# LaBenne to carve new monument?

reliminary talks are underway with Jonathan LaBenne, carver of Idyllwild's original Tree Monument, to erect a new monument on the Village Center Drive site of his former iconic work.

Those involved in explorand Josh and Emily White, are pursuing a LaBenne option over frustration with carver David Roy's failure to complete his contract on or by any fixed date. Further, Roy has often stated prefer-

"Jonathan is working on design and coming up with a [cost] number," said Emily White, on whose property the previous monument sat.

# **Historic District** meeting at Town Hall

The possibility of an Idyllwild Historic District draws near. At a public meeting from 3 to 7 p.m. Tuesday, Aug. 3 at Town Hall, officials from the Riverside County Planning Department and the Historic Preservation Office will present the draft ordinance that will serve as the template for creating an Idyllwild Historic District. The proposed district is centered on the village business core and contains primarily commercial buildings.

Property owners within the proposed borders of the district and other Hill

residents will have an opportunity to hear how it will be formed and governed, what regulatory role the county will play, and how district design guidelines are drawn up and applied. Maps of the district are available online at www.tlma.co.riverside. ca.us/planning and in the Town Crier lobby.

This will be an opportunity for district merchants, residents and property owners to ask questions about how the proposed district will affect their properties. Jerry Jolliffe, deputy planning director, and Keith Herron, county preservation officer, will present the proposal. They will discuss See HPD, page 10

# IFPD drops parcel tax increase idea

The Idyllwild Fire Protection District (IFPD) commission officially withdrew its plan to seek a parcel tax increase this fall. In a special meeting Friday night, July 23, the commissioners agreed to rescind their June resolution to submit a ballot measure next month to the Riverside County Registrar of Voters for the November election.

Adamant they need ad-

ditional revenues, commissioners intend to reassess this idea in the future. This fall, they will likely increase ambulance fees as a means to augment their revenues.

"After talking with our attorney, Brad Neufeld [Gresham and Savage of Riverside], it's not a good time to do this. The political climate is not there," said vice chair Pete Capparelli. Then he described his conversation with a professional political consultant on how

Calif. Bridesmaids were Andrew's sisters, Shannon Day of San Diego and Lindsey Day of Idyllwild.





### Who pays ambulance bill?

So Paul Riggi [Idyllwild Fire Protection District commissioner], according to the July 22 Town Crier, asks "Who pays the ambulance fees? The insurance companies!" They do?

Well, if you're fortunate enough to have insurance (and apparently in his world everyone is), it pays a portion — in the case of private sector insurance, about half. The insurance industry doesn't make its profits by actually covering 100 percent of anything. Thus, I must wonder where he acquired this notion.

With health insurance coverage, my portion of a 2006 motor vehicle collision came to a mere \$6,500; Blue Cross paid about half. I was en route from work when an uninsured pick-up truck driver ploughed into me. I had the dubious fortune of having night fees attached.

That 2-hour ground transport to the nearest trauma center was a total of \$13,000 ... what universe does this guy live in?

As premiums go up every year in direct proportion with covered events going down and the share of cost, deductibles, et al, going up, he must have a particularly altruistic insurance company or he has never needed ambulance transport.

This motor vehicle accident happened four years ago. I can't imagine what it costs now. Good thing I wasn't hit during the day; I shudder to imagine the co-pay of helicopter transport, and as for the pricey equipment required for this transport? A backboard for spinal precautions and a liter of normal saline.

What an arrogant statement; it has obviously never occurred to this individual that not only do most private sector insurance pay half of an ambulance ride but also there are many who lack insurance at all. Insurance, if one is not covered by an employer, is a privilege enjoyed by those who can afford it, and that is providing they never had a day in their lives of injury or illness to render them

# Earthquake good news, bad news

Earthquake planning and preparation are worthwhile for Hill residents, according to Scripps Institute of Oceanography seismologist Dr. Debi Kilb.

Kilb said the 7.2 magnitude April Mexicali quake, dubbed the Easter Quake, relieved stress on the southern San Andreas Fault that runs through the Coachella Valley east of Idyllwild, and appears to have lessened the immediacy of a giant quake on the long, silent, southern San Andreas. "The factor of stress relief [on the San Andreas] is not huge," Kilb cautioned.

However, the Easter Quake added stress to the San Jacinto Fault network that runs west of Idyllwild and through Garner Valley. The San Jacinto Fault is, according to Kilb, a family of connected but dissimilar

For the San Jacinto, and the recent 5.4 magnitude quake near Borrego Springs, including the San Andreas.

the complexity of the San "The deeper the fault goes, mean minor seismic activity on connected faults will jump to the San Jacinto and precipitate a much larger quake. Data from the Easter Quake confirms the theory that quake activity can jump from a minor fault to a larger fault.

