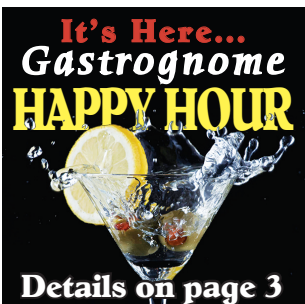

IWD losing directors and management

Were the posted signs demanding resignations of three Idyllwild Water District directors and a new general manager the reason chaos has arrived at the district's door step?

From Monday to Friday, Tom Lynch, the general manager, Jim Billman, the president

of the board of directors and Mike Freitas, a board director, all submitted their resignations.

As of this week, the IWD board is composed of three directors, John Cook, the acting president, Steve Kunkle and June Rockwell, both elected in August 2015. No acting general manager has been appointed.

Lynch's resignation was submitted to Cook

on Monday, Sept. 12. Lynch offered no reason for his abrupt decision. The terse statement also informed Cook that Billman was resigning. Late Friday, Freitas independently announced his resignation.

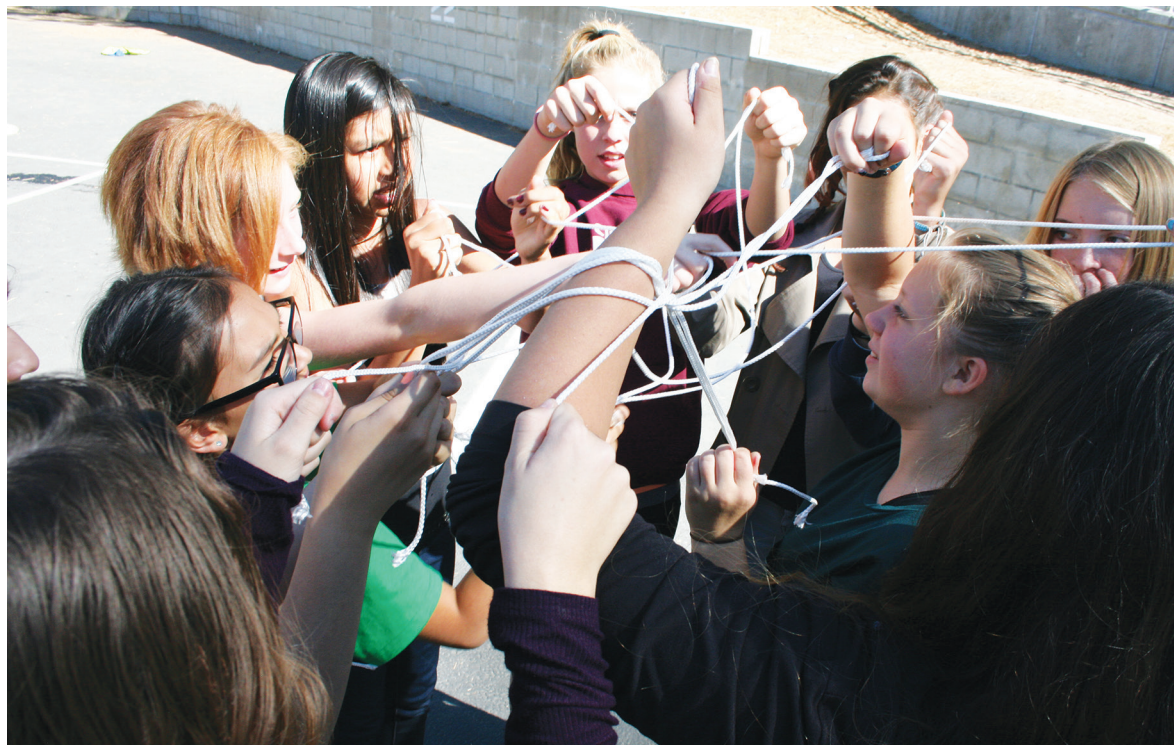
No explanation has been given for the spate of resignations. Lynch was under fire for his comment that his State Water Treatment

Middle school Youth Grantmakers begin year 5

Twenty-one sixth through eighth grade Idyllwild Middle School students attended the first after-school session of the Idyllwild Youth Grantmakers on Thursday, Sept. 15. They will attend eight two-hour after school sessions learning to be philanthropists and community volunteers. This marks the beginning of the fifth year of this groundbreaking program that teaches young people how to give back to their community.

The Community Foundation of Riverside and San Bernardino launched the program for high school students in 2009 in the Riverside area. They decided to offer it to Idyllwild Middle School in 2012 with support from the Idyllwild Community Fund Advisory Committee. For the first three years, ICF assisted Community Foundation representatives in providing after school instructional sessions for the students.

Then in 2015, Community Foundation priorities changed and

Weather Service lowers chance of La Niña

Neutral weather more likely now

Although Christmas is still months away, the National Weather Service is offering a potential gift to Southern California for this winter.

