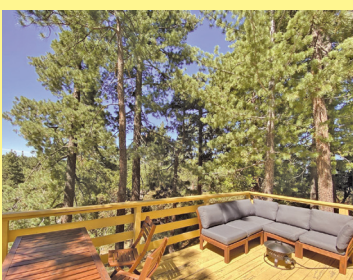

## Perez plans community discussion of STRs and policies

Short-term rentals (STR) will be the topic of a community meeting from 5 to 7 p.m., Monday, May 1, at Town Hall. Riverside County Supervisor V. Manuel Perez wants to hear more from the Hill communities about this issue and invites those interested in sharing their opinion to come and participate.

As he promised in his March 13 community meeting here, Perez is returning to learn more about the STR issue and its effects on the Hill. He also has invited the Planning Department's citizen committee that is studying the STR policy, as well as representatives from the department.

Perez is particularly interested in learning whether the community's views may have modified any since last fall when the board approved amendments to Ordinance 927.1 (Regulating Short Term Rentals) and imposed the moratorium on issuing new STR certificates on the Hill or in the Wine Country. The moratorium will end Sept. 9, 2023.

Another recent change is the county using a contractor to monitor STR activities. In February, the county's contractor, Deckard Technologies of San Diego, began sending letters to owners of STRs in the county. This included letters to unpermitted or expired operations within one of the moratorium areas. These letters directed those operators to cease operations.

Also, the Planning Department has initiated several meetings to discuss the merits of any further amendments of Ordinance 927.1. These are a group of local residents and STR owners.

All of these changes and activities have occurred since October. While Perez has been involved in STR policy as a supervisor for years, only since January has he been representing the Hill communities. He would like to hear opinions of how these recent policy changes and enforcement actions have been received.

Have they helped reduce any of the nuisances that neighbors of STRs often encounter? Has the current behavior of STR renters and owners in local neighborhoods changed? These are the questions about which he would like to have discussion. Also, he wants to hear any new ideas about reconciling this issue.

Listening himself to stakeholders before the Planning Department might propose any further changes to the STR policy will give Perez better insight to the local views on this issue.

He anticipates the Planning Department will hold a community workshop on suggestions before submitting any policy recommendations to the county Planning Commission.

"Before getting too far along into that process, Supervisor Perez thought it would be a good time for people to provide input to him as well as the committee and the Planning Department, for the public to have involvement," wrote Darrin Schemmer, communications director for Perez.

In October, the supervisors approved the following changes to 927: how the size of the lot will affect the maximum permitted occupancy of an STR; the procedures for notifying neighbors when a property owner obtains an STR certificate; allowing accessory dwelling units to be rented; information on signs posted on the property; one-night minimum visits; increased fees for initial and renewal of STR certificates; increased fines for violations; and installation of fire sprinklers are optional.

## How state and county are handling potholes

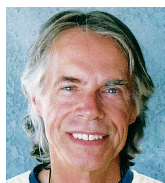
Caltrans Public Information Officer Eric Dionne said, "Crews will continue to actively fill potholes all-around the District's mountain community areas as they find them and weather permits. This is within the standard Caltrans Winter Snow Plan."

"Our maintenance crews have months of work ahead of them from all the storm damages caused by the recent State of Emergency from late February into March. We ask for patience while we address all of these issues the best we can."

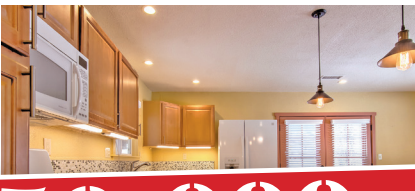

# Very wet winter brings low spring wildfire threats

The outlook for the 2023 summer fire season has benefited greatly from the wet and snowy winter. None of the major fire units are currently predicting a serious and dangerous fire season for Southern California. Fire will always be a threat; but this year, particularly during spring, the likelihood of a major fire is significantly less than recent years.

In its latest outlook, the National Interagency Fire Center (NIFC) offered this assessment: "Typically, La Niña results in a greater chance of a drier than average winter, especially in southern California. Despite this being the third consecutive winter of a La Niña, it has not been the case this year. This jet [stream] will undoubtedly weaken as winter gives way to spring, but until then, the potential for additional wetting rains may continue for a few more weeks. Rainfall should begin to wane by the middle or latter half of April, which is several weeks later than usual."