"That fault [triggering the Mexicali] earthquake is so small, we don't even really know where it is," David Bowman, Cal State Fullerton geology professor said. "Yet that small earthquake — that would not have made the news at all — was able to jump onto another fault and become a magnitude 7.2 event. The small quake's energy jumped on another fault and kept on going."

Kilb said a very large quake on the San Jacinto could be very destructive given the depth of the fault, 20 kilometers. San Jacinto's depth compares to an average depth of 6 to 8 kilometers on other faults

Jacinto fault network could the bigger a quake could be," said Kilb. Relatively frequent smaller quakes may not be relieving San Jacinto stress. Instead they could act as triggering events for a large temblor on the San Jacinto.

> The July Borrego Springs quake is not an aftershock of the Easter Quake but an original, Kilb maintains. Scientists are looking at what's developing on the San Jacinto and the possibility of a big one on that fault network.

> The largest recent eruption on the San Jacinto occurred on April 8, 1968, the 6.5 magnitude (M) Borrego Mountain earthquake. Otherwise, said Kilb, San Jacinto shakes average in the 3 and 4M range with some in the

> When asked about earthquake prediction, Kilb demurred, citing the improving but still inexact science of prediction. "But there are predictive averages," she noted. "For every 6M quake, there are on aver

age 10 5s, 100 4s and 1,000 3s," she noted. And given the 42 years since a quake comparable to Northridge (6.7M on a previously undiscovered fault), the law of averages points to the San Jacinto as a candidate for a big one.

Kilb urges preparation and caution — preparation to maintain your family and pets for up to a month should the quake devastate the urban structure at the base of the Hill and isolate mountain communities. She also advises knowing who locally to contact if in need of help.

"Keep whistles handy," advised Kilb. "If buried in rubble, your voice gives out after a while. Get a whistle." And, as other seismologists have posited, Hill residents will likely not experience the liquefaction and structural collapse of communities below, given our granite

# IWD seeks funds for recycling pilot plant

After further discussions with federal officials, the Idyllwild Water District (IWD) directors are moving forward with their intention to construct a water recycling plant for the district.

The board set a public hearing on the environmental assessment of the proposal for its Sept. 21 meeting. The draft evaluation should be available in early August according to General Manager Terry Lyons.

"This is an opportunity to receive public comments on the recycled water project," Lyons said to the board. He added that IWD's project consultant, Anuj Saha, president of Ascend Engineering, Inc. of Aiken, S.C., will be at the hearing to present the environmental report.

At the request of the State Water Resources Control Board, IWD will also present several alternatives, including a ground water replenishment project, for the use of the recycled wa-

The board also adopted a second resolution, which gave Lyons authority to apply for state grant funds to construct the recycling plant. He presented two funding paths to the board. The first would combine a state grant with a federal grant for the federal Department of the Interior's Bureau of Reclamation. The two grants would cover about 75 percent of the estimated cost.

likely according to Lyons, would be combining the state grant with a state loan for the 75 percent balance of the cost. IWD would request that the loan be converted to a grant because Idyllwild qualifies as a disadvantaged community.

The Bureau of Reclamation officials are excited about IWD's proposed project, Lyons said. One visited Idyllwild this month. He told Lyons that the tour and field examination answered many of their questions.

"This is the first project in the fractured granite geography," he told the board. "The pilot scale project will open the door for people in similar communities.'

In water business, IWD produced 8.2 million gallons in June. This is a 1.4 million increase compared to May, but only 1.1 percent more than June 2009. Total production in the first six months of 2010 has been 38 million gallons. If the year continues at this pace, the final production volume will be the lowest since 82.3 million gallons in 2003.

Lyons reported that Foster Lake is filled to capacity, "The best news is the lake is full, which is really good for this time of year.

The district ended its fiscal year (June 30) with net income of \$46,900 in the water fund and \$30,400 in its sewer fund. Both preliminary results were better than the original projections. One reason was property taxes were not reduced as much as the original estimate, according to Auditor and The second, and more Controller Jim Ludy. Both

Following the regular meeting, the board met in closed session to complete its annual performance evaluation of Lyons. After the meeting, the board announced its decision to grant a 3 percent salary increase and a \$500 monthly com.

After its special meeting Friday, July 23, President Allan Morphett announced, "The board authorized Terry to move forward to purchase the property in question.

We will know more later this week regarding the property."

to approach a possible tax vote and the consultant's fees that will range from \$25,000 to \$75,000.



"We'd love to have a tree monument again. It would be awesome. The ball is in Jonathan's court."

