emorial Day, formerly known as Decoration Day, honors men and women who died while serving in the United States Armed Forces. At 11 a.m. Monday, May 27, American Legion Post 800 holds its annual honor guard ceremony, the Memorial Day weekend.

The tradition of a solemn the American Civil War as a way to honor both Union and Confederate soldiers

exacted the greatest toll of any war in which American soldiers served, over 650,000 killed (estimates vary from 628,000 to 750,000). In many American communities, it is common on Memorial Day to visit the graves of relatives, tidy up the gravesites, lay flowers, and if any had served in the Armed Forces, place an emotional centerpiece of the American flag on the grave - hence Decoration Day.






# Climber dies from fall on Lily Rock

While climbing Lily Rock, Lucas Dunn, 21, of Idyllwild fell approximately 150 feet. He was pronounced dead at the scene.

He was climbing with his friend Greg Davis.

Near noon, Friday, the Hemet Sheriff's Station responded to a call about an injured rock climber at Humber Park in Idyllwild. CAL FIRE medical personnel hiked to Lily Rock and located the climber, but he had already succumbed to com.

his injuries and was pronounced deceased by CAL FIRE medical personnel on

Riverside County Sheriff's Emergency Response Team was notified and with the Riverside Mountain Rescue Unit they managed the recovery of the victim.

Sheriff's Aviation Unit's May 17, deputies from helicopter recovered the victim and transported him to the Keenwild Helitack, where he was released to the Coroner's Office personnel.



# **Banking SNAFU?**

Last year, in January, my elderly mother lost her check book. When we contacted the bank, they quickly closed her account and opened another one for

At that point, something went wrong. Instead of moving her money over to the new account, the BBVA adminstration changed her money into a "loan" and began charging her interest and withdrawing \$15 to \$20 per month in addition to interest at 21 percent for her money. They called this "overdraft protection."

When my mother noticed this in April 2012 and called the bank, they explained it away. And she accepted their explanation. She is 87 and does not like to deal with little inconveniences, so she does not bother to balance her account and look at all of the charges usually.

When I became aware "with prejudice." The "with of the situation last month and took my mother to the bank to clarify things, they explained that there had been a mistake made not at that bank, but by administration, somewhere in the clouds, but the fact is that the bank had sent a notice of this arrangement to my mother maybe more than once.

So according to the nice ladies at our local bank, since she had been notified that the bank had taken her money and then charged her to get it back with interest, there was nothing anyone could do about it.

At that time, we paid off the bank for the "loan" of my mother's money to my mother in the amount of \$388. So now she will not be charged for her "loan" to herself, or the interest, which of course did not go

My calculations are that the mistake made by the bank has cost my mother \$832, because someone did not just freeze her incoming checks on a closed account, but created an overdraft "loan.'

# IFPD's admin captain's history

EDITOR:

I don't always agree with J.P.'s criticisms of IFPD, but his most recent opinion is one that has been ignored

The administrative captain promotion was approved by the board in 2013 after over three years of internal debate, possible legal action against the department and too much of (the public's) IFPD's limited legal counsel dollars.

The promotion was discovered in a letter that only the person that filled the position had a copy of.

The promotion was made without board knowledge or authorization, by a fire chief, in a curiously worded letter, dated days before his retirement. No one else at the department was notified or allowed to apply for the new captain's position, even those with more tenure and experience.

The next fire chief wrote a second letter referencing the first letter stating that it had now been approved by the career firefighters, once again without board direction or approval. Where was the authorization for a fourth captain?

Even more curious is that the position would cease to exist if he was promoted from admin[istrative] captain to a full fire captain and that no opening was created for his vacated engineer's position.

The administrative captain has also become: career negotiating committee lead, payroll officer, budget committee lead, training officer, hiring committee lead, volunteer company liaison, and directs who is called first for fire assignments and overtime. Is it any wonder the admin[istrative] captain is the highest paid member of IFPD?

