## Lightning causes small **COVID-19** fire off Highway 74

The U.S. Forest Service - San Bernardino National Forest (USFS), Cal Fire/Riverside County Fire Department and the Idyllwild Fire Protection District responded to a call for a vegetation fire, the White Post Fire, at Highway 74 and mile marker 57 Sunday at 11:29 a.m.

Initially, the USFS reported the fire at a quarter-acre. The fire was much smaller. The agency tweeted, "Updated size is a small spot, approx. 5 feet by 5 feet in size (earlier size report was Twitter operator error)."

At 12:40 p.m., USFS reported crews were mop-

The confirmed cause of the fire was lightning.

Last week, just before press time, another missing person was brought to the attention of the newspaper. Luis Alberto Artieda "was last known to be in Idyllwild from June 26 to 29," according to a flyer. "His car was found on La Mirada Road and Ramona Road near North Lyyken Trailhead in the city of Palm Springs." His vehicle was towed June 8 by the Palm Springs Police Department (PSPD) for being abandoned. The vehicle was "initially noticed June 3."

The Desert Sun reported in 2014, "The Cactus to Clouds trek stands out in a state known for its outdoor challenges. It's a grueling 22-mile, 12-hour hike that starts at the Lykken Trail in Palm Springs, continues to the summit of Mount San Jacinto and ends at the Palm Springs Aerial Tramway's Mountain Station."

The newspaper contacted both Riverside County Sheriff's Department (RCSD) Media Information Bureau (by email) and PSPD (by phone) and was told by PSPD that RCSD was in charge of the case. RCSD told the newspaper that PSPD was in charge

The newspaper has not received any further information from RCSD.

Artieda is 5'10" and 155 pounds. He is 53 years old.


"Dia" Abrams and Diana Perez Gonzalez, remain missing.
O'Sullivan, who was last seen at the Idyllwild Inn April 7, 2017, was 25 years old when he went missing. The Fowler-O'Sullivan Foundation (FOF) website writes of O'Sullivan, "David [O'Sullivan] was thru-hiking NOBO on the Pacific Crest Trail [PCT] from Mexico to Canada. On April 6, 2017 he sent an email to his family from an Idyllwild library. O'Sullivan, who is from Ireland, intended to hike north into the San Jacinto Mountains the next day. He has not been seen since. There are several trails he could have taken to access the PCT from Idyllwild. We do not know which trail David took."

The FOF will be conducting searches for Prifogle and Lane.

Another search of the area where Prifogle went missing was conducted Sunday, April 18. "A search was completed on Sunday in the area where it was believed Roy [Prifogle] was last near," the Riverside County Sheriff's Department (RCSD) media information bureau wrote in an email response. "No evidence and or items were located during the search." Before April 18, multiple searches had been conducted.

## FVWD reserves, director vacancy and hydrants

The Fern Valley Water District (FVWD) held its last board of directors meeting Friday with four members Walter Bonneau Jr, Gary Erb, Robert Krieger and Richard Schnetzer — due to the resignation of James Gates.

Bonneau asked what the reserve balance would be by the end of December. Assistant General Manager Jessica Priefer said the district should have \$940,000 in re-

Schnetzer was struck by the difference between the 2020 and 2021 multiple user accounts comparison due to the closures as a result of COVID-19. General Manager Victor Jimenez said water loss was 17.3%.

General manager's report

Jimenez wrote in his report, "Current demand is averaging approximately 107 gallons per minute. Total Organic Carbon [TOC] readings remain at acceptable levels allowing use of Tahquitz Creek, which is averaging approximately 29 gallons per minute.

Treated water storage is at 3.5 MG, 81.6% of maximum capacity (4.29 MĞ) and raw water storage is at 2.28 MG, 97% of maximum capacity (2.34 MG). Production has increased by approximately 1% from the same month last year."

Staff repaired a detected leak.

Gates resignation

No firm answer has been received by the district from the county Registrar of Voters office on how to proceed with the upcoming election and the resignation of Gates. The district spoke with its legal counsel, who said he doesn't see a problem with an appointment to fill the seat and that the district may have to go through an appointment twice — one now and another again in December at the end of Gates' term.

University Health System - Public Health (RUHS) website continues to update the numbers Monday through Friday (excluding holidays) regarding the COVID-19 shot.

The area of Idyllwild-Pine Cove has a total of 118 reported COVID-19 cases since the outbreak and two deaths reported. One hundred and fifteen of the 118 people have recovered. Last time, the county reported the area had a total of 119 cases.