Closer to the Hill, the Southern California Geographic Coordination Center said, "Large fire potential will be below normal in the upper regions of the mountains. Very low potential above 8,000 [feet] this spring/summer."

National and state fire predictive services agree that the hydrological conditions in California have markedly improved in the past three months. Since January, when none of the state was free of any drought conditions, slightly more than 65% is free of drought as of April 11. About a quarter of the state is classified as abnormally dry and less than 9% is in a moderate drought condition. The three worst drought conditions (severe, extreme or exceptional) are no longer present anywhere in California.

Alex Tardy, meteorologist for the National Weather Service's San Diego Office, reported that Idyllwild received 40.28 inches of rain since October. The average annual rainfall is 24.45 inches. This year is the seventh greatest volume of rain. The all-time high was the winter of 1982-83, when 54.07 inches fell.

While Palm Springs received an inch less than its average, even Anza-Borrego's rainfall exceeded its average.

"March alone was a huge impact; most areas had about two times the normal March rain," Tardy said. A shift in the jet stream caused the weather change. Thirteen atmospheric rivers passed over Southern California from November until the end of March, including five in March.

However, all of the moisture does present one concern to firefighter managers.

"The issue with the wet weather is that it brings up a robust grass crop which is the ultimate in fine flashy fuels builder. The grass crop is already growing rapidly with plenty of ground moisture left, and now plenty of sunlight to keep it growing," wrote Idyllwild Fire Chief Mark LaMont. "These fine flashy fuels cover the landscape and create a continuous flashy fuel bed which can carry fire faster and further than when the landscape is without these fine fire carrying fuels. Fine fuels carry fire quickly and generally run uphill into larger fuel types making fires more difficult to contain."

The Predictive Services Outlooks also advised about this condition; however, it was noted that "... the last 20 years have not shown a strong correlation between a wet winter (with an assumedly heavier than normal grass crop) and a busy 'grass fire season.'"

The potential for a greater fire threat from the grass fires depends upon the winds, according to Predictive Services.

And NIFC wrote, "The seasonal grasses' high amount of fuel moisture should preclude any risk of

large fires in April. Heavier live fuels should retain enough moisture to be resistant to fire spread well into May."

While concerned about the potential risk of dry grasses as a source of more fires, LaMont added a positive note, "A larger grass crop opens us up to a greater potential for more starts, more starts in the grass may be able to get 'picked-up' quickly by fast arriving suppression resources on scene."

NIFC reinforced this opinion, "but without strong winds, such fires have an excellent chance of being picked up by local resources or within the first two burn periods."

Once the summer dry weather occurs and snowmelt is finished, the risk of higher elevation fire will begin to approach normal. But Predictive Services also noted: "In 2011, fires tended to show much less activity above 8,500 feet which may also be the case this season."

