Another in-custody lawsuit filed against Sheriff's Department

Another lawsuit has been filed against Riverside County, the County's Sheriff's Department (RCSD) and Sheriff Chad Bianco over an in-custody death in the county's jail.

On April 28, 2022, Alicia Upton, 21, of San Jacinto, hung herself while in-custody at the Robert Presley Detention Center in Riverside.

On Dec. 31, 2023, her parents filed a lawsuit claiming the Sheriff's Department "... knew that there existed a great indifference to the safety and protection of the inmates who were in the government's custody within the Riverside County correctional facilities."

Consequently, greater vigilance should be taken at the sheriff's correctional facilities, particularly when an inmate exhibits dangerous behavior toward themselves.

Besides Bianco, three sheriff's correction's employees were named in the suit. The family claims there is a long history of in-custody deaths and staff should have taken greater precautions.

After her arrest and during the screening for incarceration, Alicia expressed suicidal thoughts, such as, "I always kinda wanted to die," according to the Uptons' attorneys.

On April 19, 2022, Alicia was booked into the Larry D. Smith Correctional Facility in Banning. Two days later, she was transferred to a safety cell in the Presley Detention Center in Riverside, where she continued this behavior.

At the Presley Center, "Ms. Upton's mental health rating was classified as 'severe,'" according to the attorneys' filing. On April 24, she was moved from the safety cell to a regular jail cell.

In a footnote, the suit states, "The entire act of committing suicide through strangulation was captured by the surveillance camera that was placed inside of Ms. Upton's cell. RCSD custody staff and/or CHS medical staff failed to notice Ms. Upton as she performed the act of strangulation on video."

Throughout the claim, the Uptons' attorneys stressed that the sheriff's correction staff knew enough and had awareness of similar past situations. Consequently, greater observation, caution and care should have occurred for Alicia.

This is the ninth lawsuit related to in-custody deaths filed in 2023. There were 22 in-custody deaths reported in 2022. The Sheriff's Department has not confirmed the number of in-custody deaths in 2023, but it appears to be at least 13. Eleven, through November, were listed in the Uptons' filing and the Sheriff's Department reported two more in December.

In February 2023, the state Attorney General announced it was opening an investigation to determine whether the Riverside County Sheriff's Office has engaged in a pattern or practice of unconstitutional policing. This review, for which no report has been issued, was initiated due to the public concern over the number of in-custody deaths in 2022.

In a video response, Bianco, replied, " This investigation is based on nothing but false and misleading statements and straight out lies from activists, including their attorneys ... Had the Attorney General or anyone else from DOJ reached out with questions or concerns we could have provided more than enough evidence to prove these allegations false. He failed to do that."

The Sheriff's Department has not responded to the Town Crier's request for more information.

State court intercedes in election suit over Rollins' profession

The 2024 election season started in 2023. Before the Secretary of State could print the voter information guides for the March Primary, Matt Dobler, chair for the Republican Party of Riverside County, challenged Democratic candidate Will Rollin's description of his profession on the ballot, which has to be three words or less, according to state law.

In his Dec. 14 filing, Dobler's attorneys wrote, "His [Rollins] proposed ballot designations of 'Counterterrorism Attorney' and 'Counterterrorism Advisor' are false, inaccurate, and misleading, and therefore are not valid ballot designations under statutory and regulatory authorities and well-established judicial precedents ..."

Two weeks later, on Dec. 26, Sacramento County Superior Court Judge Shelley Anne W.L. Chang issued a balanced opinion. She granted Dobler's objection and said, Rollins' ballot designation should read "counterterrorism law attorney."

Dobler's litigation was filed against the Secretary of State, Shirley N. Weber, since her office oversees the election ballots and Voter Information guides.

Both she and Rollins responded to Dobler's challenge in filings with the court. Weber had her staff contact Rollins' staff for more documentation on his current profession. After an exchange of messages, the Secretary of State's Office felt Rollins had justified his use of "counterterrorism attorney" and created "an acceptable ballot designation under California law that was supported by Mr. Rollins' ballot designation worksheet."

In his response, Rollins stressed that in his more than 20 years with the U.S. Attorney's Office, he has handled many security and counterterrorism cases. Further, he joined the law firm of Raines Feldman Littrell LLP in March of 2023 "... in part, to develop my national security and counterterrorism practice, a growing area of private legal practice at national law firms like Raines often spearheaded by former federal prosecutors like me ..."

