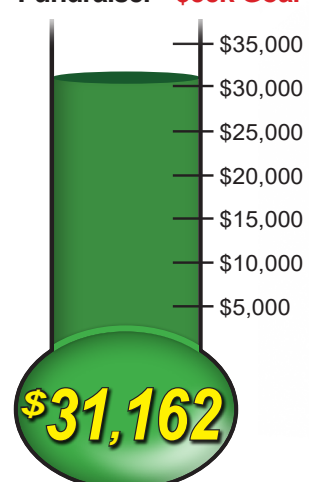

Last week's Covid story

We received an email from a Member in Costa Mesa who wished to cancel his TC Membership because of a front-page piece in last week's paper. The Member wrote it was "a vaccine hit piece" that he believed was intended to discourage our readers from being vaccinated by referencing out-of-context statements from scientific sources.

As reported last week, the Centers for Disease Control did publish an article stating that of 469 persons infected with coronavirus during a recent outbreak in Barnstable County, Massachusetts, 346 of them (74%) had been fully vaccinated. But our story left it at that — which to readers may have created the misled impression that vaccines do not work.

Vaccines are not intended to keep a person from becoming infected. Vaccines produce antibodies that attack the virus after a person becomes infected, working to keep the infected person from becoming sick or hospitalized and possibly dying.

Last week's story did not mention that of the 469 total Covid cases in the Barnstable outbreak, 195 were asymptomatic, i.e., they had no symptoms at all, while 274 did have symptoms — and that, of the total of five people hospitalized, four had been vaccinated and no deaths were reported.

The CDC reports that, currently throughout the U.S., roughly 97% of new Covid hospitalizations and 99.5% of Covid deaths occur in unvaccinated persons.

We apologize for omissions in last week's Covid story. The Town Crier does not wish to dissuade persons from obtaining Covid vaccinations. We intend to do a better job of editing our own stories, as well as those submitted by others, before publication.

Vote-by-Mail ballots for September gubernatorial recall election on the way to voters

Approximately 1,288,000 vote-by-mail ballots were mailed to voters starting Monday, Aug. 16, for the gubernatorial recall election on Sept. 14. While the ballot mailing started Monday, it is expected to take four days for all ballots to make it in the mail.

Completed ballots must be received at the Registrar of Voters Office, any polling place or ballot drop-off location within Riverside County no later than the close of polls on Election Day or be postmarked on or before Election Day and received no later than seven days after Election Day to be counted.

Approximately 1,288,000 vote-by-mail ballots were mailed to voters starting Monday, Aug. 16, for the gubernatorial recall election on Sept. 14.

Vote-by-mail ballots can be returned through the Postal Service or deposited in vote-by-mail drop-off boxes at 102 participating locations throughout Riverside County. Ballot drop-off locations and hours of operation can be found on the registrar's website at www.voteinfo.net. A 24-hour drop box is available outside the main entrance of the registrar's office at 2720 Gateway Dr. in Riverside. Vote-by-mail ballots also may be dropped off at any polling place within Riverside County starting Sept. 11 through Election Day.

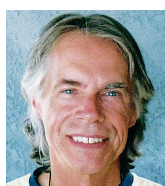

COVID-19 LOCAL UPDATE: CDC Weekly Review; HUSD update

Nationally, Covid cases, hospitalizations and deaths are increasing. The Centers for Disease Control's updated guidance is recommending that schools implement "layered prevention strategies," which include universal masking for all students 2 years and older, as well as for teachers, staff and visitors, regardless of vaccination status. The CDC further recommends that teachers, staff, parents and eligible students get vaccinated as soon as possible.

The current 7-day moving average of daily new cases increased 18.4% compared with last week, and it is 66.3% higher compared to the peak observed 13 months ago on July 20, 2020. It is 65% lower than the peak observed seven months ago on Jan. 10, 2021. But the 7-day moving average is 882.8% higher than the lowest value observed just two months ago in June.

The Hemet Unified School District advises that effective Monday of this week it has updated its Student Exposure/Contact Tracing and Exclusion Practices. It is also implementing temperature checks and screening questions that will be asked upon entry to all sites. HUSD also is implementing seating charts at all schools to be more effective in tracking exposures as they occur.

Further, HUSD is creating a task force of staff exclusively responsible for answering questions so families can receive real-time answers from a live person. This service will answer questions about HUSD guidelines, with access by families during the week and on weekends. The district hopes to provide support for families and to decrease its response times regarding incoming calls and emails.