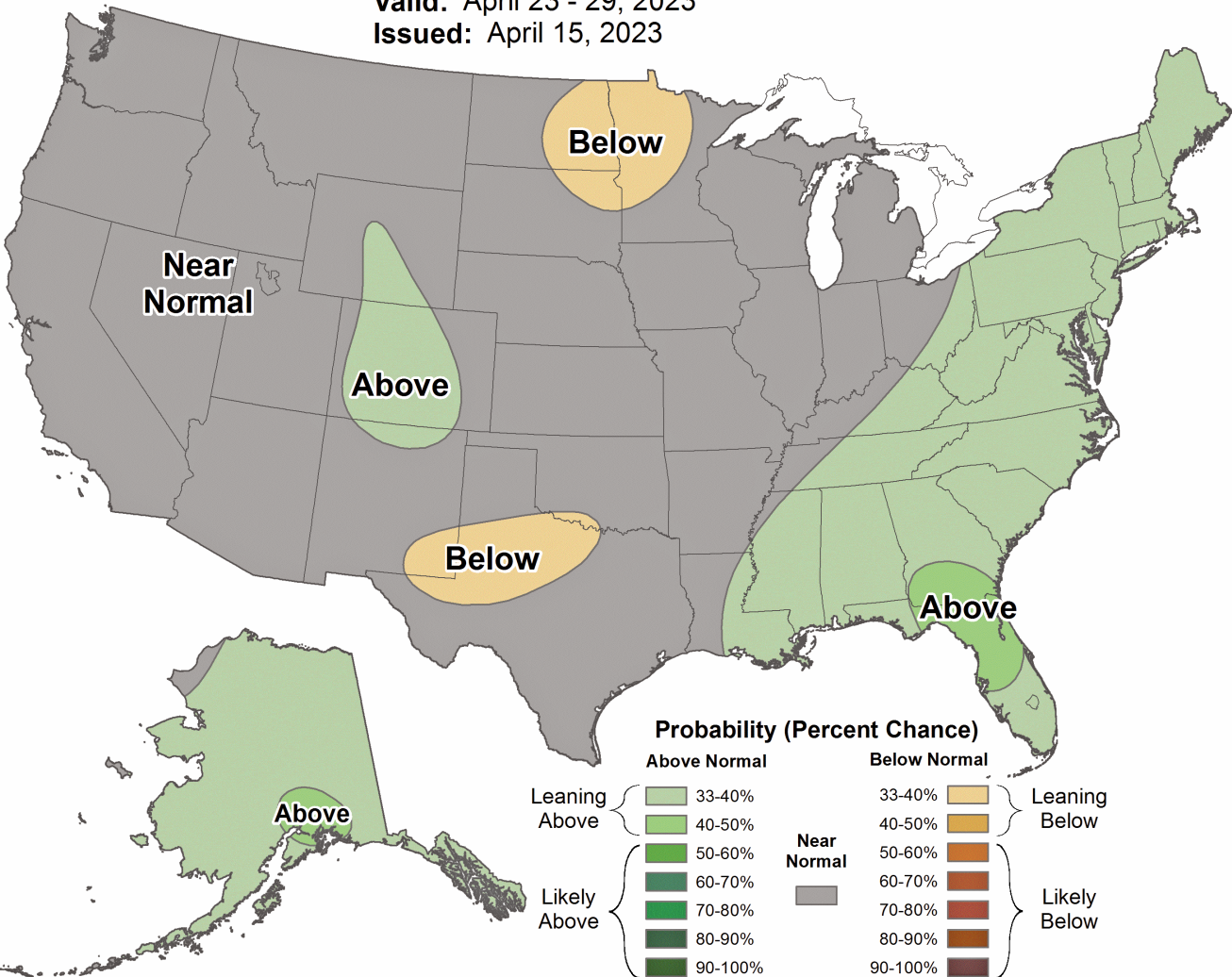
And NIFC's Southern California Geographic Area Coordination Center concluded its April Outlook with this comment: "It is safe to assume the next several months will hold far less weather drama than what occurred the past 9 months."

RTLMA's response was different. A representative who would not give her name said the county does not have any schedule on repairing potholes.

She said residents may submit a road repair request at <https://rctlma.org/trans/Road-Maintenance/Road-Repairs>. A representative will contact the resident.

According to the American Public Works Association, "Potholes are created when the top layer of pavement and the material beneath — called the base or sub-base — cannot support the weight of the traffic. Two factors are always present in such a failure:

traffic and water.

"The 'gestation period' for a pothole includes: 1) Snow-melt or rain seeps through cracks in the pavement and into the sub-base; if the moisture cannot adequately drain away from the sub-base and soil underneath, it becomes saturated and soft.

"2) Trapped moisture is subjected to repeated freeze/thaw cycles—and with each occurrence the expanding ice lifts and cracks the pavement more. The passing traffic weakens the pavement, cracking it further.

"3) As temperatures rise and the ice melts, a void is left under the pavement. This void collects more water, and during the next freeze, the void will enlarge.

"4) Vehicles driving over the weakened pavement pound it until the surface breaks and collapses into the void below, thus creating a pothole."

### Current CDC recommendations regarding COVID

According to the Centers for Disease Control, the COVID virus is constantly changing, with new variants emerging, spreading and disappearing. The best ways to protect ourselves and others from COVID remain the same as when COVID was rampant: stay up-to-date with vaccines, improve ventilation, avoid contact with people who may have COVID, get tested for COVID if you feel you may have it, stay home if you have suspected or confirmed COVID and seek treatment if you have COVID and are at a high risk of getting very sick.