Earlier this month, the NWS announced that its weather models "more strongly favor an ENSO-neutral" winter weather pattern. During the spring and summer, the NWS was forecast-

ing a possible "La Niña" weather pattern. Typically, La Niña weather patterns produce less rainfall than normal. Since the excessive rain forecast for last winter's El Niño never materialized, the neutral or normal weather possibility is a much better opportunity than a La Niña pattern. Currently the neutral condition has a 55 to 60 percent probability to occur during the fall and winter of 2016-17. "Overall the combined ocean and atmosphere system continues to reflect [a likelihood of] neutral," the announcement said. JP Crumrine can be reached at jp@towncrier.com.

Three local high school girls in injury crash

Three local female students, on their way to Hemet High School, were injured in an over-the-side crash on Highway 74 west of McCall Park Road in Mountain Center.

California Highway Patrol Officer Mike Murawski, on scene of the crash, provided the following information. At sometime before 7:30 a.m. on Monday, Sept. 19, Jennifer Rivera, 18, of Pine Cove was driving her parents' white Honda Civic westbound on Highway 74 when, according to Rivera's statement, she swerved to the right to avoid an eastbound vehicle that had crossed into

her lane. In the vehicle with Rivera were two 16-year-old female student companions. The abrupt swerve to the right forced Rivera's vehicle over the side of the embankment. Murawski said CHP is still investigating Rivera's report of an oncoming vehicle that crossed into her lane and that information could not be confirmed at this time. The CHP report indicated Rivera was unlicensed at the time of the crash. Airbags deployed in the incident and the damage to Rivera's vehicle was greatest on the driver's side. Murawski's report said the vehicle hit an obstacle, possibly a

pine tree, as it was dropping over the embankment. Rivera was transported by Mercy Air to Desert Regional with serious injuries and the two others, with less serious injuries according to the initial report, were transported by ground ambulance, one to Desert Regional and one to Riv-

erside County Regional Medical Center. According to the Riverside County Fire Department report, firefighters arrived on the scene to find one vehicle approximately twenty feet over the side with one patient trapped inside. Firefighters were able to extricate the trapped patient. Cal Fire's report listed injuries to the two minor females as moderate and minor. CHP Officer Murawski, after visiting the girls in the respective hospitals, confirmed that the injuries sustained by the girls were not life-threatening. MDP presents earthquake speaker

Southern California
has multiple fault lines

Earthquakes are a major threat for Hill residents. Not only fire, but shaking ground can cause a significant emergency for those people living on the Hill.

The Mountain Disaster Preparedness group is focused on preparing and responding to disasters that might occur on the Hill. While fire threats dominate our summer and fall thoughts, other emergencies such as flooding and earthquakes can happen, and we need to be prepared for the consequences of those events, too. Last September, the MDP meeting about the early notice of looming El Niño flooding filled the Idyllwild Library conference room.

On Saturday Oct. 1, MDP is hosting a meeting for local residents to hear and ask questions of an earthquake specialist. The session begins at 11 a.m., at the Idyllwild Fire Station.

Margaret Vinci, from the California Institute of Technology, will discuss issues concerning the prepa-

ration for and the recovery from a significant earthquake.

Her topics will include what it means to live in earthquake areas, why we have so many in Southern California, what causes the earth to shake, what we need to prepare for an earthquake, secondary effects such as liquefaction and land slides and several others related how to survive a significant earthquake and how to recover from it.

"No matter where we live in [Southern California], there is a risk of an earthquake," Vinci said. "I want to empower people to be self-sufficient. Emergency responders will take care of thousands in any disaster, but not everyone."

Her presentation focuses on the results of a 7.8 magnitude quake occurring on the San Andreas fault. This scenario has been one of the most studied possibilities.

"If a 7.8 magnitude quake happened, what happens to electricity and for how long? What do you do with no cell phone?" are some of the questions that Vinci wants to answer for the attendees.

She has been with Cal Tech for 23 years and is currently the manager of the Office of Earthquake Programs.

Both Feyder and Vinci remind readers that the great Shake Out will be at 10:20 a.m., Oct. 20. "It's an opportunity for everybody to plan," Vinci urged registration at www.shakeout.org/california.

Pinyon arson suspect committed to healthcare program

Traci Farley, charged with 13 counts of arson, was committed to the Liberty Healthcare program during proceedings Wednesday, Sept. 14.

Farley was arrested in June. But at her first court hearing, the judge asked for medical reviews of her competence to stand trial on the arson charges.

At her Aug. 31 hearing, the judge determined, based on the two medical consultations, that Farley was not competent to stand trial. He then referred the situation to the County Mental health agency for a recommendation on Farley's placement.

Judge Jerome Brock

committed Farley to Liberty and asked the director whether Farley could be assigned to a local county oil treatment facility. He also asked for an assessment if she was suitable for treatment at the Liberty program. The Liberty program director will report back to the court in about two weeks.