As of Aug. 16, Riverside County had 320,777 confirmed COVID-19 cases, 4,686 deaths related to COVID-19 and 310,821 people had recovered. Four hundred and eighty five individuals were being hos-

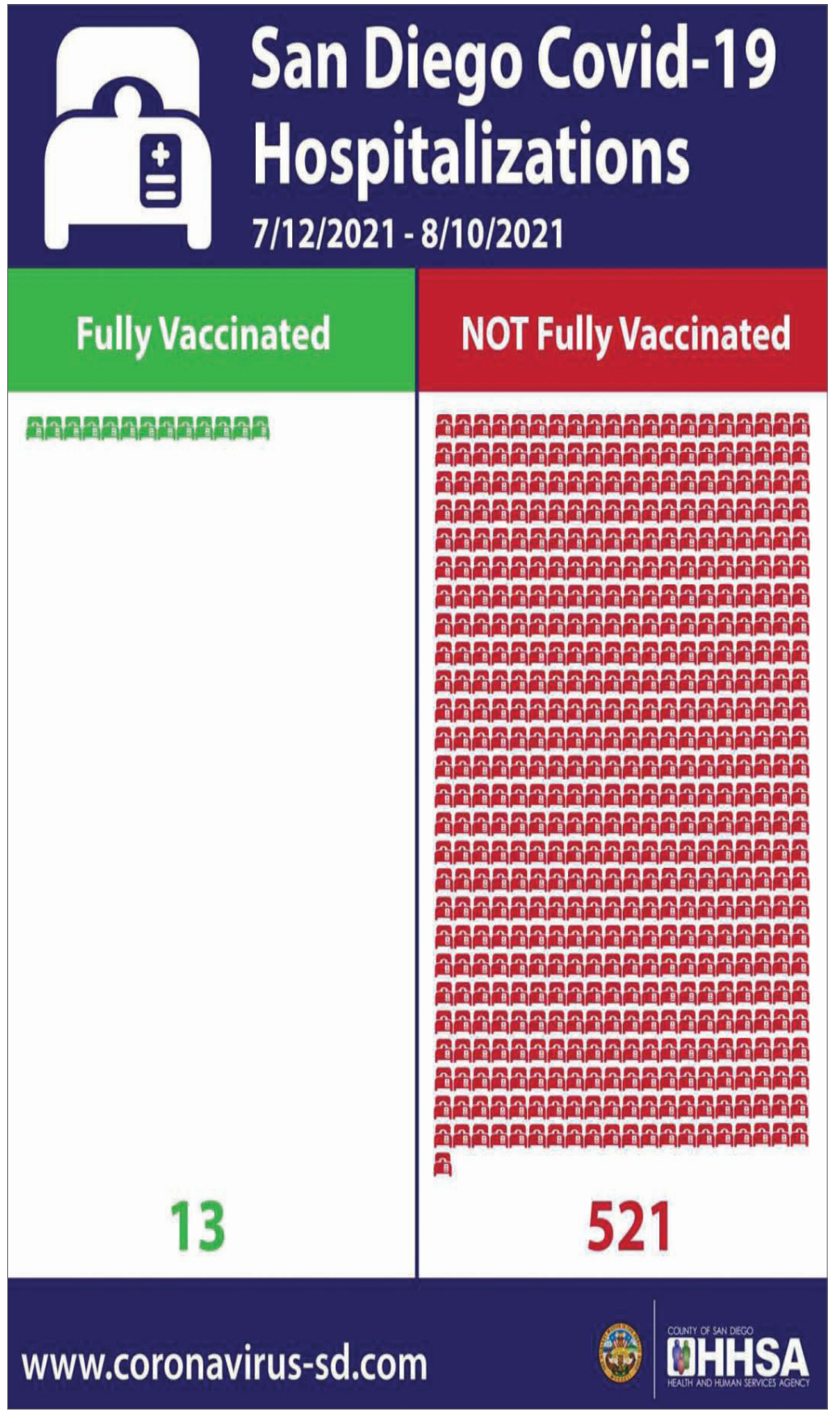
pitalized, and of those, 85 were in the ICU. The current case rate per 100,000 is 31.4 and 12.3% positivity. As of Aug. 9, 50.6% of the county population received the full dose of the COVID-19 shot. County Public Health outlines variants and the number in Riverside County on its website: Alpha (163), Beta (0), Gamma (12) and Delta (67). The newspaper still has not received a response to its inquiry regarding how the tests differentiate from each other.