Idyllwild Arts reported no students or staff members with COVID.

Another IWD Brown Act violation may have occurred

Idyllwild Water District directors may have violated the Brown Act (the California open meetings law) in the March 29 special meeting by voting on the rate study for both water and sewer under discussion and not action items.

“Procedural error. We will have to correct that at the next meeting. We should have directed our Rate Study firm to present the indicated numbers not voted on a discussion item. Thank you for pointing that out,” wrote former President Charles Schelly in an email later.

However, another Brown Act violation also may have occurred at the same meeting following closed session.

The Town Crier learned from the upcoming meeting agenda packet that Schelly stepped down as president in a closed session at that meeting discussing General Manager Leo Havener’s performance, leaving the meeting before closed session ended.

However, the board did not report out any actions from the closed session in a possible violation of the Brown Act.

The minutes read: “President Schelly left the Closed Session and meeting at 7:58 p.m. The Board resumed Open Session at 8:03 p.m.”

Resigning as IWD president is an action both not on the agenda and not reported out of closed session.

“At the last Board meeting during Closed Session, President Schelly resigned as Board President, and stepped

down to serve as a Board Member. As I was not in Closed Session at the time this occurred ... I have no knowledge as to the reason Schelly decided to do so,” wrote Havener later.

By press time, Schelly had not responded to a request for comment on why he resigned.

Vice President Peter Szabadi confirmed in an email that he is acting president.

According to the Brown Act: “The legislative body of any local agency shall publicly report any action taken in closed session and the vote or abstention on that action of every member present, as follows:


“54957.7 (b) After any closed session, the legislative body shall reconvene into open session prior to adjournment and shall make any disclosures required by Section 54957.1 of action taken in the closed session.

“(c) The announcements required to be made in open session pursuant to this section may be made at the location announced in the agenda for the closed session, as long as the public is allowed to be present at that location for the purpose of hearing the announcements.”

The IWD minutes for the closed session state: “No reportable action.”

This Wednesday, April 19, at 6 p.m., the board will meet for its regular monthly meeting. On the agenda is Item 5 — Election of Officers of the Board of Directors.

The board will vote on a president and vice president to serve through the remainder of 2023.



Motion approved.

Idyllwild Festivals Inc. not registered as a 501(c)(3) tax-exempt organization

As recently as the morning of April 17, the website of Idyllwild Festivals Inc. still solicited donors asserting that it was a 501(c)(3) organization, meaning that many donors’ contributions to Idyllwild Festivals Inc. would likely be tax deductible for them. But the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) website, which lists 82 separate 501(c)(3) entities in the general Idyllwild area, does not list Idyllwild Festivals Inc. among them — here or in any other location. The IRS website also makes clear that, although an Employee Identification Number (EIN) is necessary to apply for 501(c)(3) status, having an EIN does not itself confer 501(c)(3) status on an organization. Idyllwild Festivals Inc. is listed with the California Secretary of State as a California nonprofit public benefit corporation on active status, but that also does not confer 501(c)(3) with the IRS. On March 11, prior to running this story, the Town Crier made email inquiry directly to Idyllwild Festivals Inc., inquiring as to its claimed 501(c)(3) status. We were

informed by Jennifer Hayes that our inquiry was being referred to the CEO and president of that organization, who, according to Idyllwild Festivals Inc.’s website, are Roy Regalado and Arn Hancock, respectively. We received no further response to our March 11 inquiry. On April 10, the Town Crier made a second email inquiry to Idyllwild Festivals Inc. and again were advised that our inquiry was being referred to the CEO and president. On April 11, we received an email from Jennifer Hayes including a letter from the IRS assigning Idyllwild Festivals Inc. an EIN number and advising as to how Idyllwild Festivals Inc. could then apply for 501(c)(3) status. The letter states: “Assigning an EIN does not grant tax-exempt status to non-profit organizations.” There is no indication that Idyllwild Festivals Inc. ever applied for 501(c)(3) status. As of Monday, April 17, the IRS still did not list Idyllwild Festivals Inc. as having 501(c)(3) status, although Idyllwild Festivals Inc.’s website continued to make that claim. The organization produces several local festivals, including a Renaissance, a Celtic and a Viking festival.