As of July 14, Riverside County had 302,069 confirmed COVID-19 cases, 4,647 deaths related to COVID-19 and 295,921 people had recovered. Ninety-four individuals were being hospitalized, and of those, 14 were in the ICU. As of July 19, 48.4% of county population received the full dose of the COVID-19 shot.

As of July 7, Riverside County had 303,062 confirmed COVID-19 cases, 4,648 deaths related to COVID-19 and 297,330 people had recovered. Sixty-eight individuals were being hospitalized, and of those, 12 were in the ICU.

# Traffic collisions, part 2

California Highway Patrol (CHP) Public Information Officer Matt Napier has spent time catching the newspaper up on the traffic collisions that have occurred since May 20. Last week, the newspaper reported collisions from May 20 to June 13. This report includes collisions from June 14 to July 2. However, a couple of collisions are still in review one from May 30 and another from July 1.

At 11:35 a.m. Wednesday, June 16, Estaban Navarro, 24, of San Jacinto, was driving westbound on Highway 74 1.5 miles west of McGaugh Road at an unknown speed in a 2004 tan Nissan Altima. Two passengers were in the vehicle: Jasper Houston, 21, of Hemet and a minor. On a left-hand turn, Navarro traveled down a declining rock into an embankment, overturned and the vehicle came to rest on its side.

Navarro was transported by Idyllwild Fire for possible minor injuries and complaint of pain. Houston was transported to the county hospital by Idyllwild Fire for minor injuries and the minor was transported by Idyllwild Fire to the county hospital for major injuries.

The Altima was towed by Idyllwild Garage.

At 6 a.m. Saturday, June 19, Omar Pedro Aranda, 45, of Palm Desert, was traveling westbound on Highway 74 300 feet west of Little Thomas Mountain in a black 2002 Chevrolet Suburban at about 55 mph. Jennifer Collard, 36, of Perris, was also in the vehicle. Aranda steered to the left in a right-hand curve, went off the roadway and struck an uneven dirt/grass shoulder. Aranda told CHP he fell asleep. Collard was transported by Idyllwild Fire for possible

injuries. The Suburban was towed by Idyllwild Garage.

At 10:20 a.m. Sunday, June 20, Rosalie Mary Machuca, 50, of Idyllwild, was driving westbound on Highway 74 0.1 miles east of Butterfly Peak Road in a blue 2014 Toyota Prius at about 40 mph, left the roadway edge, drifted to the right, and collided with a raised concrete drainage culvert.

Machuca possibly had injuries but was not transported. The Prius was towed by Valley Auto.

At 2:50 p.m. Friday, June 25, Kira Jade Carlson, 22, of Idyllwild, was traveling westbound on Highway 74 2.4 miles west of McCall Park Road at about 45 to 55 mph in a white 1996 Buick Regal as Robert David Strawhecker, 60, of Anza, was also traveling westbound on Highway 74 at about the same speed in a maroon 2017 Ram 1500 in front of Carlson. Both traveled around a right-hand curve when Carlson attempted to pass Strawhecker on the right-hand side in the turnout. Carlson ran out of room and steered to the left. The left side of the Regal collided with the right side of the 1500. Carlson did not stop and Strawhecker requested law enforcement. Carlson was contacted later at her residence. Strawhecker did not want to seek hit and run

Neither vehicle was towed and no injuries were report-

At 11:25 a.m. Monday, June 28, Jeffrey David Cranston, 40, of Winchester, was traveling southbound on Highway

243 0.3 miles north of Round Robin Drive on a red 2017 Yamaha FZ-09 at a stated speed of 60 mph when he could not negotiate a left curve in the road, traveled to the left side of the road over a descending embankment hitting the hill below. He was ejected from the motorcycle.

Cranston was not transported but the Yamaha was towed by Idyllwild Garage.

At 11:50 p.m. Thursday, July 1, Allen Ralph Sabenorio, 68, of Idyllwild, was traveling northbound on Highway 243 400 feet south of Saunders Meadow Road in a red 2010 Volkswagen Jetta at about 25 mph. Sabenorio approached a large boulder blocking the northbound lane just past a vehicle on the right that slowed and stopped due to the boulder. He failed to stop before colliding with the boulder.

No injuries were reported but the Jetta was towed by Idyllwild Garage.