If you want to be hired, retired, promoted or go on fire assignments, all permis-

sion starts at his feet. He does it all. And for the past three years, IFPD, according to the outside audits (not the internal budget numbers given to the board as balanced), has been over budget in 2012 by \$120,539, in 2011 by \$191,424, and in

2010 by \$436,333.



# Speaking for the animals

### Heartworm 101 ...

Heartworm is a parasitic roundworm that is transmitted to certain animals (dogs, cats, ferrets and coyotes, for example) only through the bite of an infected mosquito. An uninfected mosquito can bite an already-infected animal and then spread it to other animals it subsequently bites.

It takes seven months from the bite for the heartworm to reach the adult stage in its victim. It lodges in the heart, lungs and respiratory blood vessels where it reproduces. It can grow up to 12 inches and live for five to seven years in your dog.

There are no symptoms of infestation in the early stages. As the heartworm grows and reproduces, the dog may cough and be short of breath. Weight loss becomes evident. If left untreated, an unpleasant death will occur.

On his website, www.avlanimalhospital.com, Hemet veterinarian Clay Johnson calls Idyllwild a "hotbed" of heartworm disease. While the incidence in Riverside County is not considered severe, you do take a risk if you leave your dog unprotected.

In the last three years, ARF and Sadie's Clinic have been aware of several Idyllwild dogs testing positive and

requiring the harsh but life-saving treatment.

A simple blood test can tell in 10 minutes if your dog is infected. That test costs about \$35 and determines the presence of adult heartworms. However, there is a separate test that checks for the larvae or microfilariae.

Treatment for positive test results involves an arsenic-based drug which requires the animal to be kept quiet during and for a few months after the series of injections. As they die off, the heartworms break into pieces that can block pulmonary vessels and cause death. It's a costly procedure, as much as \$1,000, and dangerous for your pet.

For prevention, a monthly dose of the drug Ivermectin kills the heartworm larvae before they grow and reproduce. The dose depends on the weight of the dog and can begin as early as six weeks. The cost at Sadie's Clinic is from \$18 to \$28 for a six-month supply.

Some Collies and other related breeds have a gene which makes them sensitive to Ivermectin. These dogs can safely take Interceptor, a brand of heartworm prevention that does not use Ivermectin.

If you decide not to follow a preventative regimen, it is recommended that you have your dog tested every six months.

Many Idyllwild residents give heartworm prevention every month, even during the winter when supposedly there are no mosquitoes present.

But there are folks who think it's best to give their animals a break from the medication. Some holistically minded vets support this stance, saying that you're safe giving the preventive every six weeks or even every other month.

One website I checked, www.dogs4dogs.com, said it was okay to skip doses after the temperature has remained below 57 degrees for 35 to 45 days.

If you're meticulous about keeping such important health information on your calendar, it seems safe to give the drug at regular intervals other than monthly. But it doesn't seem probable that many of us are going to chart daily outside temperatures during the winter months.

The usual recommendation to give a consistent dose monthly is more likely to be remembered by most people. It's all about routine and what's best for your dog's welfare.

Do the research before you make a decision. Discuss it with your vet. And consider the risks to your family pets.

# Sampling at Chevron begins

Recently released data from the quarterly sampling of monitoring wells near the Village Food and Fuel Shell Station continue to detect smaller amounts of hydrocarbons in the soil at the station and nearby.

Last month, additional sampling also began near the Chevron station. "We previously approved a work plan for eight monitoring wells at the Chevron, four of which were installed in April," said Sharon Boltinghouse, public health professional geologist for the Riverside County Department of Environmental Health. "Due to limited cleanup fund budget for this site, only half of the wells were able to be installed. The remaining wells will be installed as soon as the fund increases the budget for this site.

The March sampling at the monitoring wells at and near the Shell station (Village Food and Fuel) detected small amounts of hydrocarbons. The level from monitoring well 1 was 1.22 micrograms per liter  $(\mu/L)$  the lowest volume since 2011.

While detectable amounts of benzene, ethylbenzene and xylems were recorded from the onsite monitoring well MW-4, these were also

low and none were detected in the off-site monitoring wells.