The court also mandated that no antipsychotic medication may be administered to Farley without her consent. Brock ruled that Farley has the capacity to make this decision.

Regardless of Farley's final disposition, Brock ordered commitment to three years or less. And she was given credit for serving 161 days of the sentence.

Marcus Green hearing moved to November

Marcus Green's felony settlement conference on Sept. 16 was re-scheduled for Friday, Nov. 18.

Green, 51, of Thermal, was the driver of a car that went over the side of Highway 74 in May and resulted in the death of a 5-month-old child. The district attorney's office has filed two felony charges — murder and willful child cruelty — as well as gross domestic violence.

The judge set his bail at \$1.86 million. His appeal for a bail reduction was denied at a June hearing.

I'm on vacation, so this week's column comes from Mr. Clark.

Idyllwild Water District, usually composed of five directors, is now down to three: John Cook, Steve Kunkle and June Rockwell. What does this mean, in terms of IWD's ability to conduct board business?

California Water Code section 71274 reads as follows: "A majority of the board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business; however, no ordinance, motion or resolution shall be passed to become effective without the affirmative vote of a majority of the members of the board."

IWD Director John Cook reads this to mean that, with the IWD board now down to only three directors, business can be conducted with three directors, but nothing can be passed without a majority of the *original* board members — which would be all three existing board members — in agreement.

Others read that same section to mean that business can be conducted with the three directors, but nothing can be passed without a majority of the *existing* board members — which would be two of the three existing board members — in agreement.

Still others have argued that two directors is now "the majority of the board" and therefore the quorum, and that, again, a majority of the existing board is all that's required to pass business.

Meanwhile, Government Code section 1780 provides, in relevant part: "Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a vacancy in any elective office on the governing board of a special district ... shall be filled pursuant to this section." And that section provides that the remaining three members of the board may fill the two board vacancies by their own appointment, as in subdivision (d) of that section, or by calling a special election pursuant to subdivision (e). And subdivision (f) provides that if the existing board does not do either, then within 60 days of the director vacancies, the county board of supervisors may either appoint new directors or order a special election.

Of course, this entire issue may become moot if the three existing members of the board should all happen to agree on how to proceed.

It will be very interesting to follow how this all comes out.

My impression is that Pine Cove would rather secede from California than join its water board with ours, but how about Fern Valley?

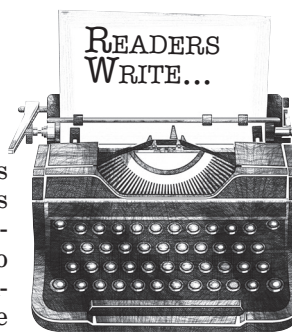
Fern Valley has a very competent general manager, and we need one, with this also being a rare moment when the salary could be shared by both entities.

You're gonna love this one!

Mildred Kent is 94. She lives in assisted living just outside Detroit.

This is a delightful lady who happens to be the mother of my brother-in-law and dear friend, Jim. I have known them for more than 40 years as I grew up in Chicago and my wife, Kate, is from Michigan.

Kate is half Italian and prides herself on her pasta sauce. I pride myself on mine. Through all these years, Jim has been telling me about the sauce his mom always made while growing up.

Before I break the secret and give you the recipe, I want to tell you a little about the Kent clan. There are no finer people. The Kents lived in a small home in a city outside Detroit. The father worked for Ford his whole life. Mildred's mom was from England and lived with them until she passed away, still cleaning and helping until over 100 years old.

Five brothers, two parents and the grandma all shared a tiny three-bedroom home with a basement. And one bathroom, that's right just one bathroom!

In the years of my early marriage, I visited Michigan often from Chicago to see my wife's family and to visit with Jim and Kate's sister. On most visits I would go to the Kents' home to visit his mom and dad, and younger brother David. Always hearing about this special spaghetti sauce, and despite promises of getting to taste it, it just never came to pass.

About a month ago on a short trip back east in order to eat my way through Detroit and visit Jim and some old haunts, we stopped in to see Mildred where she now lives in a wonderful facility. She's sharp as a tack and we had a great time. Then I recalled the "sauce."

After I badgered Jim, he solicited his brothers for info and we finally got the recipe. His brother Ron's wife, Colleen, had it committed to memory and on notes. Ron said his mom referred to it as "poor man's spaghetti," as it was inexpensive, easy to prepare and could feed a tribe of their size without breaking the bank.

Although I regret not having "Millie's" (as I call her)

actual preparation, I have the recipe.

I made it and it was terrific. JP tried it and liked it too, probably with beer. It has a base of Campbell's soup. Don't let that concern you, it's really good. Years ago that soup was a nickel a can. Last week it was on sale at Fairway for 88 cents — still a bargain.

So, here you go.