Of issue other than cost, would be finding an appropriate cedar tree, something Josh Whitney and some others are looking into, according to Pearson.

Pearson expressed some doubt Roy's carving would survive a move from its present location given the delicacy of its carving elements. "This has nothing to do with the quality of David's work," stressed Pearson, who, like many in town, admires what Roy has

created to date.

The motivation is restoration of a Tree Monument in the village center. Roy will give only approximate completion dates. When his carving is finished, moving it will be a very delicate problem. Roy sidesteps this concern by maintaining his art needs to be placed permanently in a partially shaded location, such as its present location. The village center site has no shade.

Roy's inablity to complete his work has created polar views. Some maintain an artist should not be held to schedules or contracts while others argue that he is using the partially completed monument, for which he has been paid \$11,000,

# Palms to Pines Scenic Byway planning starts

Public meetings are scheduled Wednesday to garner citizen input to complete a Corridor Management Plan (CMP) for the state-designated Palms to Pines Scenic Highway, which traverses the 67-mile route from Palm Desert to Banning along State Highways 74 and 243. A CMP is a

written plan developed by the communities along a scenic byway that outlines how to protect and enhance its intrinsic qualities and character.

The CMP planning process will include representatives from the Forest Service, Bureau of Land Management, California State Parks. Caltrans and members of local communities. A Draft See Highway, page 19

salient issues such as boundary adjustments, how the district will affect residential buildings, procedures for adding or removing a property from the district, how the vote to form the district is conducted, and how the district will be governed once formed. For example, the district design board will be comprised of locals, and design guidelines will be vetted with the affected community prior to adoption.

In June 2007, at another Town hall meeting, 3rd District Supervisor Jeff Stone

introduced the concept. He viewed establishment of an Idyllwild Historic Preservation District as a way to create Idyllwild-specific building and parking codes different from the rest of the county and intending to preserve Idyllwild's idiosyncratic character and ambiance. Stone recognized that certain codes could not be practically implemented here — for instance, the number of required parking spaces per business. Stone had also taken note of Americans With Disabilities Act (ADA) lawsuits filed by a San Diego attorney in Julian that broke the backs

that fate. ADA regulations recognize that historic districts may meet ADA compliance in ways that don't alter the historical value or character of the building within the district. Stone announced he would allocate \$100,000 in district community improvement funds to pay for the planning effort involved in bringing the Idyllwild Historic Preservation District to fruition.

Jolliffe believes the businesses owners and residents in the district and the wider community will have to embrace and adopt the concept for it to create benefit. "The county cannot impose this concept," said Jolliffe. "The community must examine the ordinance, ask their questions, research district pros and cons, and reach their decision."

Other than a few build-

ings such as Town Hall and Silver Pines Lodge that will be added to the district, the district's initial boundaries will not be expanded. Inclusion of a significant number of new properties

would necessitate another study to determine historical value of buildings, including residences, in other parts of Idvllwild.







# Steele on streak

Idyllwild native, Brendan Steele, continued his climb up the ranks of golf's professional Nationwide Tour. This weekend at the \$775,000 Nationwide Children's Hospital Invitational, he had his third consecutive top-20 finish.

Two weeks ago, playing in the \$550,000 Chiquita Classic on the RPC River's Bend course in Cincinnati, Ohio, the Steel carded a 20-under-par — 67-65-68-69 a total 269 strokes. He finished in a tie for 10th place, chalking up his first top-10 finish, his fifth top-20 finish, and his fifth consecutive cut made on the tour this year. He hit nearly 82 percent of the greens in regulation and earned a check for \$12,650. With that performance, Steele improved his standing on the money list to 48th place. But he did not pause there.

Last week, he advanced further by scoring his sixth top-20 finish (three in a row) and his sixth consecutive cut on the tough Scarlet Course at Ohio State University in Columbus, Ohio. Averaging drives of over 300 yards, he put together a 4-under par 68-71-74-67 – 280 total to earn a tie for 12th place.

He took home \$16,960 in prize money, bringing his winnings total to \$80,919 for the year. Along the way, Steele hit 73 percent of the fairways, tying for second among all players in the tournament in that category. His fairway strokes hit the greens in regulation nearly 82 percent of the time, third best in the tournament.

Steele needs a top-25 standing on the Nationwide Tour money list for promotion to the PGA Tour in 2011. A dozen tournaments remain, including September's Soboba The winner's share of the purse will be \$130,500.

### 1 year ago - 2009

Riverside County Sheriff's deputies arrested an Idyllwild man on suspicion of stealing hanging baskets, trees, plants, and herbs from the local nursery. He had apparently gained access by removing a 4-foot section of the fence.