Inland Empire residents at risk of losing Medi-Cal benefits

This month, an overlooked piece of mail could have disastrous consequences for hundreds of thousands of Riverside and San Bernardino families who rely on Medi-Cal benefits according to the Inland Empire Health Plan (IEHP). To avoid a public health crisis after the annual redetermination process of Medi-Cal resumed this week, IEHP, Riverside County’s Department of Public Social Services and San Bernardino County’s Transitional Assistance Department are coordinating a first-of-its-kind partnership. “The annual redetermination process is one of the biggest efforts taking place in the history of the Medi-Cal program,” said IEHP Chief Executive Officer Jarrod McNaughton. “The partnership with the two counties demonstrates our commitment to making sure Inland Empire residents have continued coverage.” “The county and partner agencies are ready to help residents impacted through the redetermination process to keep these essential benefits,” said Riverside County Executive Officer Jeff Van Wagenen. “We are reaching out to the 37,000 residents by mail and phone whose redeterminations are due in June. We’ve also alerted local hospitals, clinics, and health care providers. We will be reaching out to our impacted residents di-

rectly each month as their redeterminations come due.” Beginning this month, residents who receive Medi-Cal renewal packets in the mail must complete and send back the requested information included in the yellow renewal packets within 60 days or lose their Medi-Cal benefits. Members could start losing coverage as early as July 1. In December 2022, Congress passed the Consolidated Appropriations Act 2023 — which stipulated the continuous coverage provision that prohibited states from disenrolling members from Medicaid since 2020, due to the COVID-19 public health emergency that would expire at the end of March 2023. Once the packet is received, IEHP will assist the member in completing and submitting the required information, whether by phone or with one-on-one assistance at a community resource center. The IEHP team will continue checking in until the member has submitted the information by mail, phone, online, or at a local county Medi-Cal office. Medi-Cal members may also receive assistance through the county Medi-Cal office. For more information or assistance, IEHP members may call the IEHP eligibility team at 1-888-860-1296. County and ACLU debate start of redistricting trial May affect local 2024 elections

Both Riverside County, the defendants and the plaintiffs in the redistricting litigation, which the American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU) filed in June 2022, have submitted a joint statement to the Superior Court judge overseeing the case. Both agreed that the pace of the trial may affect the upcoming supervisorial elections in 2024. The 1st, 2nd and 3rd districts are scheduled to elect supervisors in 2024. The lawsuit, on behalf of Inland Empire United and six individuals, is challenging the legality of the recently modified Riverside County redistricting plan for supervisorial seats. Based on the latest 2020 U.S. Census results, the county board of supervisors adopted the new redistricting maps at its Dec. 21, 2021, meeting. These maps were used for both the June primary and the November general supervisorial elections in 2022.

Since the case was returned to the Riverside County Superior Court from the U.S. District Court, the litigation parties prepared this joint statement for the new trial judge. It included a summary of the case history since it was filed and then a discussion of the possible schedule of actions, such as discovery, to get to the trial. The ACLU offered a schedule that would have the trial commence in August. Its intent is to have the court’s decision in time for candidates to prepare for the March 2024 primary. The county argued that this would ignore a potentially relevant, and expected, U.S. Supreme Court decision. The case, Allen v. Milligan, is pending in the U.S. Supreme Court. This litigation involves redistricting (Alabama’s congressional seats) under the Voting Rights Act of 1965. It was argued earlier in this Supreme Court term and a decision should be announced by the end of June. Its resolution will have significant effects on the ACLU litigation, according to Riverside County. Specifically, county attorneys wrote, “The pending decision is very likely — if not certain — to alter the expert analysis and evidentiary showing required as to Petitioners’ vote dilution claims under section 2 of the federal Voting Rights Act and as to Respondents’ affirmative defense that the remedy sought would result in an unconstitutional racial gerrymander.”