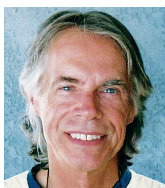
"I have legal expertise in a wide variety of U.S. counterterrorism, export control, and national security laws, including the statutes prohibiting disclosure of classified information, the provision of material support to foreign terrorist organizations," he added.

Following the responses and a hearing, Wang ruled in favor of Dobler's challenge. She stated that both "... 'counterterrorism attorney' and 'counterterrorism advisor' would be confusing or misleading to the voters, and therefore are not permissible ballot ..."

She concluded the descriptions of either "Counterterrorism Legal Advisor" or "Counterterrorism Law Attorney" would not be misleading.

Strong El Niño; but absent precipitation

Yes, El Niño conditions are currently present in the Pacific Ocean and affecting Southern California. And the first alerts or warnings about a possible “historically strong” El Niño began last summer.

However, the rainfall from October through December, the first quarter of the 2024 rain year, has been well below average — not historically above average. Snow-pack levels throughout California are only about a third of the normal levels for the beginning of January.

Both the Idyllwild Fire Department and Keenwild Ranger Station have reported less than 2.7 inches of rain since Oct.1. That is less than half the long-term average for those three months. Only the Pine Cove Dutch Flats station, with 3.4 inches, is close to half the average.

Local precipitation increased some last week. The National Weather Service (NWS) reported 6 inches of snow on Mt. San Jacinto and about 2 to 3 inches of snow fell lower on the Hill Wednesday night. And about a

half inch of rain came Thursday night and less than a quarter inch Saturday.

More broadly, the precipitation that has fallen on Southern California has primarily been limited to the coastal areas.

Statewide, no drought conditions have been identified, although two areas — Northern California and the far eastern edges of Riverside and San Bernardino counties — are considered “abnormally dry.”

But the NWS continues to report that El Niño is still with us and is expected to remain, at least, through April. The equatorial water temperature is still significantly (1.8 degrees) above the three-month average. By April, the NWS long-term forecast is a 60% chance of normal weather patterns returning.

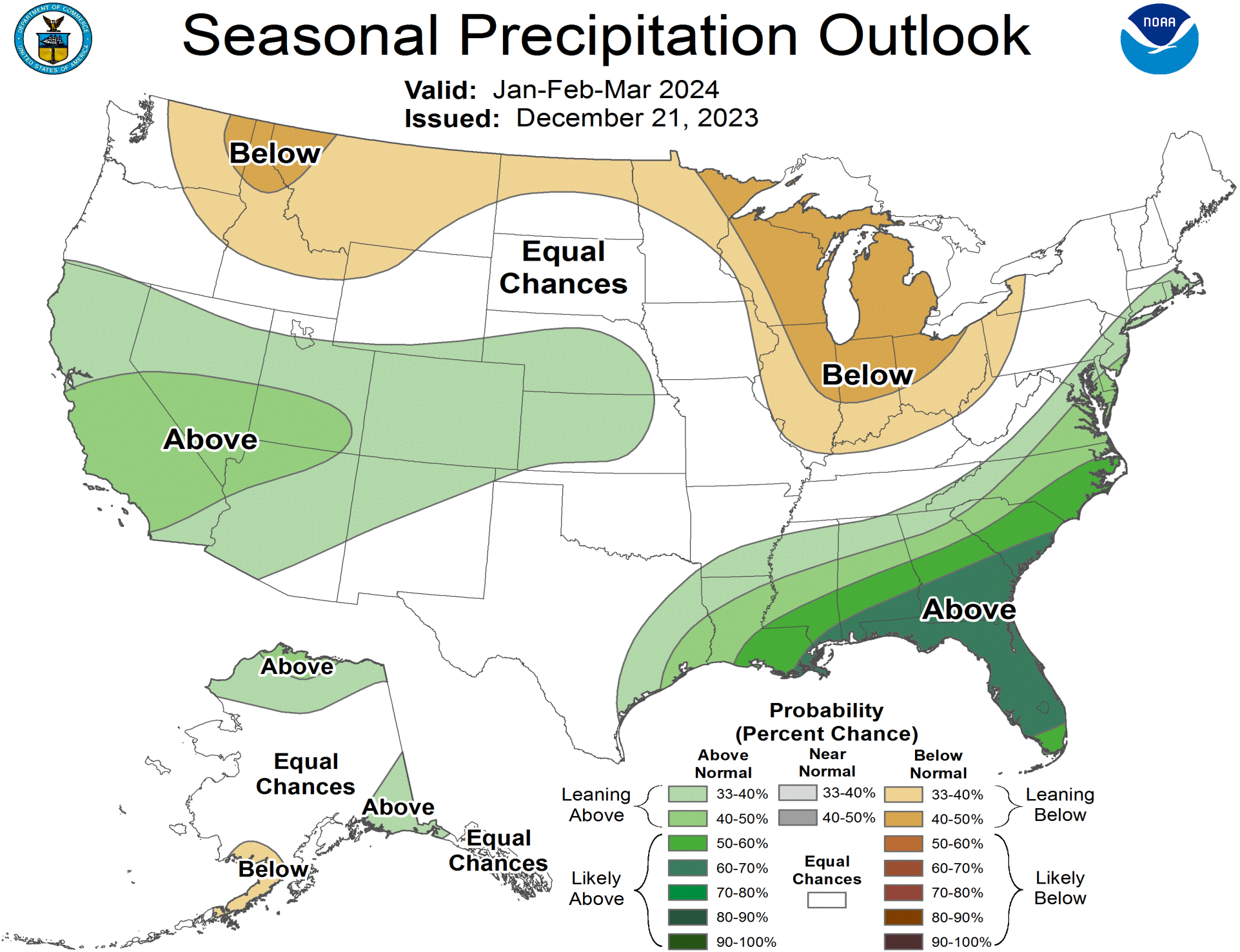
The very wet summer is still offering some benefits. Fire services are reporting that “live fuel moistures remain above normal with a large load of live fuel present. Larger dead fuels also have above normal moisture content.”

