — legal, federal and local. The state court may decide what the county can do about these ballots, but the federal congressional delegation is trying to develop a new policy with the U.S. Postal Service (USPS), while Assemblyman Brian Nestande is trying to navigate new state legislation to avoid future repetitions of the situation.

Legal

On Wednesday, June 30, the Riverside County Democratic Central Committee

and three Moreno Valley voters filed a suit against Riverside County Registrar of Voters Barbara Dunmore, to "prohibit [her] from refusing to count and include in the certified vote tally ballots that were in the hands of the U.S. Postal Service and available for pick-up before 8 p.m. on June 8, 2010."

Dunmore maintains and the suit confirms that state law requires ballots be with election officials before the polls close in order to be counted.

However, the plaintiffs argued that in 2002 after the 2000 presidential elections (Bush and Gore were the major party candidates), California voters adopted [See Count, page 26](#)

Betty Joan Lackey takes back Jo'An's

At one stroke past midnight, July 5, Betty Joan Lackey took back her restaurant, Jo'An's, long an Idyllwild staple, from previous owners Andrew Panbehchi and Parvin Naderi. "I don't believe there is anything they could have done to stop my taking possession," said Lackey by phone. "The liquor license transferred to me on the 6th and escrow closed at the same time."

Depending on inventory required to remain by terms

of sale, Lackey tentatively plans to reopen on July 10. "The escrow papers document everything they had to leave [equipment]," she said. Lackey has not been in the restaurant prior to the closing because of concerns over the long-running lawsuit between the parties, she added.

Lackey had scheduled an inspection of the facility by Riverside County Department of Environmental Health and Safety (EHS) on Wednesday, July 7, to assess what, if anything, she needs to repair or replace in order to reopen.

"I've already agreed to replace the kitchen floor," she said. "What they've (EHS) told me is that, with me as a new owner, we'll start over. They'll give me a list of what I may have to fix and the time period to fix it."

Lackey will direct restaurant operations with family help. "My son Mike will be onsite manager," she said. Lackey is also bringing back many of her former staff. "My kitchen staff are all back," she noted. "And the kitchen is the most important."

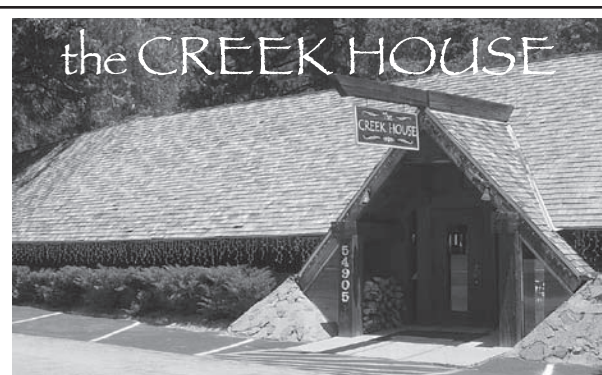

Chorale sings and dances Cole Porter

On two consecutive weekends, beginning Friday July 16, the Idyllwild Master Chorale (IMC) presents "Cole," a staged musical pastiche about one of Broadway's most slyly sophisticated composers and master of daring double entendres, Indiana's own Cole Porter.

Porter used clever and urbane language naturally. He was born into wealth and privilege, educated at Yale and Harvard, and the Schola Cantorum in Paris. In the years after the First World War, he lived lavishly in Paris as an expatriot.

He easily hobnobbed with royalty, famous composers and artists of the day, and with the crème of Parisian and New York society. That moneyed effervescence imbued Porter's lyrics with deftly intelligent rhymes, saucy insouciance,

and more than an occasional wink.

Porter's early music embodied the flash and ebullience of the 1920s, and later brightened the gloom of the Depression with Broadway shows that contained some of his most memorable tunes — 1932's "Gay Divorcee" with Fred Astaire which introduced "Night and Day"; and 1934's "Anything Goes" with Ethel Merman which introduced "I Get a Kick Out of You," "All Through the Night," "Blow Gabriel Blow," and "You're the Top."