Consequently, the county does not want any further action on this case to resume until the Supreme Court settles Allen v. Milligan. “There is no way to anticipate how the U.S. Supreme Court will change these legal requirements that are at the center of this litigation, but the Court’s forthcoming binding precedent will undoubtedly affect the course of this litigation.” Once a decision is known, the county expects it will need more time for discovery. Its proposed schedule would allow factual and expert opinion discovery from July 2023 until March 2024. After exchanges with the plaintiffs, the county’s attorney anticipates both the hearing and trial could begin in June 2024. If a decision or judgment is not reached before the March 2024 election, the petitioner’s lawyers (the ACLU) told the judge, “Petitioners reserve the right to move for a preliminary injunction before the March 2024 election if a writ petition hearing is not scheduled to be heard and resolved before the preelection deadlines leading up to that election.” The county responded that it deserves a fair opportunity to present its defense and the upcoming 2024 elections should not dictate its ability to defend its actions. First, the ACLU waited six months after the redistricting plan was approved before it filed this lawsuit. Secondly, the county notes the current districts are in effect until 2032.

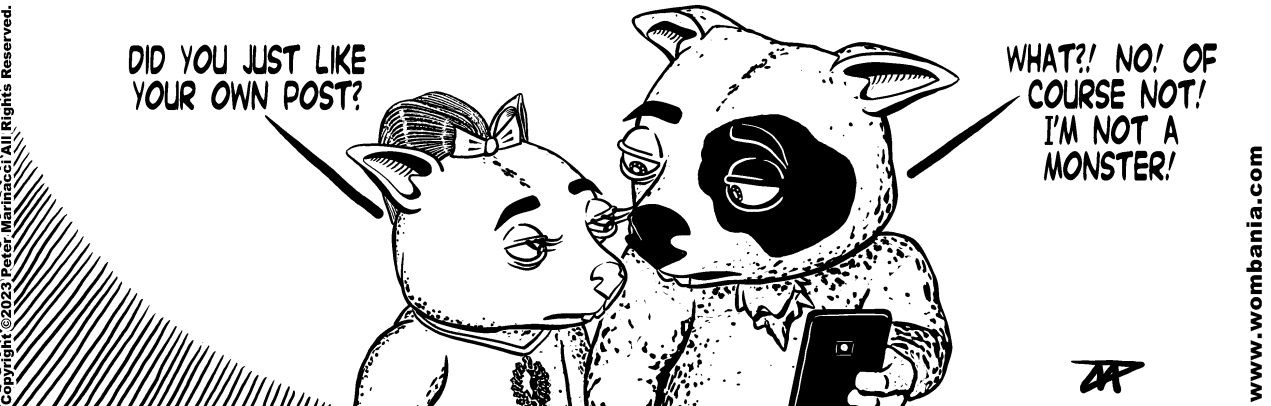

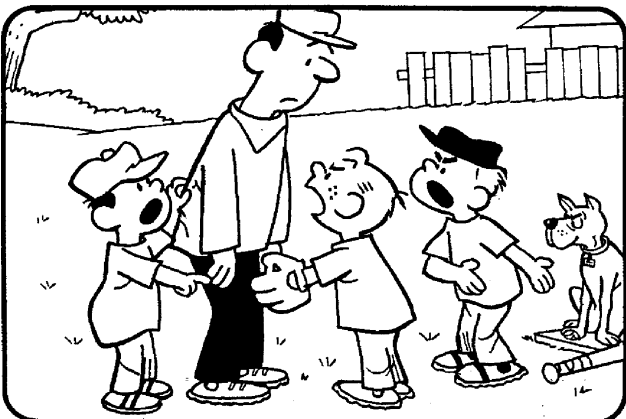

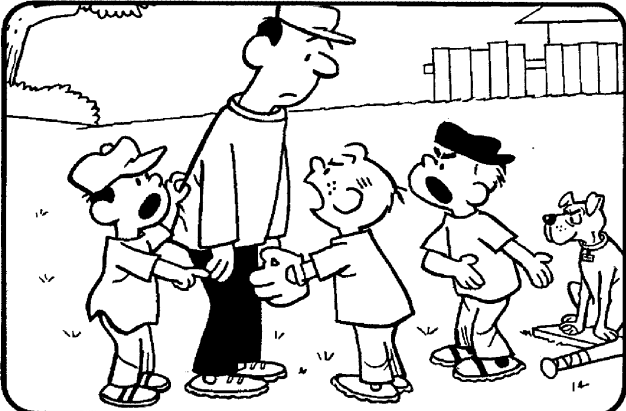

Also missing were a “yard art” coyote and several taxidermy animal specimens. The taxidermy animals included a golden ea-

gle, a coyote, a gray fox, a raccoon and a deer fawn. The eagle, coyote and fox were recovered thanks to a tip from a citizen who spotted them by the roadside. The fawn and raccoon remain missing.