As of Aug. 9, Riverside County had 314,862 confirmed COVID-19 cases, 4,667 deaths related to COVID-19 and 303,889 people had recovered. Four hundred and eleven individuals were being hospitalized, and of those, 85 were in the ICU. The current case rate per 100,000 is 25.2 and 11.5% positivity. As of Aug. 9, 51.4% of the county population received the full dose of the COVID-19 shot. County Public Health outlines variants and the number in Riverside County on its website: Alpha (163), Beta (0), Gamma (12) and Delta (65).

As of Aug. 3, Riverside County had 309,217 confirmed COVID-19 cases, 4,667 deaths related to COVID-19 and 300,387 people had recovered. Two hundred and eighty-eight individuals were being hospitalized, and of those, 73 were in the ICU. The current case rate per 100,000 is 16.9 and 8.9% positivity. As of Aug. 2, 49.9% of the county population received the full dose of the COVID-19 shot. County Public Health outlines variants and the number in Riverside County on its website: Alpha (149), Beta (0), Gamma (11) and Delta (26).

As of July 27, Riverside County had 305,589 confirmed COVID-19 cases, 4,658 deaths related to COVID-19 and 298,029 people had recovered. One hundred and ninety individuals were being hospitalized, and of those, 47 were in the ICU. As of July 26, 49.1% of the county population received the full dose of the COVID-19 shot.

Families looking for answers

Six people, Luis Alberto Artieda, David O'Sullivan, Roy Prifogle, Melissa Lane, Lydia "Dia" Abrams and Diana Perez Gonzalez, remain missing.

Artieda "was last known to be in Idyllwild from June 26 to 29," according to a flyer. "His car was found on La Mirada Road and Ramona Road near North Lyyken Trailhead in the city of Palm Springs." His vehicle was towed July 8 by the Palm Springs Police Department (PSPD) after the vehicle was "initially noticed July 3." Artieda is 5'10" and 155 pounds. He is 53 years old.

Neither the Riverside County Sheriff's Department (RCSD) nor PSPD initially took the lead on this case. RCSD responded to the newspaper that they were "currently reaching out to Palm Springs PD to try to see what is going on with this inquiry" and that they would be in touch. The newspaper has not received any further information.

O'Sullivan, who was last seen at the Idyllwild Inn April 7, 2017, was 25 years old when he went missing. The Fowler-O'Sullivan Foundation (FOF) website writes of O'Sullivan, "David [O'Sullivan] was thru-hiking NOBO on the Pacific Crest Trail [PCT] from Mexico to Canada. On April 6, 2017 he sent an email to his family from an Idyllwild library. O'Sullivan, who is from Ireland, intended to hike north into the San Jacinto Mountains the next day. He has not been seen since. There are several trails he could have taken to access the PCT from

Idyllwild. We do not know which trail David took."

Another search of the area where Prifogle went missing was conducted Sunday, April 18. "A search was completed on Sunday in the area where it was believed Roy [Prifogle] was last near," RCSD media information bureau wrote in an email response. "No evidence and or items were located during the search." Before April 18, multiple searches had been conducted.

Prifogle was reported missing after going on a hike in the Pine Cove area Wednesday, March 4, 2020. He left home at about 1 p.m. and was last seen at the Pine Cove Market at 6:30 p.m. the same day. He was last seen wearing a red backpack and jeans.

Lane was last seen June 15, 2020. "I love my daughter so much and I've been praying for the other three families," Lane's mother Kathy Lamont said. "My heart tells me there is foul play somewhere."

Lane's cousin local Todd Gilliland was the last person to see her before she went missing. "I miss her a lot," Gilliland said. "I wish we would get some kind of word about her. It's nerve-racking. They [RCSD] have interviewed me once when she was reported missing and haven't talked to me since. I was the last one to see her. You would think they'd want to go over it with me again."

According to Lamont in December, the RCSD last searched in early September with cadaver dogs on Black Mountain Trail, north of Pine Cove, where Lane was last seen. The search came back with nothing.

Abrams was 65 years old at the time she went missing. She is 5' 5" tall, 130 pounds with blonde hair and blue eyes. She was last seen wearing a black and turquoise jacket, yellow shirt and blue jeans.