Mildred Kent's Spaghetti Sauce

INGREDIENTS:

- 1lb. ground chuck or similar
- 2 cans Campbell's tomato soup (10-oz. cans)
- 1 can tomato sauce (15 oz.)
- 1 medium-size yellow onion, chopped
- ½ medium green bell pepper (cut into 4-5 strips)
- 4-5 cloves garlic, chopped
- ½ cup celery, chopped
- 2 bay leaves
- 1 tsp. black pepper
- 1 Tbs. basil, dried or fresh
- 1 Tbs. oregano
- 1 tsp. sugar
- 1 tsp. butter
- 20 oz. water (more or less to your liking, start with this)

PREPARATION:

Brown the meat and onion. Stir in remaining ingredients. Bring to boil, then simmer for at least one hour on low to medium heat.

Discard bay leaves and serve with spaghetti or your favorite pasta. Garnish with grated Parmesan cheese if you like.

History can repeat itself with this simple and really great sauce that everyone will love. Let me know how it goes.

And, Millie, I hope you enjoy this article, and I look forward to visiting for your 100th birthday party!

Fire officials still concerned about dying trees

Emergency warning system operational

Still in the middle of fire season, local fire officials were able to hold their quarterly Mountain Area Safety Taskforce meeting last week; however, they moved through the agenda quickly.

No reports or issues regarding local fires were presented. But Cal Fire Battalion Chief Greg Bratcher emphasized concern about the gold spotted oak borer infestation of local oak trees and pines continuing to die from the drought and bark beetle.

Southern California Edison reported that its contractors were removing about 65 to 70 trees per month. But these all presented threats to SCE's power lines, and were not necessarily any oaks that had been damaged by the GSOB.

Bratcher added that the number of oak trees with GSOB infestation had now crossed the century mark.

If local residents or property owners are worried about their oaks, the GSOB hotline is 951-659-8328. The Mountain Community Fire Safe Council will have the trees inspected for possible infestation.

Kayanna Warren, forester on the San Jacinto Ranger District, said, "We've found a few more trees over the summer." She also encouraged neighbors of the forest to alert the District Ranger's office if they believe some oaks have been infested.

Edwina Scott, the MCFSC's executive director, said they are beginning to recruit additional GSOB inspectors. "We hope to have two teams. And we encourage volunteers even if they only can give a one year commitment."

Roland Gaebert, vice president of the Mile High Radio club, reported that the group is upgrading its transmitter and improving antennae to increase the range for WNKI, the local emergency radio station. The goal remains to cover the area from southern Garner Valley to Poppet Flats in the north.

During the agency portion, Bratcher reported that Cal Fire has some piles to burn near the Stone Creek fuels reduction area and emphasized that a good rainfall will be needed before this projected is begun.

And Idyllwild Fire Chief Patrick Reitz reported that the district had discovered several illegal burns within the district. "They thought because it was cold in the evenings it was safe to burn," he said.

The final agency report was from Jerry Hagen of the County's Emergency Management Division, who shared that the new Early Warning Notification System contract had been awarded and implemented.

He urged residents who have not already registered a phone number to receive emergency calls to go to the website, www.rivcoready.org/EWNS, and register a home phone or cell phone.

"If you signed up with the old system, you're already in the system unless you have a new phone or number," he stated.

IFPD tax advance before board of supervisors

In an early morning special meeting, a majority of the Idyllwild Fire Protection District commission approved an agreement between the district and Riverside County regarding the request for the county to advance some property tax revenue to the district.

Approval of the tax advance was on the board of supervisor's agenda for its

Sept. 20 meeting. It had been on the July 12 agenda but was pulled at the last minute.

The agreement, itself, is very similar to the agreements from previous years when the tax advance occurred, such as last year.

"Our first and only agenda item is approval of the agreement required by the county to be approved at [tomorrow's] board meeting," stated Chair Jerry Buchanan. And the fire

commission approved it 3-0. Commissioners Larry Donahoo and Nancy Layton were excused from the meeting.

The agreement specifies the term (July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017), the transfer of funds will occur within one week of the county board of supervisor's signature and the district's agreement to pay interest of about \$1,860.

The major change in the agreement from the

July version was lowering the interest repayment by about \$440 from \$2,300.

"We weren't notified that the advancement wasn't approved," Fire Chief Patrick Reitz said.

"We are in a situation that we can make payroll, but then have to manage everything else we do," Buchanan said.

The agreement was pulled from the July agenda because of questions regarding IFPD's payment

of its charges for dispatch service from the county. While Reitz acknowledged the payments had not been paid, he stated there had been questions and the county never notified the district that the item would be dropped from the supervisors' agenda.

"This has been corrected," he assured the commission.

In previous years, the IFPD resolution authorizing the tax advance re-

quest had been sufficient for the board of supervisors to act. This is the first year that the county has required IFPD to separately approve the agreement.

After the vote, Buchanan indicated that the district may explore the option of obtaining a line of credit in the future to avoid the delays posed by the county.