At 3:22 p.m., Friday, July 2, a collision occurred on Highway 74 4,000 feet west of Santa Rosa Road that involved three people: Bernadette Marie Rodriguez, 36, of Palm Desert; Karin Elaine Vega, 24, of La Quinta and Joshua Allen Bailey, 42, of Escondido. Rodriguez was traveling westbound at about 40 mph in a blue 2016 Ford Fusion ahead of Bailey, who was traveling at 50 mph in a gray 2008 Toyota Tundra. Vega was traveling eastbound in a brown 2017 Kia Sportage at about 50 mph toward Rodriguez.

For unknown reasons, Rodriguez veered from the westbound lane, crossed the double-yellow line into the eastbound lane. The front of the Sportage struck the left rear of Rodriguez. Vega traveled across the lanes into the path of Bailey. The front of the Sportage struck the front left of the Tundra. Bailey traveled off the road and into a fence.

No injuries were reported. No vehicles were towed.

March 4, 2020. He left home at about 1 p.m. and was last seen at the Pine Cove Market at 6:30 p.m. the same day. He was last seen wearing a red backpack and jeans.

Lane was last seen June 15, 2020. "I love my daughter so much and I've been praying for the other three families," Lane's mother Kathy Lamont said. "My heart tells me there is foul play somewhere."

Lane's cousin local Todd Gilliland was the last person to see her before she went missing. "I miss her a lot," Gilliland said. "I her. It's nerve-racking. They [RCSD] have

ed missing and haven't talked to me since. I was the last one to see her. You would think they'd want to go over it with me again."

According to Lamont in December, the RCSD last searched in early September with cadaver dogs on Black Mountain Trail, north of Pine Cove, where Lane was last seen. The search came back with nothing.

Abrams was 65 years old at the time she went missing. She is 5' 5" tall, 130 pounds with blonde hair and blue eyes. She was last seen wearing a black and turquoise jacket, yellow shirt and blue jeans.

On June 6, 2020, Ábrams was last seen wish we would get some kind of word about by her self-proclaimed live-in boyfriend/ fiancé Keith Harper at her ranch in Apple

Garner Valley). Since the initial search efforts more than a year ago, the RCSD has not provided new information or updates regarding her disappearance.

News 8's David Gotfredson previously reported that the San Juan County Sheriff in New Mexico obtained a search warrant and deputies impounded the RV Harper drove to New Mexico taking evidence from inside. However, the RCSD has not provided any persons of interest or suspects regarding Abrams or any of the other missing people.

Riverside Mountain Rescue Unit conducted searches on Abrams' property before assigning the case to detectives.

ed to his request. He sent the requested bills but has not heard back on what else is needed from the district. Jimenez will search for other competitive companies if another company is needed.

Jimenez told the board that if he sees a drop in well level, he will discuss moving to stage 3 water conservation with the board.

#### **Hydrants**

The district has identified another 40 fire hydrants that can be upgraded and about 41 more that would require a pipeline replacement in order to be upgraded.

The 5-year plan will tackle 10 hydrants per year instead of all 40 at one time like the last/current hydrant replacement project. The district has 212 hydrants and has five more to do in the initial batch of 45 the district is replacing. Jimenez said field staff are able to do a hydrant replacement a day and can do two to three a week now, so

the hydrant replacement will not take as long as it did in the beginning. Hydrant replacement can only occur in the s u m m e r months. The cost for 39 hydrants was about \$200,000 in materials to complete innouse. tal cost per hydrant is about \$5,000.

The next meeting is scheduled for Aug. 20.

The Ralph M. Brown Act, which is codified as California Government Code sections 54950-54963, is open-meeting legislation that governs only local public agencies. (State public agencies are governed by sepa-

Six presently active local governmental agencies on our Hill are governed by the Brown Act: the Idyllwild, Pine Cove, Fern Valley and Lake Hemet Municipal water districts, the Idyllwild Fire Protection District, and the Idyllwild Historic Preservation District. The Idyllwild Town Crier is the sole media monitor of these

These agencies are not owned by the board members and administrators who run them; they are owned by you. The board members and administrators work for you. They make decisions as to how to spend your tax dollars — and what services you get for them. The board members hire their administrators, but you can vote the board members in or out.

You don't want local board members who merely perpetuate their own power or that of the agency they govern. You want board members that make good decisions for you and your community. They serve you.

The Town Crier attends and reports to you on the happenings at the public meetings of these six local agencies because you are not always able to attend them yourselves. This is perhaps the TC's most important ongoing work for you.