On June 6, 2020, Abrams was last seen by her self-proclaimed live-in boyfriend/fiancé Keith Harper at her ranch in Apple Canyon (between Mountain Center and Garner Valley). Since the initial search efforts more than a year ago, the RCSD has not provided new information or updates regarding her disappearance.

The RCSD has not provided any persons of interest or suspects regarding Abrams or any of the other missing people. Riverside Mountain Rescue Unit conducted searches on Abrams' property before assigning the case to detectives.

Gonzalez, who is from the Hemet/San Jacinto area, was reported missing Dec. 11 and 27 years old at the time she went missing. According to family, Gonzalez visited the Idyllwild area regularly. She was last seen by her boyfriend.

Christy Rojas, Gonzalez's sister, and her family are struggling with her sister missing. Rojas said, "We've been terribly sad. We think about her every day and have dreams of her, waiting for any sign or a miracle because we miss her and love her a lot. But the most important, her baby needs her. We can see the sadness in her eyes. Although she can't speak, we know she misses her mom." Gonzalez was pregnant when she went missing.



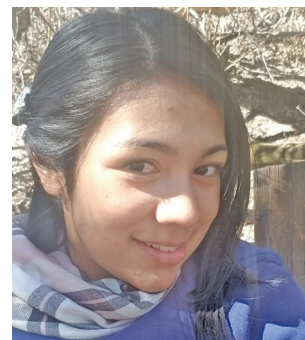

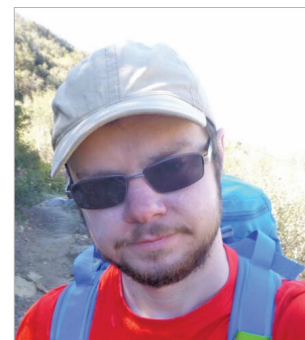

Two minor traffic collisions on Hill roads

Recent mountain traffic collisions include a hit-and-run and a broadside resulting in minor injuries.

According to California Highway Patrol Officer B. Bolon, at 3:45 p.m. Tuesday, Aug. 3, Lenny Muscarella, 74, of Idyllwild, was driving a white 1999 Ford F150 in the parking lot at 54391 Village Center Dr. when he backed into a black 2009 Audi 25 parked at the location.

Bolon said Muscarella fled the scene and was later identified. He was arrested for hit-and-run and for driving under the influence. Both vehicles sustained minor damage and no injuries were reported.

At 1:50 p.m. Saturday, Aug. 14, Bolon reported that Abigail Tsai, 32, of West Lake Village, was driving a silver 2003 Toyota Highlander westbound on Lakeview Drive near Highway 243. At the same time, Tobias Plonski, 56, of Palm

Desert, was driving a gray 2003 Honda Element northbound on Highway 243.

Tsai attempted to make a turn, entering the intersection and broadsiding the Element. Plonski lost control and hit the mountainside. He was transported to Eisenhower Medical Center with minor injuries. Tsai was not injured.

