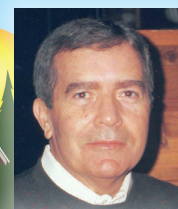

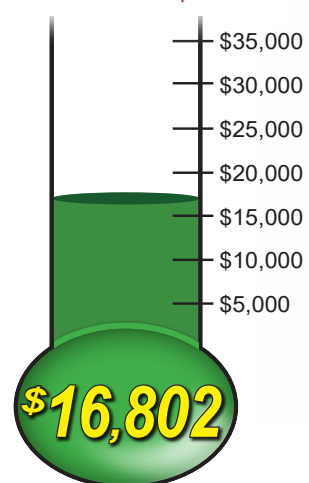

## Lightning causes small fire off Highway 74

The U.S. Forest Service – San Bernardino National Forest (USFS), Cal Fire/Riverside County Fire Department and the Idyllwild Fire Protection District responded to a call for a vegetation fire, the White Post Fire, at Highway 74 and mile marker 57 Sunday at 11:29 a.m.

Initially, the USFS reported the fire at a quarter-acre. The fire was much smaller. The agency tweeted, "Updated size is a small spot, approx. 5 feet by 5 feet in size (earlier size report was Twitter operator error)."

At 12:40 p.m., USFS reported crews were mopping up.

The confirmed cause of the fire was lightning.

## FVWD reserves, director vacancy and hydrants

The Fern Valley Water District (FVWD) held its last board of directors meeting Friday with four members — Walter Bonneau Jr, Gary Erb, Robert Krieger and Richard Schnetzer — due to the resignation of James Gates.

Bonneau asked what the reserve balance would be by the end of December. Assistant General Manager Jessica Priefer said the district should have \$940,000 in reserves by then.

Schnetzer was struck by the difference between the 2020 and 2021 multiple user accounts comparison due to the closures as a result of COVID-19. General Manager Victor Jimenez said water loss was 17.3%.

### General manager's report

Jimenez wrote in his report, "Current demand is averaging approximately 107 gallons per minute. Total Organic Carbon [TOC] readings remain at acceptable levels allowing use of Tahquitz Creek, which is averaging approximately 29 gallons per minute.

"Treated water storage is at 3.5 MG, 81.6% of maximum capacity (4.29 MG) and raw water storage is at 2.28 MG, 97% of maximum capacity (2.34 MG). Production has increased by approximately 1% from the same month last year."

Staff repaired a detected leak.

### Gates resignation

No firm answer has been received by the district from the county Registrar of Voters office on how to proceed with the upcoming election and the resignation of Gates. The district spoke with its legal counsel, who said he doesn't see a problem with an appointment to fill the seat and that the district may have to go through an appointment twice — one now and another again in December at the end of Gates' term.

### Directors' comments

Bonneau inquired about installing solar. Jimenez submitted data to one of the companies that responded. See FVWD, page A3

## Neither sheriff nor PSPD took lead on missing person case

Last week, just before press time, another missing person was brought to the attention of the newspaper. Luis Alberto Artieda "was last known to be in Idyllwild from June 26 to 29," according to a flyer. "His car was found on La Mirada Road and Ramona Road near North Lykken Trailhead in the city of Palm Springs." His vehicle was towed June 8 by the Palm Springs Police Department (PSPD) for being abandoned. The vehicle was "initially noticed June 3."

The Desert Sun reported in 2014, "The Cactus to Clouds trek stands out in a state known for its outdoor challenges. It's a grueling 22-mile, 12-hour hike that starts at the Lykken Trail in Palm Springs, continues to the summit of Mount San Jacinto and ends at the Palm Springs Aerial Tramway's Mountain Station."

The newspaper contacted both Riverside County Sheriff's Department (RCSD) Media Information Bureau (by email) and PSPD (by phone) and was told by PSPD that RCSD was in charge of the case. RCSD told the newspaper that PSPD was in charge and to contact that department.