While concentrations of methyl-tertiary-butyl ethane (MTBE) are significantly lower than the maximum recorded, this was still levels detected during this sampling event in onsite well MW-4 (3.66 ug/L), down-gradient wells MW-5 (16.0 ug/L), MW-10 (2,990 ug/L) and MW-12 (28.1), cross-gradient wells MW-6 (8.29 ug/L) and MW-13 (3 12 ug/L), and up-gradient well MW-15 (4,670 ug/L). MTBE was not detected in onsite wells MW-1 through MW-3.

Robert Manning, the engineering geologist conducting the monitoring, concluded, "It is our opinion the detected MTRE in on-site well MW-4 and off-site wells MW-5, MW-6, MW-10, MW-12, MW-13 and MW-15 is derived from the Idyllwild Chevron located approximately 160 feet north (up gradient) of

"If the investigation of the Chevron station indicates the contaminate source of MWs 5, 6, 10,12, 13 and is the Chevron site, the subject site [Village Food and Fuel] should be considered for closure," Manning recommended.

Vacant parcels need, and are also required, to be abated. As long as the work is within 100 feet of a structure it qualifies for the grant money, Scott advised. The grant will pay 65 percent of the cost and the balance, 35 percent is the property owner's share.

A recent U.S. Forest Service report, "Wildfire, Wildlands, and People: Understanding and Preparing for Wildfire in the Wildland-Urban Interface," urges residents to proactively abate property in communities adjacent to forests.

Research has demonstrated the success of abatement

\$70,000 is still available to and creation of "defensible space" in reducing the threat of wild fires and diminishing their intensity if they start.

"Communities with robust wildfire prevention programs are likely to have fewer human-caused wildfires. In addition, fire intensity is dramatically reduced in areas where restoration work has occurred," U.S. Forest Service Chief Tom Tidwell said.

According to Forest Service research, "Some of the greatest barriers to action include the lack of time, money, assistance and technical knowledge," all of which the local FSC can provide to help the property owner, which subsequently benefits the entire community, Scott stressed.

# Fern Valley water board accepts pipeline bid

The board of the Fern Valley Water District voted to accept an \$845,440 bid from T.A. Rivard Inc. of Riverside for the district's pipeline replacement project. The project will replace pipelines on Fern Valley, Howland and Encino Roads and is expected to be completed in the middle of September. Total cost of the project is nearly \$1.1 million of which the Rivard bid is part and project supervision and contingency costs make up the rest.

est responsible bid, \$30,000 less than the nearest competitor, El-Co Contractors, with whom the district has long done business. Director Robert Krieger recommended accepting the bid because it was the lowest responsible bid, conformed to guideline requirements, and that Rivard is a long-established business.

Albert A. Webb Associates. the civil engineering and planning firm that has long worked with the district to perform project studies and create drawings, plans and permits, drew up the Fern

specifications and recommended the district award the bid to Rivard as the lowest responsible bidder.

General Manager Steve Erler recommended Webb also be contracted to provide construction administration and inspection since district staff is limited at this time. The proposed Webb contract would total \$87,750. At the suggestion of director Krieger, the board authorized Erler to negotiate with Webb to see what functions district staff might still be able to perform in cooperation with Webb

amount.

In his general manager report, Erler said staff installed 36 new ventilation caps on tank 11, which has been the target of numerous water taste and odor complaints. Erler said the caps would provide more uniform ventilation than the single center vent they replaced.

Rivard submitted the low- Valley pipeline replacement that could lessen the contract will be placed back in service. for a net loss of more than \$635,000. The expenses are higher next year to cover the cost of the pipeline replacement contract.

> District reserves, which currently stand at \$1.46 million, would be used to balance the budget, leaving district reserves at end of fiscal 2013-14 at \$785,000 if all taxes come in as projected, according to office manager Jessica Priefer.

\$1,200 and \$1,500 monthly, according to Buchanan, or about \$14,000 to \$18,000 annually.