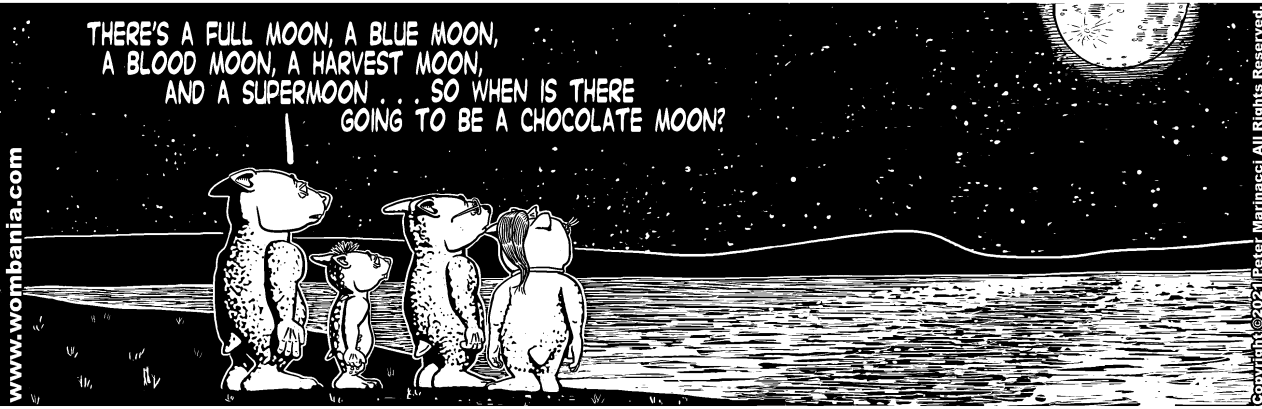

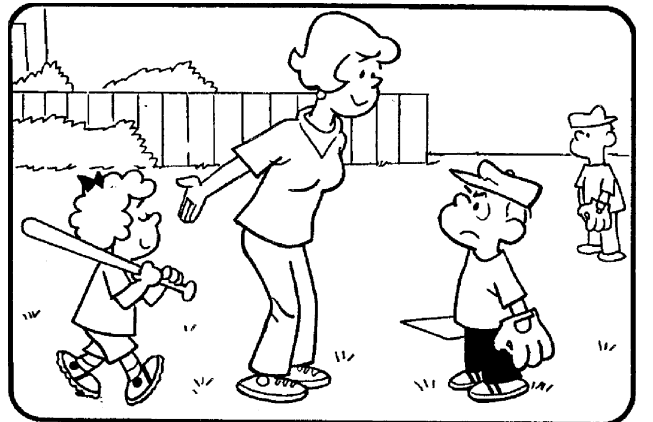

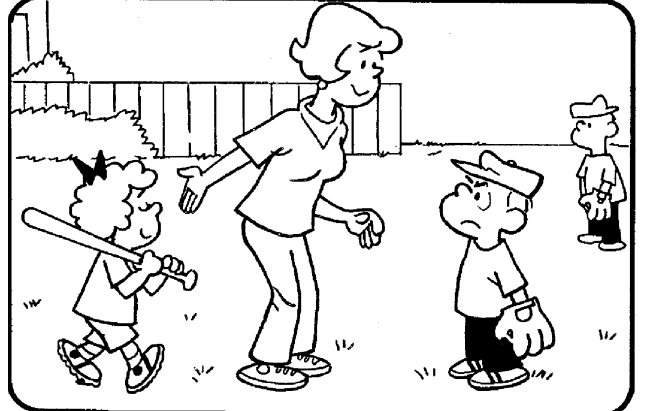

The registrar's office will be open to voters on Election Day from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. Early voting also will be offered Sept. 3 to 5 from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. at the Galleria at Tyler, 1299 Galleria at Tyler in Riverside; at Westfield Palm Desert, 72-840 Highway 111 in Palm Desert; and the Promenade in Temecula, 40820 Winchester Rd. The Sept. 14 election is a countywide election. Registered voters in all areas of the county are eligible to cast votes in this election. For questions about your eligibility to vote, contact the registrar's office at 951-486-7200. If you want to register, update your address or change your political party preference you must complete a voter registration application and submit it by Aug. 30. You can register online at registertovote.ca.gov or request a paper application by calling 951-486-7200. **Special Note:** Effective Jan. 1, 2017, Conditional Voter Registration is available to eligible voters in California pursuant to Election Codes 2170 through 2173. Conditional Voter Registration (CVR) extends the existing 15-day registration deadline to eligible voters, allowing them to register and vote 14 days before an election through Election Day.

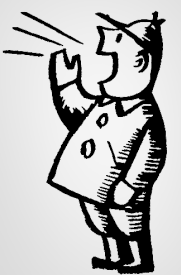

Idyll Awhile hosts Full Moon Dinners

If you want to dine under the full moon with live music and in the company of others, you might want to check out the Full Moon Dinners at Leanna's Idyll Awhile. Dinners are held the Monday around the full moon.

Leanna Lee, owner of Leanna's Idyll Awhile, told the newspaper she started these dinner events a year ago, but with the COVID-restrictions, she pulled back. She will host the fourth dinner, the Sturgeon Moon, Monday, Aug. 23. Dinners start at 5:30 p.m. weather permitting. Live music accompanies the dinners.

Eighteen people attended the last dinner, the Buck Moon Dinner, which included venison bruschetta; bacon wrapped venison with poblano chili, blue cheese and a balsamic reduction; a venison medallion with a blackberry compote, roasted corn salsa and Broccolini. The final course was a chocolate torte with venison caramel sauce and macerated berries.

The Strawberry Moon included a strawberry bruschetta with goat cheese and basil; a strawberry spinach salad with avocado, feta, purple onion and mint; a grilled filet mignon with whipped blue cheese potato, strawberry relish in a port wine reduction and a strawberry cheesecake for dessert.

Lee cooks all of the dinners. The kitchen at Idyll Awhile will be revamped and expanded beginning January. She remodeled the main area of the venue during the lockdown.