Prop 55 would extend Prop 30 temporary tax hikes for the wealthy

In 2012, voters approved Proposition 30 that temporarily raised two types of California taxes – a quarter percent (from 7.25 to 7.5 percent) increase in state sales tax for four years, and graduated income tax hikes of one to three percent for seven years on high earners, with money raised directed to education funding.

Proposition 55 (Tax Extension to Fund Education and Healthcare) proposes to extend those temporary hikes for an additional 12 years and direct money raised to education (K-12 and community colleges) as well as health care for low income individuals ("healthcare services that qualify for matching federal funds" – Medi-Cal and other eligible programs).

Prop 55 contains language requiring strict accountability and transparency standards and gives local school districts control of how money is to be spent. The sales tax increase would sunset at the end of 2016 and not be extended.

With the 2012 passage of Prop 30, on single incomes from \$263 thousand to \$316 thousand and joint from \$526 thousand to \$632 thousand, the tax increase was one percent (from 9.3% to 10.3%); on single incomes from \$316 thousand to \$526 thousand and joint from \$632 thousand to \$1.053 million, it was two percent (from 9.3 percent to 11.3 percent.); and on single incomes over \$526 thousand and joint over \$1.053 million the increase was three percent (from 9.3 to 12.3 percent). The measure passed by 55 to 45 percent.

According to the Prop 55 text, "All revenues from this measure are subject to local audit every year, and audit by the independent controller to ensure they will be used only for the purposes set forth in this measure."

The non-partisan California Legislative Analyst's Office notes the extension affects roughly 1.5 percent of state taxpayers, those with the highest incomes.

LAO notes passage of Prop 55 would increase income tax revenues from \$4 to \$9 billion annually. Income taxes provide about two thirds of all general fund revenues, according to the LAO, and education funding consumes over half of the \$122 billion state budget.

Roughly half of the revenue raised by Prop 55 would go to Increased funding for K-12 and community colleges. And if general fund revenues annually exceed constitutionally required education spending and costs of government programs that were in place as of Jan. 1, 2016, then 50 percent of the excess (up to \$2 billion annually) would be allocated to Medi-Cal. Generated new Medi-Cal revenues would be additional and not replace existing general fund support for the program.

LAO also notes passage of the measure could produce increased budget reserves of between \$60 billion to \$1.5 billion each year depending primarily upon stock market activity.

Proponents argue that Prop 55 is not a tax hike, merely an extension of existing temporary taxes on the state's highest earners (1.5 percent of those paying income taxes) and does not affect the vast majority of state taxpayers. They note this is also a tax reduction (through expiration of the temporary sales tax extension). They also argue that rapid reverses in economic conditions can occur unexpectedly, based on national or international events, and that budget reserves should be increased from present levels to deal with such exigencies.

Opponents argue that Prop 30 was intended to be temporary and that a commitment is a commitment. Governor Jerry Brown, who touted Prop 30 as a temporary tax hike, has not specifically endorsed Prop 55 stating that it is for the people to decide. Opponents also argue that Prop 55 is a "band aid" on a tax structure that needs fundamental overhaul. They note too that the extension is not necessary and that education, healthcare and state government can be ade-

quately funded without the addition funds this measure provides. They argue that a state budget deficit of \$12 billion in 2012 has been turned into into a \$2.7 billion surplus in 2016 and that amount is a sufficient reserve to cover potential future budget emergencies. They argue too that passage of Prop 55 would be a "job killer" and continue an undue burden on small business owners who often pay business taxes as part of personal income tax and could therefore be affected by this extension.

The lineup of supporting and opposing organizations falls, to some degree, along past political and interest lines. In support are the state Democratic Party, League of Women Voters, California Federation of Teachers, California Labor Federation, California State PTA, California League of Conservation Voters, California State Firefighters Association and numerous school and college boards throughout the state.

In opposition are the California Republican Party, the California Chamber of Commerce, the National Federation of Independent Businesses, the California Taxpayers Association and the Howard Jarvis Taxpayers Association.

Water usage jumps in Fern Valley

Water consumption increased significantly in the Fern Valley Water District during the July and August billing period. This year, FVWD customers used about 8.1 million gallons, which was 1.8 million or 30 percent more than during July and August 2015. The end of summer demand was about 2.3 million gallons greater than the May and June usage.

The other two local water districts — Idyllwild and Pine Cove — both experienced greater water consumption this summer, too.

The last billing period in which FVWD customers used that much water was three years ago — July and August 2013 — when 9.5 million gallons were consumed.

The lack of rain and greater demand increased greater reliance on groundwater. During August, about 55 percent of the water came from the district's wells com-

pared to 43 percent a year ago.

"Tahquitz Creek is shutting down," said General Manager Victor Jimenez. "We're relying on wells now as much as last year."

Board President James Rees asked if the increased consumption was due to the summer temperatures.

"There are a lot of factors. The heat, a lot of outdoor watering," replied Jimenez.