The Predictive Services Unit for Cal Fire’s Southern

Region forecasts a cooler and slightly wetter winter to come. “The odds show a slight tilt towards below normal temperatures and a slight to moderate tilt towards above normal precipitation for the January [to] April 2024 period.”

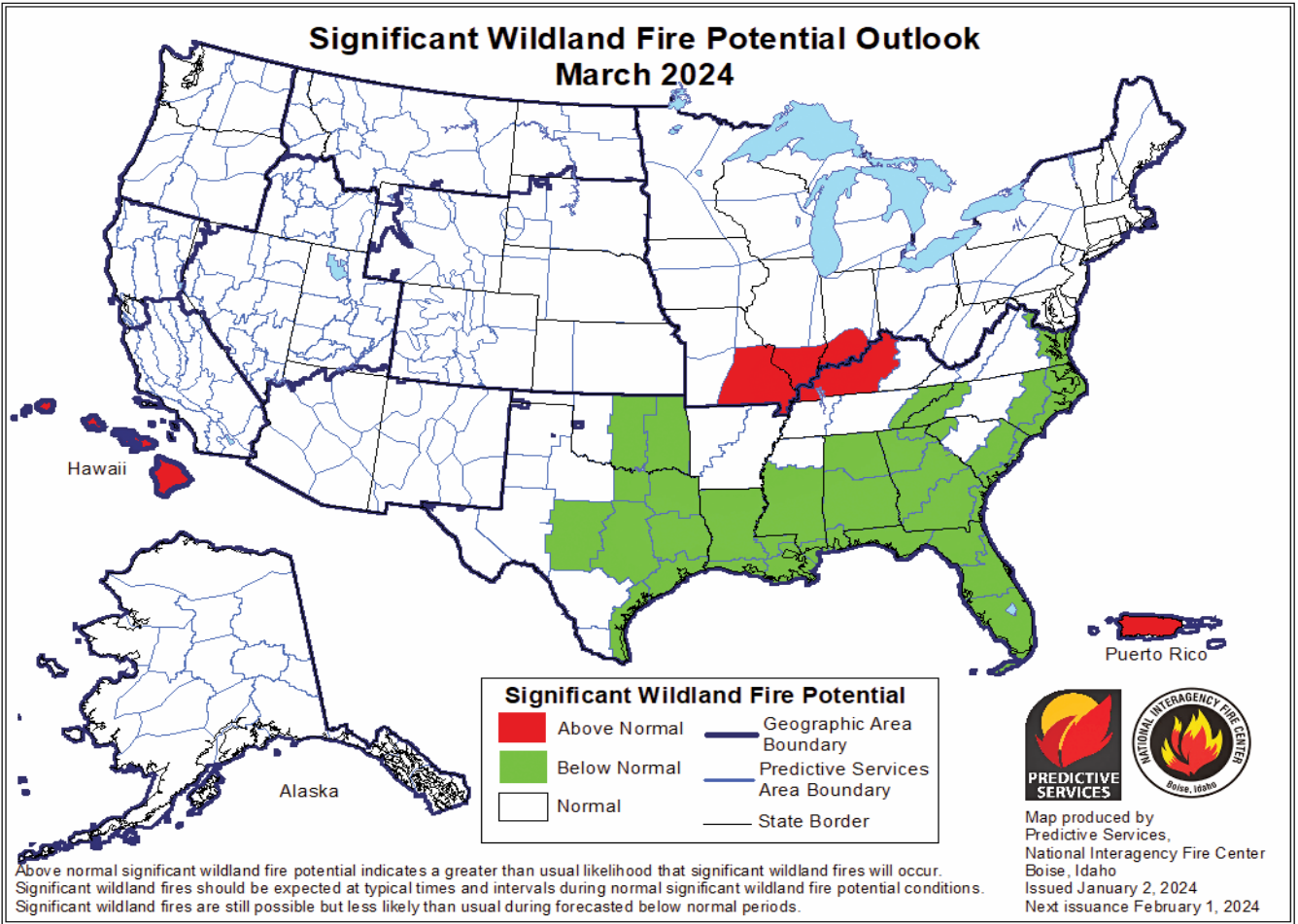
With respect to wildfire possibilities, the forecast for a significant fire potential remains near normal for Southern California. “The combination of above normal fuel moisture for larger dead fuels and live fuels coupled with the El Niño pattern and absence of drought support this forecast for January through April,” according to Cal Fire’s South Ops January to April outlook.