When the newspaper responded to RCSD that PSPD said RCSD was in charge of this case, the newspaper was told the department is "currently reaching out to Palm Springs PD to try to see what is going on with this inquiry" and that they would be in touch. The newspaper has not received any further information from RCSD.

Artieda is 5'10" and 155 pounds. He is 53 years old.

If both agencies thought the other was in charge, who was actually trying to locate Artieda?

Five people in addition to Artieda, David O'Sullivan, Roy Prifogle, Melissa Lane, Lydia "Dia" Abrams and Diana Perez Gonzalez, remain missing.

O'Sullivan, who was last seen at the Idyllwild Inn April 7, 2017, was 25 years old when he went missing. The Fowler-O'Sullivan Foundation (FOF) website writes of O'Sullivan, "David [O'Sullivan] was thru-hiking NOBO on the Pacific Crest Trail [PCT] from Mexico to Canada. On April 6, 2017 he sent an email to his family from an Idyllwild library. O'Sullivan, who is from Ireland, intended to hike north into the San Jacinto Mountains the next day. He has not been seen since. There are several trails he could have taken to access the PCT from Idyllwild. We do not know which trail David took."

The FOF will be conducting searches for Prifogle and Lane.

Another search of the area where Prifogle went missing was conducted Sunday, April 18. "A search was completed on Sunday in the area where it was believed Roy [Prifogle] was last near," the Riverside County Sheriff's Department (RCSD) media information bureau wrote in an email response. "No evidence and or items were located during the search." Before April 18, multiple searches had been conducted.

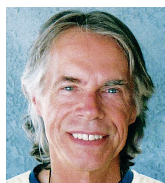

March 4, 2020. He left home at about 1 p.m. and was last seen at the Pine Cove Market at 6:30 p.m. the same day. He was last seen wearing a red backpack and jeans.

Lane was last seen June 15, 2020. "I love my daughter so much and I've been praying for the other three families," Lane's mother Kathy Lamont said. "My heart tells me there is foul play somewhere."

Lane's cousin local Todd Gilliland was the last person to see her before she went missing. "I miss her a lot," Gilliland said. "I wish we would get some kind of word about her. It's nerve-racking. They [RCSD] have

interviewed me once when she was reported missing and haven't talked to me since. I was the last one to see her. You would think they'd want to go over it with me again."

According to Lamont in December, the RCSD last searched in early September with cadaver dogs on Black Mountain Trail, north of Pine Cove, where Lane was last seen. The search came back with nothing.

Abrams was 65 years old at the time she went missing. She is 5' 5" tall, 130 pounds with blonde hair and blue eyes. She was last seen wearing a black and turquoise jacket, yellow shirt and blue jeans.

On June 6, 2020, Abrams was last seen by her self-proclaimed live-in boyfriend/fiancé Keith Harper at her ranch in Apple

Canyon (between Mountain Center and Garner Valley). Since the initial search efforts more than a year ago, the RCSD has not provided new information or updates regarding her disappearance.

News 8's David Gottfredson previously reported that the San Juan County Sheriff in New Mexico obtained a search warrant and deputies impounded the RV Harper drove to New Mexico taking evidence from inside. However, the RCSD has not provided any persons of interest or suspects regarding Abrams or any of the other missing people.

Riverside Mountain Rescue Unit conducted searches on Abrams' property before assigning the case to detectives.

The most recent woman to go missing

from the Hemet/San Jacinto area is Gonzalez who was reported missing Dec. 11 and 27 years old at the time she went missing. According to family, Gonzalez visited the Idyllwild area regularly. She was last seen by her boyfriend.

Christy Rojas, Gonzalez's sister, and her family are struggling with her sister missing. Rojas said, "We've been terribly sad. We think about her every day and have dreams of her, waiting for any sign or a miracle because we miss her and love her a lot. But the most important, her baby needs her. We can see the sadness in her eyes. Although she can't speak, we know she misses her mom." Gonzalez was pregnant when she went missing.

ed to his request. He sent the requested bills but has not heard back on what else is needed from the district. Jimenez will search for other competitive companies if another company is needed.