The golden eagle is a federally protected species and it is illegal to own any part of one, with exceptions for which a certificate is required.

## ART'S CORNER

As always in the past, the specific contours of Idyllwild Arts' Lowman Concert Hall prove more than receptively ideal for the projection and preservation of string sonority, whether in chamber music or in a full orchestral complement. Thus, the stage was set for the Idyllwild debut of that intriguingly-titled ensemble known as "Delirium Musicum" this past Friday evening.

The concert program itself, though somewhat hampered by technical glitches, mainly resulting in an unavailable printed program, nevertheless began with all forces at the ready. Consisting of four first violins, three second violins, two violas, two cellos, one double bass and an electronic keyboard (that last kept to a respectable mezzoforte when needed), and under the extraordinarily superior guidance of Artistic Director/Concertmaster Etienne Gara, an audience-rousing rendition of Bela Bartok's "Romanian Folk Dances" was essayed.

There followed a somewhat more subdued set of folk-inspired melodies from Korean composer Jisoo Lee titled "Jindo Arirang," with harp (or zither) plucked strings and drawn-out chordal structures in its more mournful sections; a fitting apposite to the opening work.

The subsequent pieces reflected contrasting Western musical styles, and generally proceeding within established 19th-century formats. A string arrangement of Isaac Albeniz's "Asturias" (from the "Leyendas" piano suite) by Italian composer Gianluca Bersanetti provided listeners with more than enough Spanish verve, particularly in the lower strings' guitar rhythms. And

with Ukrainian composer Myroslav Skoryk's "Melody," one felt the yearning for both musical and political stability in his native land, with a just amount of hidden nostalgia for better times.

The undoubted highlight of the night's program was a performance of the "Winter" concerto from Antonio Vivaldi's "4 Seasons." In a somewhat scaled-down realization by Max Richter, the music itself lost none of its programmatic depictions of the bitter cold of a Venetian winter; icy winds, frosty calm and all, and with the more than capable manual dexterity of Gara, all three movements provided a singularly thrilling concert experience.

There followed a "Divertimento" in four short movements by composer Leo Weiner, each based on themes from different regions in Hungary; what was especially noteworthy here was the use of a muted solo violin in the 3rd movement, with the concertmasters' brilliant execution.

An uncredited string arrangement of Claude Debussy's "Golliwog's Cakewalk" (from the "Children's Corner" piano suite) ensued, with both the jazz-influenced rhythms and the subtle Wagnerian quotation intact. Those two works proved to be somewhat of a breather for the intrepid artistic director, for the last programmed work was the more energized final movement of Phillip Glass's "Violin Concerto #2" (subtitled "The American Four Seasons"). Gara's display of rapid fingerboard work was equally as dazzling as the hyper-Vivaldi composition progressed; even in the relatively calm and meditative portions, the technical virtuosity (if not "delirium") was readily observed and absorbed.

Full-scale audience approbation followed; and as an encore, the group essayed an original Gianluca Bersanetti piece called "Bouffon Acrobatique," which proved again (as in his Albeniz

The Riverside County Board of Supervisors voted against an off-sale beer and wine license applied for by Leigh Dutton of Idyllwild Village Market.

**55 years ago - 1968**  
Idyllwild real estate brokers agreed not to post "For Sale" signs on properties they were handling.

**50 years ago - 1973**  
The Fern Valley Corners Restaurant offered a breakfast of three buttermilk hotcakes and two eggs for 69 cents.

**45 years ago - 1978**  
Traces of bubonic plague were found in the Dark Canyon campground. The area was quarantined by U.S. Department of Health officials while animal burrows were treated with pesticides to kill infected fleas.

**40 years ago - 1983**  
Jeffrey Muir, 5, and Lauren Muir, 4, son and daughter of Rob Muir of Pine Cove, and Christopher Rain Murray, 6, son of Clair Murray of Idyllwild, spent almost 11 hours in below freezing temperatures in the area west of Deer Springs Trail before they were rescued.