# Goldspotted oak borer inspections continue

11 trees positively identified; more possible

The current count of Goldspotted oak borer infested trees stands at 11, with the majority of those in Idyllwild. On Friday, May 18, crews removed a large infested oak in Pine Cove in the 23000 block of Pine Needles Lane Because of the size of the oak and proximity to a residence, a crane had to be used as part of the removal process.

The present CAL FIRE GSOB program pays for 100 percent removal of diseased GSOB trees. Funds are federal dollars, called a State Fire Assistance grant, and are awarded to Riverside County for hazardous fuel reduction, according to CAL FIRE Forester Chief Gregg Bratcher. There are two caveats important to local property owners: if CAL FIRE removes the trees using designated grant money, all wood must be taken away from the site. No firewood would be left for landowner. Also, grant funds, unless reauthorized, end in September, after which, landowners

would be responsible for cost of infested oak removal. Removal costs, depending on tree size, location and necessary equipment can range from \$1,500 to \$3,000.

As local oaks begin growing new leaves, Mountain Community Fire Safe Council Goldspotted oak borer inspection teams have another element to check on their inspection forms canopy health. Comparative leafiness of an oak's crown, thin and spotty compared to other oaks in the same area with more robust canopies, is one indicator of an ailing tree. FSC Teams have already inspected 212 oaks on 44 area properties.

Last week, Pat Boss and Don Patterson inspected two black oaks on Hemstreet Place. The older and larger of the two, showed sufficient markers, including thinning canopy and at least five Dshaped exit holes, that the team marked it for subsequent CAL FIRE inspection. The tree was old, around 200 years thought Patterson, already hollowing out on one side and showing signs

of overall general weakness. The smaller tree, although adjacent, showed no obvious signs of Goldspotted oak borer infestation. Boss estimated the candidate tree is less than a mile from the oak across from the American Legion that was removed, and is arguably part of that same micro zone of infesta-

But Boss noted Goldspotted oak borer beetles are not known to fly long distances or move too far from a tree that is still productively hosting them. So how this tree became infected, whether from firewood brought in, or from nearby beetles is unknown.

What is known is that older, larger black oaks, already in a weakened state, are strong candidates for Goldspotted oak borer occupation. Local property owners with black oaks

should check tree canopies, a more obvious indicia of tree decline, than others used by FSC inspection teams. If your tree canopy looks thin and is not fully filled out, contact the GSOB hotline to arrange an inspec-

Forest Service Entomologist and lead GSOB researcher Tom Coleman advises concerned property owners who want to learn about current science in combatting Goldspotted oak borer should consult "Pest Notes" at www.gsob.org. At a recent Idyllwild GSOB education session, the "take home" message on one of the featured slides was: "read the GSOB Pest Note; there is no silver bullet for managing GSOB; ground surveys can be very effective for detecting GSOB; current insecticide research has been effective in the lab (but not

yet in the field); grinding or tarping firewood can eliminate GSOB populations (if the tarping is secure and won't develop holes); leave wood on site for two years before moving it (two years is the length of time GSOB can survive in firewood) and bio-control research is ongoing."

University of California Riverside's Mark Hoddle, who works with Coleman on Goldspotted oak borer research, was asked about bio-control and whether there are current native California enemies effective against the beetle. Goldspotted oak borer predators found in Arizona ("parasitoids") that attack the beetle's eggs and larvae and seem to hold it in check are not effective in California, according to Hoddle, in stemming the advance of Goldspotted oak borer.

"Parasitism levels appear to be low in Arizona, based on the limited surveys we have done. This low level of attack is unlikely to be sufficient to effectively control GSOB in California," Hoddle believes. "Native [California] oaks have not co-evolved with a wood boring beetle like GSOB [as can be reached at oaks have in Arizona] and

they [California oaks] might therefore be very sensitive to this kind of attack. So a combination of low levels of parasitoid and predator activity and host plant resistance [in Arizona] in combination may be what holds GSOB at low levels."

Regarding if and when Goldspotted oak borer enemies from Arizona could be introduced into California, Hoddle said, "No natural enemies will be introduced from Arizona to California until we have run safety tests on bio-control agents that we think have the potential to be useful. These studies will take years to complete in quarantine if we start them."