The power outage in July appeared to contribute to the increased watering, he added. The loss of power may have re-set many timers for automatic sprinkler systems.

"We had several bills much higher and upset customers," he said. "But after discussing the timer issue, they checked and agreed and re-set them again."

When Director Robert Krieger asked if the staff tested meters to determine the problem and who is responsible, Jimenez replied, "Yes, we work with the people and trouble shoot. One problem took two to five days to resolve, but not two months."

Jimenez also mentioned that he intended to examine the option of replacing the FVWD customer meters. The manufacturer and pricing will be a couple of issues that will affect his decision and recommendation.

When Board President Jim Rees asked if he might use the same brand of meters that the Idyllwild Water District uses, Jimenez firmly replied, "No." He noted several differences between the two districts' meters and also problems that he encountered with the manufacturer of the meters IWD uses while he was at El Monte.

Jimenez reported that the district's auditors had completed a preliminary audit. He recommended that the board establish an audit committee to meet with the team and hear the results before presenting the final audit to the board.

The members of the new finance committee will be directors Richard Schnetzer, Charles Wix and Krieger. They intend to convene with the audit team prior to the district's October meeting.

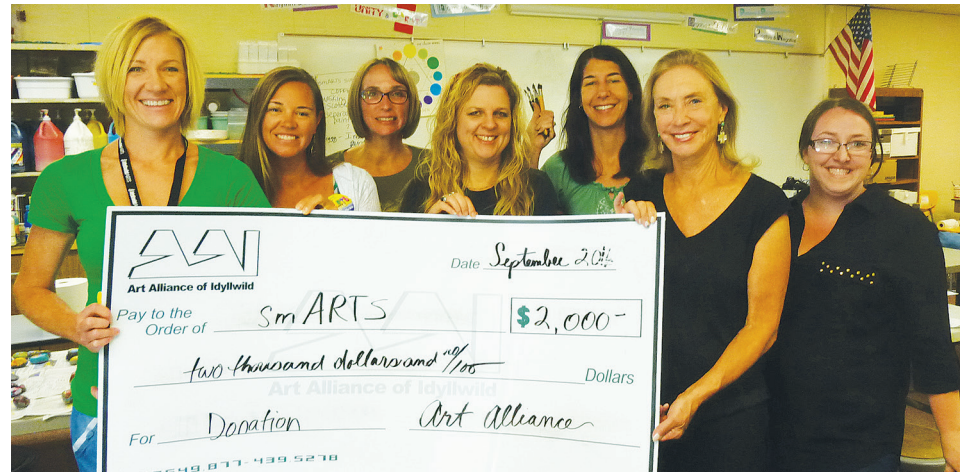

Business changes continue to redefine Idyllwild

In Idyllwild's commercial core, businesses come, go, and change ownership and business models. Staying profitable in a small town that depends on both local support and tourist dollars is demanding.

Two businesses, both art-based, are closing shop – Lightbender Art Studios on Highway 243 and Jerry Art in Oakwood Village.

A third is changing its business model and its name. Luis Solis and brother Manny have, in one week's time, closed their Jade Mountain Asian Bistro on Highway 243 and reopened in the same location as Tacos Los Gorditos, a Mexican taco and delicacy restaurant focused on providing customers quality food in a fast counter service mode

from 9 a.m. until 9 p.m.

After 9 p.m. on Friday and Saturday, Solis said the focus shifts to a full service based restaurant, with Mexican entertainment and karaoke with a late closing. Special delicacies include aguachiles, camarones, octopus and campechana (shrimp, octopus and oysters mixed with pico de gallo).

Tacos are across the board in variety including some not usually found – salmon or shrimp, surf and turf, beef tongue or beef tripe, and crunchy cheese. Tortillas are made on site and lard is not used in cooking. Domestic and imported beers are served along with specialty agua fresca varieties - horchata, Jamaica and tamarindo. Weekend specialties include menudo, pozole and birria.

Said Solis, "Our Mexican culture is very warm and friendly. We wanted to create an ambience and menu that reflects that. This is food and a culture we know very well."

Solis said Jade Mountain might return in the future at a different location when he can put a team in place to provide management and the restaurant's varied Asian cuisine. "Right now all our focus is on Los Gorditos," said Solis. He noted all menu entries, including breakfast, can be had throughout the day. Solis and family also own The Lumber Mill and Fratello's.

At the end of March, David Schnalzer and family bought the building and business opportunity of the well-established Idyllwild Automotive on lower Pine Crest Avenue across from the old county library location. "We want people to know we're locally owned and are here to serve the community," said Carli Nichols. The family also

Library event is more than a 'sing-along'

The Friends of the Idyllwild Library will present a program featuring the talents of noted musician and singer Marc Black in the library's Community Room from 1 to 3 p.m. Monday, Sept. 26, focusing on American popular music of the 1950s and 1960s.