He continued writing for Broadway and Hollywood until the late 1950s, penning some of his best shows, "Kiss Me Kate" in 1948, "Can Can" in 1954, and the Hollywood musical remake of "The Philadelphia Story," and "High Society" with Bing Crosby, Frank Sinatra and Grace Kelly in 1955. "High Society," gave Porter his last big hit, "True Love."

For Porter, writing lyrics and music happened at the same time — as he said, instinctively — so natural was that link to him that when listening to a Rodgers and Hammerstein hit, he commented that it seemed odd that it took two men to write one song.

IMC does Porter with cast members Buzz Holmes, Phyllis Brown, Scott Fisher, Lisa Furugen, Bella Gioeli, Justin Holmes, Larry Kawano, Steve Kunkle, Linda Lackey, Lori Palmer, Barbara Rayliss, Jay Rubin and Mike Sebastian. Direction is by Holmes and Furugen, choreography is by Dakota Bailey, Lisa Furugen and Justin Holmes; set is by Trevor Holmes; lights and sound are by Lucas Lilieholm; and pit band members are Ed Hansen and Marshall Hawkins.

Familiar Porter hits include: "Another Opening, Another Show," "I Love Paris," "Night and Day," "I Get a Kick," "Still of

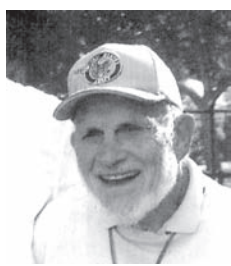

Keith Droste and his all star Dixie Devils come marchin' in to the Idyllwild Summer Concert Series' Community Center venue at 7 p.m. Thursday, July 15.

Chicago native Droste, on keyboards, has, in his own words, "played it all." He studied at Berklee School of Music in Boston, with Sam Saxe in Hollywood and with Oscar Peterson in Toronto, Canada. He played keyboard in many famous bands including those of Jimmy Dorsey, Vaughn Monroe, Bob Crosby and Tex Beneke. He has backed many well-known artists including Annette Funicello, James Darren, Ella Fitzgerald, Johnny Mathis, Peggy Lee and Bob Hope. He served 15 years as music director for Frankie Avalon.

But on July 15 he brings quintessential Dixieland to Idyllwild — that born-in-New Orleans style of jazz

that slowly sauntered up the Mississippi to Chicago, via Kansas City, and then on to New York and Europe. The pantheon of famous Dixieland stars includes Louis Armstrong, Earl "Fatha" Hines, Jack Teagarden, Pete Fountain and Al Hirt.

In addition to tinkling the ivories, Droste brings Randy Anglin on tuba, John Lungren on drums and vocals, Stu Undem on trombone, and Jimmy Ogden on cornet.

Local band Skeleton Crew plus Pete and Sue opens for the Dixie Devils at 6:15 p.m. There is no

Former Chamber head sues paper

On May 17, Ken Carlson, former Idyllwild Chamber of Commerce president, filed a libel action against the Town Crier's parent corporation, Tindle Newspapers, Ltd, of Surrey, England.

Carlson's complaint alleges he was libeled in a May 6 article titled, "Carlson ignores board, alters ballot." The story described how Carlson took control of the Chamber's election process and kept fellow Chamber directors in the dark as he mailed the ballot he prepared to Chamber members.

The Idyllwild Town Crier has responsibility for Tindle's defense since the challenged article was written here and published in the local paper.

Last Wednesday, June 30, the paper responded to Carlson's complaint with a

special motion to dismiss, called an anti-SLAPP motion.

"As the court can see from the two articles, the complaint, and the Declaration of Marshall Smith (the Town Crier's reporter), the Town Crier's alleged conduct is normal newspaper reporting activity protected by the United States Constitution's 1st Amendment, The California Constitution (Art. 1, sec. 2), Cal. Civil code section 47 (e)," the motion began.

"The 'gist' or 'sting' of the article about which the plaintiff complains is that the Town Crier reported accusations and allegations made by the Chamber of Commerce's other board members with regard to Mr. Carlson's handling of the ballot for the upcoming board election and his placing the Town Crier on 'trial' to expel the newspaper from the Chamber."

The anti-SLAPP motion refers to litigation, which is considered a strategic lawsuit against public participation (SLAPP). The initial lawsuit is generally intended to censor or intimidate and silence critics of the plaintiff. The burden of the legal defense or even the threat of a lawsuit can cause individuals or organizations to remain quiet about public issues from fear of the financial burden a lawsuit would involve.