And more precipitation is possible this weekend, according to the NWS, but subject to changing conditions. “... breezy and cool conditions will return to the region. This may linger into Friday as well. By the time we get to next weekend, the forecast remains quite uncertain due to model solution spread ... We’ll have to see if we’ll see some warmer and drier weather or continued cool and potentially wet weather.”



“These designations accurately describe his current professional activities, including providing to clients, ‘legal advice regarding compliance with federal laws and regulations covering counterterrorism and national security law ...,’” she opined.

So on the ballot and in the coming Voter Information guides, Rollins’ current profession will be “Counterterrorism Law Attorney.”

Following Wang’s ruling, both the Rollins and Ken Calvert campaigns issued statements that argued Wang’s decision was a victory for their campaign.

Cody Eiss, Rollins’ campaign manager, issued the following statement, “The court’s ruling con-

firms what we knew all along. This absurd lawsuit was nothing more than a politically-inspired partisan attack to distract voters from seeing Will’s experience in counterterrorism on the ballot.”

And Calvert’s campaign spokesman Calvin Moore issued his statement, “This ruling proves what we’ve been saying all along: Will Rollins is a perpetual liar who cannot be trusted to tell Californians the truth. The fact that a court was forced to correct Rollins for lying to and misleading voters is a major red flag that he is not who he says he is ...”

It should be noted that U.S. Congressman Calvert did defeat Rollins for the 41st California Congressional seat in November 2022.

They are the likely candidates in November 2024 for the same seat. As of Sept. 30, 2023, Calvert had \$2 million cash for the race and Rollins already had \$1.5 million.

Jon was a master cabinet maker and finish carpenter. He had a successful career in woodworking and was known for his craftsmanship.

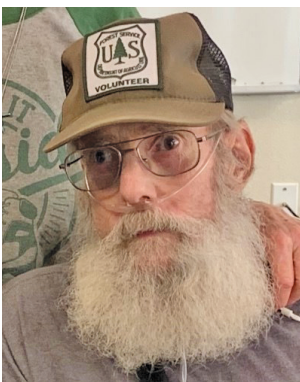

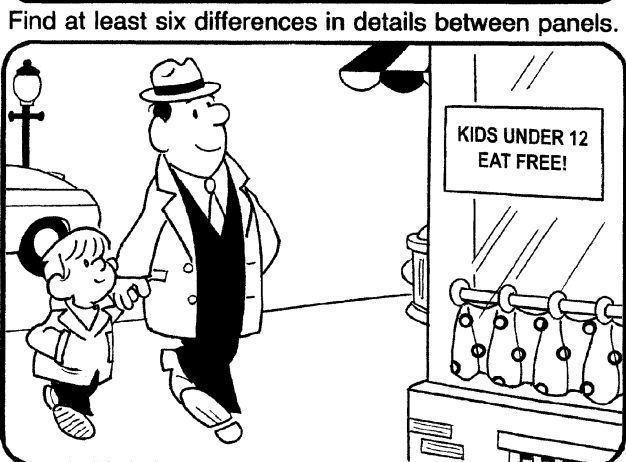
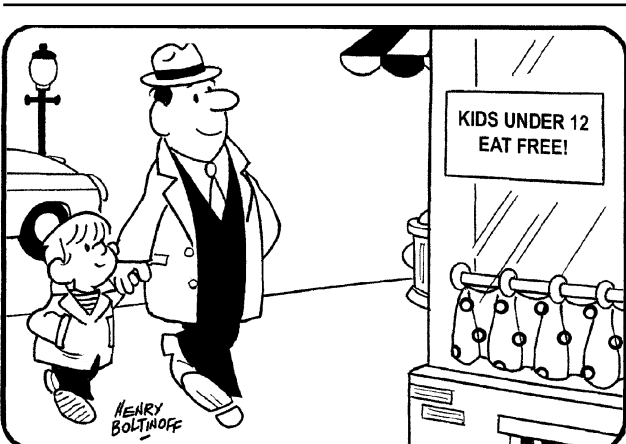