The two decades following the end of World War II ushered in tremendous changes in America's musical environment, due to several forces in action: the growth of the "baby boomer generation" and the parallel growth in the music industry's recording and distribution facilities. This change involved the spread of folk, country/Western and ethnic musical forms as well as the rock 'n' roll phenomenon.

By the end of that 20-year period, virtually every radio and television program devoted to music had explored every one of these forms, and every listener and viewer were made aware that (to quote Bob Dylan) the times were a-changing.

American history — whether protest movements such as the civil rights struggle, or the results of teen angst — was reflected in the lyrics in many popular songs, and Black's presentation is intended to take the audience right along on the historic route, principally through its own participation in that journey. Note that this will not be your usual "sing-along." Discussion, as well as vocalizing, also will be encouraged.

Black's career began in his high school years (in the late

1960s) as a member of the band "Blades of Grass" and continued as a solo folk/blues performer and recording artist. Cited by the American Library Association for his production on the album "American Children" in the 1980s, and recently engaged in a multimedia effort called "Sing for the Silenced," in addition to his lectures and other tours, he has become one of the more interesting performers in the country, and Idyllwild Library is lucky to have him here on relatively short notice.

This is a free event — light refreshment will be available, so bring your hearts, minds and voices together, and sing out.

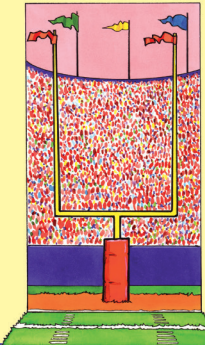

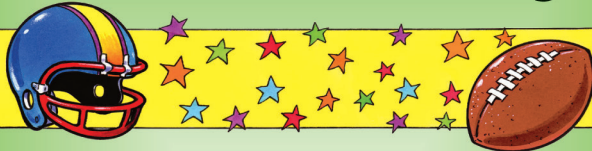


The Football Field

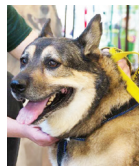

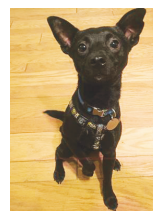

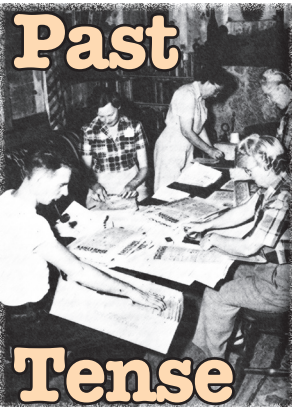

60 years ago - 1956

Nearly 400 county educators, administrators and groups concerned with education held an all-day meeting on the campus of the Arts Foundation (now Idyllwild Arts).

55 years ago - 1961

Idyllwild's reputation as a creative center got a boost from a new art factory. Idyllwild resident and artist Jon Gnagy, with the help of local artists and technicians, produced art kits for Visual Art Industries Inc., New York. For many

years, "Learn to Draw With Jon Gnagy" was a trade name across the country.

50 years ago - 1966

Paving Saunders Meadow Road started in preparation for developing the cut-and-fill dump to replace the open pit being used to dispose of trash.

45 years ago - 1971

Flags were at half staff in town to honor Robert Miller, a 21-year-

old Forest Service foreman, who died as a result of burns received while fighting a 589-acre brush fire near the Idyllwild-Banning Highway (now called Highway 243). Officials suspected an arsonist ignited the fire.

40 years ago - 1976

Another heavy thunderstorm made for a very wet September. The Sept. 30 issue of the Town Crier featured a photo of Strawberry Creek near ISOMATA (Idyllwild Arts) which had swollen to a 50-foot-wide stream.

35 years ago - 1981

There was a wall-to-wall crowd at the Idyllwild County Park Visitor Center when a new book, "The San Jacintos: A History and Natural History," written by 12 local authors, was unveiled.

30 years ago - 1986

Then Town Hall Recreation Program Director Shirley Root died in a traffic collision on Highway 243 south of Banning. She had been director for four years.

25 years ago - 1991

A dedication ceremony was held at the

Idyllwild Visitor Center (Nature Center) addition. The new structure, a twin to the original Visitor Center building, added a 1,500-square-foot multipurpose room, offices and room for new exhibits.

20 years ago - 1996

The U.S. Forest Service announced that the Hill's national forest lands would be part of a pilot project to start charging the public vehicle fees to use its lands. Thus, the Adventure Pass was born.

15 years ago - 2001

Three weeks after the Idyllwild Water District's new filtration plant began operations, then General Manager Tom Lovejoy reported, "The plant is performing beautifully."

10 years ago - 2006

A party was held at Café Aroma to celebrate the 95th birthday of Herb Jeffries, famous jazz singer and actor known as "Bronze Buckaroo." He was known as the first black man to star as a cowboy in early movie westerns. Some sources claim that Jeffries was actually of Sicilian-Irish ancestry and that he was born in 1913, rather than 1911.