**35 years ago - 1988**  
Frank Ferro of Idyllwild was cast as Alessandro in the annual outdoor play "Ramona" at the Ramona Bowl in Hemet.

essays and other works was released in a book titled "Natura Doceri." Proceeds from the sale would go to the Idyllwild Scholarship Fund.

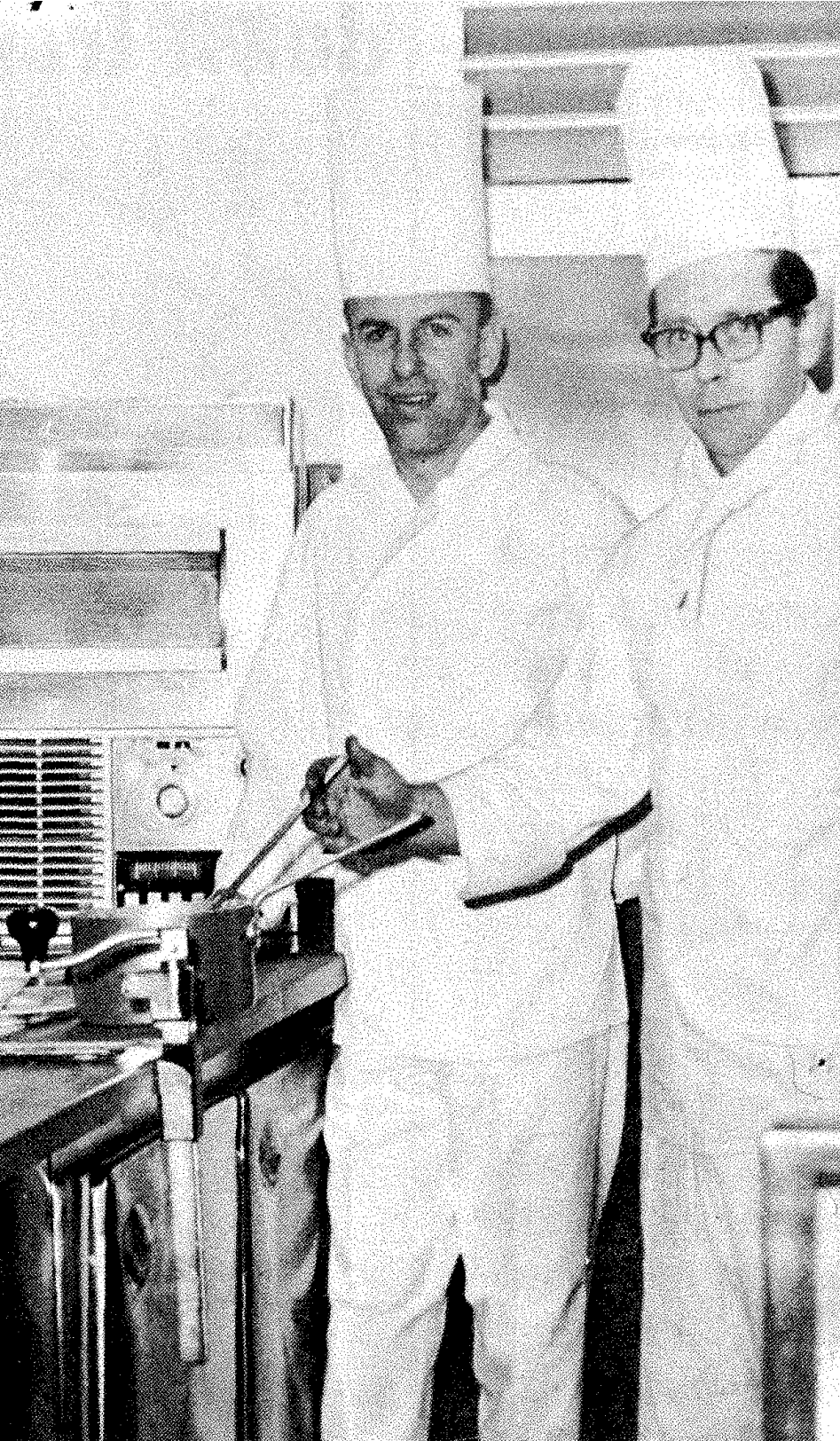
**15 years ago - 2008**