Roman to Arabic

Adding and subtracting Roman Numerals is not easy. Multiplying and dividing is even harder.

To simplify things, people switched to Hindu-Arabic numerals (called Arabic numbers for short). They were invented by two great mathematicians from Ancient India, **Aryabhata** (fifth century BC) and **Brahmagupta** (sixth century BC).

The Arabic system has ten digits – 0, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 9.

ROMAN NUMERALS

Long ago, people in the Roman Empire started a number system called **Roman numerals**. They found it helped when all of the people in their empire used the same symbols for counting and for math.

The Roman Empire was so big that the numbers were eventually used in parts of Europe, Asia, and Africa.

Roman numerals have seven symbols: **I, V, X, L, C, D, and M**. The chart at left shows which letters represent which numbers.

I	V	X	L	C	D	M
1	5	10	50	100	500	1000

How It Works

Roman numerals are combined to make different numbers. Here is a number in Roman numerals. It is three letter **I**s in a row.

III

To figure out what number this is, you add the three **I**s.

I + I + I
1 + 1 + 1 = 3

If you want to write the number 4, things change a bit. Instead of **IIII**, the number 4 is written as **IV**. This shows that the number 4 is one less than 5.

IV = 4

- I = 1
- II = 2
- III = 3
- IV = 4
- V = 5
- VI = 6
- VII = 7
- VIII = 8
- IX = 9
- X = 10

The number 7 is written as **VII** in Roman numerals. But the number 9 is **IX**. That shows that the number nine is one less than 10. (The number 10 is **X** in Roman numerals.)

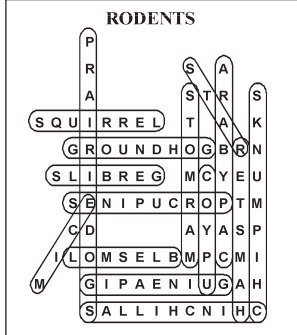

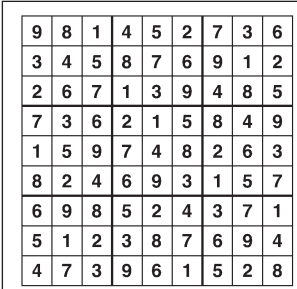

The Skyline Retreat Project, a complex on about 3.5 acres on the southern side of Strawberry Creek Square, contain-

ing a conference center, a 120-room hotel, a 168-seat restaurant, a health center, a spa and 10 retail shops, appeared to be abandoned by its developers.

20 years ago - 2004
The Idyllwild Chamber of Commerce was to host its first WinterFest celebration in the heart of Idyllwild.

15 years ago - 2009
Part-time Pine Cove resident Paul Kallmes, an engineer, had supervised

the new design of the New Year's Eve Ball in New York's Times Square.

10 years ago - 2014
In the space of one week, a series of six earthquakes shook the Idyllwild area along the San Jacinto Fault.

5 years ago - 2019
The terms of three members of County Service Area 36 Advisory Committee expired June 30, 2018, but no one noticed. Upon discovering that their terms had expired, Riverside County 3rd District Supervisor Chuck Washington's Legislative Assistant Opal Hellweg said the supervisor would reappoint those desiring continued service and would advertise for committee vacancies.

1 year ago - 2023
Idyllwild Arts Academy initiated a bi-coastal series of "Engagement Events" beginning Jan. 22 in New York City at the Blue Gallery. Other events were scheduled in Los Angeles (Feb. 8), Palm Desert (March 5) and San Francisco (April 6.) The events were aimed at bringing together prospective students, patrons and alumni, to "engage more meaningfully with our diverse community."