Jimenez told the board that if he sees a drop in well level, he will discuss moving to stage 3 water conservation with the board.

Hydrants

The district has identified another 40 fire hydrants that can be upgraded and about 41 more that would require a pipeline replacement in order to be upgraded.

The 5-year plan will tackle 10 hydrants per year instead of all 40 at one time like the last/current hydrant replacement project. The district has 212 hydrants and has five more to do in the initial batch of 45 the district is replacing. Jimenez said field staff are able to do a hydrant replacement a day and can do two to three a week now, so the hydrant replacement will not take as long as it did in the beginning. Hydrant replacement can only occur in the summer months. The cost for 39 hydrants was about \$200,000 in materials to complete in-house. Total cost per hydrant is about \$5,000.

The next meeting is scheduled for Aug. 20.

The Ralph M. Brown Act, which is codified as California Government Code sections 54950-54963, is open-meeting legislation that governs only local public agencies. (State public agencies are governed by separate legislation.)

Six presently active local governmental agencies on our Hill are governed by the Brown Act: the Idyllwild, Pine Cove, Fern Valley and Lake Hemet Municipal water districts, the Idyllwild Fire Protection District, and the Idyllwild Historic Preservation District. The Idyllwild Town Crier is the sole media monitor of these agencies.

These agencies are not owned by the board members and administrators who run them; they are owned by you. The board members and administrators work for you. They make decisions as to how to spend your tax dollars — and what services you get for them. The board members hire their administrators, but you can vote the board members in or out.

You don't want local board members who merely perpetuate their own power or that of the agency they govern. You want board members that make good decisions for you and your community. They serve you.

The Town Crier attends and reports to you on the happenings at the public meetings of these six local agencies because you are not always able to attend them yourselves. This is perhaps the TC's most important ongoing work for you.

But we could not monitor these agencies without your continuing Memberships. Our congratulations and thanks to all you Members for renewing your Memberships, thereby keeping the Town Crier serving our Hill community.

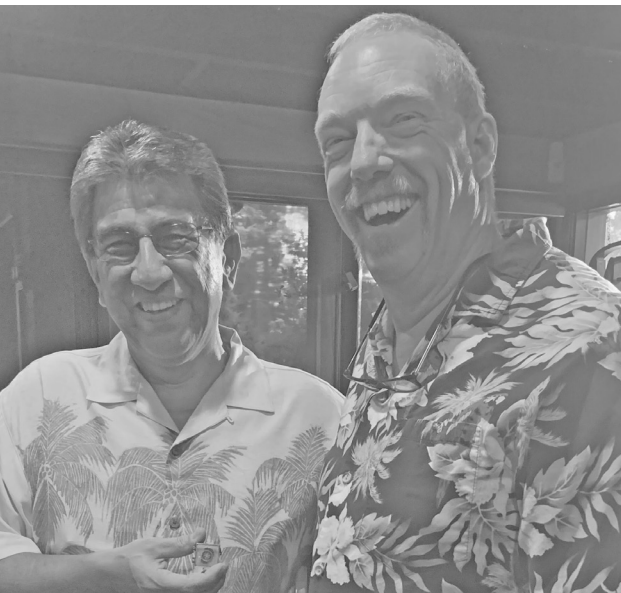

Patients who suffer a severe injury will be treated by a board-certified trauma surgeon leading a multidisciplinary team of highly trained health care personnel from the emergency room, operating room, intensive care, radiology and rehabilitation services.

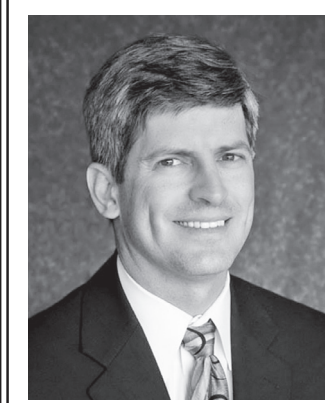