Tree removal is the most effective way to currently stop spread to additional trees. Some insecticide sprays have shown effectiveness in laboratory tests. And firewood from a diseased tree must be tarped and sealed in such a way that beetles cannot emerge for a two year period. During that time, firewood should not be moved.



# Reyna Grande recounts her immigration odyssey at author series

'What we gained and what we lost'

After a well-attended successful launch of his third annual Idvllwild Author Series, Eduardo Santiago next presents Reyna Grande, author of "The Distance Between Us" (Atria Books, 2012).

Grande recounts in her memoir how, when she was two, her family life was devastated by the departure of first her father, then her

# Idyllwild County Park flora upadate ...

On Friday, May 10, Tom Chester, Keir Morse, Adrienne Balway and I conducted a botany survey of Forest Service roads 5s06, 5s10, and a bit of 5s09 between and including Idyllwild and Pine Cove.

I advertised this as a four-mile one way hike. Since we added no additional participants from my invitation, we were free to

roam around at will. Our four-mile hike turned out to be more like six miles, but it was well worth the extra effort.

> This area has recently been heavily thinned as part of a fuel reduction project. Botanically speaking, the big winners are Scarlet bugler (Penstemon



centranthifolius) and Chaparral whitethorn (Ceanothus leucodermis) which are now thriving as a result of the open canopy.

In my humble opinion Chaparral whitethorn is just as beautiful as Lilac, and we reveled in their

fragrance wafted on the breeze.

Residents of Idyllwild will recognize

the open grassy spaces.

Less conspicuous is Oak violet (Viola purpurea ssp.

One of our off-road excursions was to look for Giant chain fern (Woodwardia fimbriata) at a location where I had seen them previously. As the name implies this is the largest fern found in the San Jacintos with leaves up to 9 feet long.


Following that we diverted from the main route to walk the road through Alvin Meadow. The meadow turned out to be a veritable garden of non-native

weeds.

One of Keir's goals was to locate Galium californicum ssp. primum a rare plant that is very difficult to distinguish from other members of its genus. It makes its home in this area and is sometimes called Alvin Meadow Bedstraw. He collected lots of photos in order to study it.

one can see Indian milkweed (Asclepias eriocarpa), but at the lower elevations you may be lucky to spot its showier cousin California milkweed (Asclepias californica). Tom caught this amazing image of its flowers.

Beyond the meadow the road climbs through a steep section of south-facing chaparral. Here the plant community

changes dramatically. Some characteristics plants include



Bush poppy (Dendromecon rigida).

Another is Canyon sweet pea (Lathyrus vestitus var. vestitus). If you can find this at a native plant nursery I highly recommend you landscape

with this instead of the pink non-native Perennial sweet pea.

Another of Keir's goals was to photograph Long-flowered threadplant (Nemacladus longiflorus var.longiflorus). He had seen it before but had no photographs.

We looked for it recently in Garner Valley with no success. I pointed out a place where I had seen it in a past year, and voila! There it was. As the

three of us continued along the road he lagged behind



to photograph the tiny plants and received a scare from a dead rattlesnake.


At the top of the climb, the road once again enters the pine forest.

The biggest surprise for me came late in the day in



a lush roadside bank just below my house in Pine Cove. The usual suspects were there including Baby blue eyes (Nemophila menziesii var. menziesii). They range in color from deep blue to white.

Then I spotted something I had never seen there before. Both Tom and Keir recognized it right away as Longspurred plectritis (Plectritis ciliosa

ssp. insignis). While not an uncommon taxon, it has not been recorded in Idyllwild since 1927, and this spot is the highest elevation occurrence in the San Jacintos.

Adding to the enjoyment of the day was the fact that this was the first time Adrienne had botanized the San Jacintos, so everything here was new and exciting to her especially

the Snow plants (Sarcodes sanguinea).

All together we recorded j u s t short of 200 plant taxa.

Nature Center and checked on the state of the lilies there. On that day, some water was still in the creek.




This was the only location on the Creek which I checked.