5 years ago - 2011

A 4.1-magnitude earthquake was felt in Idyllwild and other areas of the Hill about 7:45 a.m. Wednesday, Sept. 14.

1 year ago - 2015

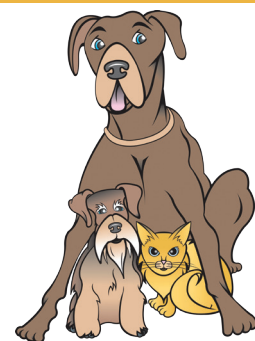
The Idyllwild Shuttle Bus had arrived, funded from a Riverside County Transportation grant and Supervisor Chuck Washington.

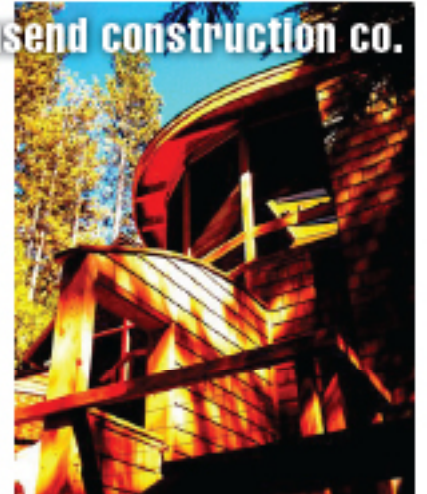

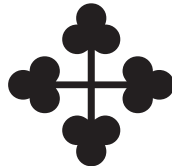

Grade II Operator Certificate was “pending” despite the State Water Resources Control Board’s statements and evidence that he had failed it three times and was scheduled to retake it in November, all of which Lynch denied.

Publicly, directors Billman, Cook and Freitas have steadfastly defended Lynch’s statements. The board has issued no public acknowledgement of an internal investigation or further support on behalf of Lynch.

Some community members believed the signage around town demonstrating lack of support for the board’s position was the impetus for the resignations.

However, observant residents will have noticed that the signs were removed last week. The County Code Enforcement Department notified one of the property owners that the sign violated the coun-

ty ordinance (806) for regulating temporary signs.

The process for filling the vacant board seats has

not been announced, but if the district takes longer than 60 dates from the effective resignation dates (Sept. 12), the County Board of Supervisors can appoint a director or call for a special election.

On Monday, Sept. 19,

IWD schedules special meeting

Idyllwild Water District has now scheduled a special meeting for Thursday, Sept. 22 at 6:00 p.m. at the district office. On the agenda will be several items, including addressing the two board vacancies, an operations report, and a closed session for interviews with applicants for the interim general manager position.

Cook announced his preference for a special election to fill the seats. He and the two departed directors were opposed to selling any new water meters until the current water emergency stages were over. IWD has been in a Stage 2 Water Shortage Emergency since Sept. 1, 2013 — three years.

Cook is concerned that the district water supply may be approaching an over-drafted stage. Unlike water districts in the San Jacinto or Coachella valleys, Hill water districts do not rely on an underground water aquifer to feed their wells. Water percolates from the peak down the mountain to streams and the North and South Fork of the San Jacinto River. It passes through fractures in the rock deep underground. But IWD has not released any in-

formation about its water condition, other than that Foster Lake is empty, which has been the situation for several years.

IWD’s water production for the year September 2013 through August 2014, was almost 85 million gallons. From September 2015 through last month, production was 78.2 million gallons, or 8.7 percent less.

Based on this savings, the difference is equivalent to 159 additional residential units if their consumption were equal to the average water usage for the existing IWD residential customers.

Some of the people, such as Idyllwild resident Vic Sirkin, who would like to serve on the board, favor changing the policy, but Cook is worried about this view.

“This is a radical ap-

proach, I prefer a moderate approach. Finding out what our reserves are,” Cook stated. “My position is this is a very important time for the district. With two vacancies, the electoral process will allow time to debate and discuss this position.

“Already some IWD customers oppose this position, so I think it requires a community debate,” he added. “This would occur through an election process.” The Town Crier has printed several letters to the editor opposing any expansion of the IWD customer base.

Last fall, former Director Warren Monroe asked Lynch to gather that information and Cook made a similar request at the August meeting. But the district still awaits a report on its water supply, demand, and resources, according to Cook.

While both Fern Valley and Pine Cove water districts have also moved to higher water emergency stages, both districts continue to issue new water meters during the drought.

the pilot program was slated to terminate. The Idyllwild Community Fund Advisory Committee voted to continue the program and raise the majority of money to fund the program. The Community Foundation provides both financial assistance and supplies train-

ing materials. ICF provides student instruction, assisted by Idyllwild Middle School teachers George Companiott and Donna Mercer. ICF board member Holly Guntermann heads the program. At the end of each IYG training session, students review grant applications and reward up to \$4,000 in grants to local nonprofits whose missions include teens.