Local Donna Elliot designs the menus after Lee puts together a four-course meal incorporating the theme into each course. Wine is paired with each course.

"It gives locals something to do in town when it is quiet," Lee explained.

The Sturgeon Moon Dinner, named after the time of year sturgeon were caught by Native American tribes around the Great Lakes, will also incorporate caviar and Champagne.

Reservations are required and can be made by calling 909-714-0945. The dinners range between \$69 and \$99 per person depending on what is being incorporated into the dinner.

70 years ago - 1951

Dutton's Corner Store, owned by Leigh and Maggie Dutton, opened its doors at Fern Valley Corners on the site of the former Fern Valley Market.

65 years ago - 1956

At a ceremony held at the Native American cemetery at Cahuilla, a marker on the grave of Juan Diego was unveiled. Diego was the lover of Ramona, also buried there.

60 years ago - 1961

The community was shocked as word spread that Lloyd E. "Bill" Morland, 50, a lieutenant in the Idyllwild Fire Department, had suffered a fatal heart attack while fighting a lightning fire on Marion View Drive.

55 years ago - 1966

Dolores Bergman, first director of the Town Hall recreation program created by the newly formed service area that contracted with the Idyllwild Chamber of Commerce for use of Town Hall, reported that in addition to daily activities for children, adults and children could take craft, art, music, pottery and chess classes, attend nature talks and take guided hikes. There was also a Friday night "teen time," with records, refreshments and

games, and a community campfire with entertainment on Saturday nights.

50 years ago - 1971

A new Idyllwild entrance sign, proclaiming Idyllwild to be "America's Cleanest Forest," was installed along Highway 243. It replaced individual markers.

45 years ago - 1976

The endangered Peninsular bighorn sheep were given another 11,459 acres to roam, thanks to the actions of the Nature Conservancy, a private protective society that engineered the purchase of nearly 17 square miles in the Santa Rosa Mountains.

40 years ago - 1981

The Idyllwild Fire Protection District Board of Commissioners voted to set a standby charge of \$20 per unit on assessable parcels. Voters in the district also authorized the commissioners to impose a maximum standby charge of \$65.

35 years ago - 1986

There was a new taxi cab service in Idyllwild, the Village Cab Co. In addition to transporting people to local and off-Hill destinations, owners Kat and Barry Davis delivered pets and parcels.

30 years ago - 1991

Then 61-year-old Bud Hunt and cycling cohorts were taking weekly 34-mile bike rides from Idyllwild to Paradise Corners and back. Dubbed the

"Biscuits and Gravy Ride," because riders stopped to eat breakfast when they reached Paradise Corners.

25 years ago - 1996

With the Hill just getting back to normal after the Bee Canyon Fire, firefighters from many agencies were battling two more — the Wolfskill and Cabazon fires. More than 10,300 acres were burned and Highway 243 was closed near the Twin Pines Boys Ranch, which had to be evacuated.

20 years ago - 2001

The Board of Governors of the Idyllwild Arts Foundation feted more than 100 people after a successful five-year campaign that raised \$9.3 million for expansion and renovation of campus facilities.

15 years ago - 2006

At the Anza Valley Municipal Advisory Council meeting, council member Tulvio Durand reported that in the first quarter of 2006, there had been 12 fatalities near the in-

tersection of highways 79 and 371. Saying that Highway 371, when built, was never intended to handle such heavy truck and commuter traffic, he called for Caltrans to do a thorough safety study and ultimately to build a four-lane highway.

10 years ago - 2011

On Wednesday, Aug. 10, Idyllwild lost one of its early residents with the passing of Inie Wilson. She was 96 years old. Eighteen-year-old Inie Wilson arrived in Idyllwild in 1932, in the midst of the Great Depression.

5 years ago - 2016

Local video producers and life partners Marcia Waldorf and Jim Crawford featured Idyllwild in a national infomercial.

1 year ago - 2020

Three local restaurants were broken into on the same night. Mile High Café, Idyllwild Ice Cream & Jerky and Fratello's Ristorante & Pizzeria were all broken into by three individuals.

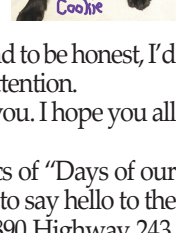
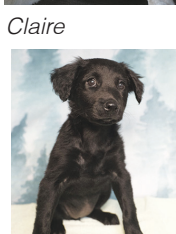