A SLAPP can also be used to intimidate and quiet others, who may have information about the issue, before they speak.

In California and many other states, the law provides for a process to try to resolve the litigation quickly. This is the use of the anti-SLAPP motion.

The defendant, in this case, Tindle Newspapers, must prove a constitutionally-protected activity, such

as freedom to speak, is at stake. If the judge agrees, the original plaintiff must then prove there is a reasonable expectation that he would prevail.

Carlson claims he appointed himself as Acting Secretary of the Chamber and therefore was fully responsible for the election process. However, he has not shown the proof that he was nominated and voted into the position pursuant to the local chamber's bylaws.

Carlson chose not to sue the Town Crier; instead he filed in federal district court against the paper's English owners. "The defendant is in London," Carlson stated.

But the California anti-SLAPP laws have been applied in federal courts within this Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals (which includes California). Despite this history, Carlson is confident the motion will be denied.

10 years and retired in 2008. He could have stayed with the Forest Service but he would not have been able to be an active firefighter. He is a deputy chief for one of the Southern California Interagency Management teams.

"I don't know if it will bring satisfaction," Walker said of working only at a desk. "Fire is part of my job. I enjoy going out and practicing my craft. I don't think I could take a job without the adrenalin rush and just have paperwork."

The adrenalin joy has had decades to build. He has served his entire 35-year career exclusively in Southern California forests, beginning in the early 1970s at the Angeles National Forest.

He is credited with reviving the fuels program within the district and working with CalFire to improve the fuels and fire break system throughout the Hill environs.

think it is foolish and legally in question and factually unbased," he said. The motion seems to argue that the incident occurred in a public meeting, and it didn't, he added.

"I have no ill-will for the Town Crier," he concluded. A hearing on the anti-SLAPP motion is scheduled for Aug. 9.

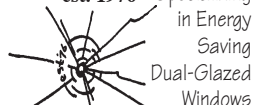

Proposition 43, which amended the state constitution with the following language:

"A voter who casts a vote in an election in accordance with the laws of this State shall have that vote counted."

The voters in the suit maintain they mailed their ballots days before the deadline, the ballots are among the uncounted 12,563 and the only reason they were not in election officials' hands was confusion between the Postal Service and Dunmore's office, according to their attorney James C. Harrision

The suit was filed Wednesday afternoon. At the hearing early Thursday morning, the judge issued an injunction extending the time Dunmore has to submit the county's certified vote totals to the secretary of state. Judge Mac Fisher will have a hearing Friday, July 9 to consider the merits of the case.

Legislative

While the judiciary addresses the outcome of the 12,500 ballots uncounted from the June 8 primary, Assemblyman Brian Nestande submitted legislation to ensure the problem does not occur in the future.

His bill, A.B. 2642, would have granted authority to count a ballot with a post-mark on or before election day, just as one's tax return is not late if post marked by April 15.

However, the senate committee with oversight did not hear the bill by Friday, July 2. Now Nestande's effort will have to be resubmitted next year, according to his Chief of Staff, Rob Flanigan.

Executive

Last week, four members of the California congressional delegation wrote to Postmaster General John Potter asking him to respond to a series of questions about the Postal Service's role in collecting, delivering and protecting the mail ballots.

They asked some general questions about the USPS policies and several specific questions about what happened in Riverside County last month.

The members signing the letter were Mary Bono Mack (R 45), Ken Calvert (R 44), Darrell Issa (R 49) and Jerry Lewis (R 41).

Separately, Riverside County Executive Officer William Luna is conducting an internal investigation and will submit a report to the board at its July 13 session.

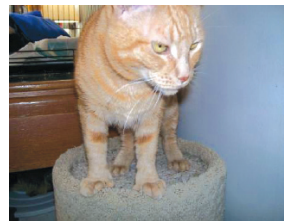

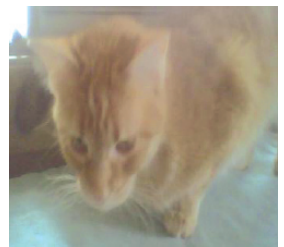
